

Author Visit at the School

Children and adults alike had a delightful time when Ashley Wolff, artist, author, and illustrator, visited the elementary school on Friday, Oct 3. Made possible by the Children's Literacy Foundation (CLiF) Rural Library Grant. Ms Wolff was engaging and inspiring, showing the children her first attempts at drawing in elementary school and telling them that if they focus on what they love to do they will get better and better at it, just like she did.

The CLiF grant provides \$2,000 in new children's books for the public library; \$500 in new books for the elementary school library; two storytelling events; a book giveaway for each child at the next elementary school event to take home; and funding for mini-grants that support family engagement over the course of the year.

Middletown Springs was one of 12 public libraries in Vermont and New Hampshire to be awarded the grant this year. The Rural Library Grant is designed to help small-town libraries create excitement around literacy, update their collections, increase circulation, and strengthen connections with the communities they serve. The grant is also intended to fill funding shortfalls for libraries with extremely limited budgets, which is certainly true for here. More great things to come all year long.

Property Tax Payment Reminder:

Payment for the 2nd installment of property taxes is due on or before Monday, December 15th, 2025.

Payments can be submitted as follows:

- 1. Mail to PO Box 1022, MTS 05757.
- 2. Deposit in the black drop box on the South street side of the town office building, to the left of the entrance door.
- 3. Pay Online The town accepts, Visa, Mastercard, Discover credit/debit cards and electronic checks (for a nominal fee assessed by the payment processing company.)

Please ensure your tax payments are postmarked and/or submitted on or before 12/15/25. Payments deposited after 12/15/25 or postmarked from 12/16/25 on will be considered late and will generate monthly interest fees until paid.

Vermont Rescinds Statewide Ban on Debris Burning

Montpelier, Vt. – The Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation (FPR) has rescinded the September 22, 2025, order that required all Town Forest Fire Wardens to cease issuing burn permits. This order has now been lifted statewide.

Recent rainfall has helped reduce wildfire danger across Vermont. The U.S. Drought Monitor reports that much of the state remains in extreme or severe drought; however, the wildland fire danger forecast has dropped to Moderate statewide following more than two inches of precipitation in recent days.

"The recent rainfall has provided much-needed relief, saturating small, easy-to-burn fuels and thereby reducing the risk of wildfire," said FPR Forest Fire Supervisor Dan Dillner. "This welcome precipitation follows nearly two months of dry weather, drought conditions, and higher than normal wildland fire activity throughout the state—primarily caused by escaped debris burns or unattended campfires."

With the statewide debris burn ban lifted, Town Forest Fire Wardens once again have the authority to issue fire kindling permits. However, wardens may still restrict permit issuance based on local and daily conditions.

"Although the debris burn ban has been lifted, we continue to urge Vermonters to use great caution when burning debris or enjoying campfires," said FPR Commissioner Danielle Fitzko.

FPR extends sincere appreciation to the public for their cooperation and restraint during this period of very high fire danger. The current fire danger forecast, along with additional information on fire safety and prevention, is available on the FPR website.
