# RESOLUTION RELATING TO INTENT TO EXERCISE ASSESSMENT POWERS

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Blooming Grove,

the Plat of April Hill, and did on the 6th day of April, 1967,
approve the Plat of the First Addition to April Hill, in the

- 1. This Town Board hereby declares its intention to exercise the powers conferred upon the Town of Blooming Grove, Dane County, Wisconsin, by Section 66.60, Wisconsin Statutes, to levy and collect special assessments upon the property described in Exhibits A and B for special benefits conferred upon such property by the paving or otherwise improving streets within said Plat of April Hill and the Plat of the First Addition to April Hill.
- 2. The purpose of the assessments shall be to pay for the cost of the construction and installation of said improvements.
- 3. This Town Board intends that said assessments, when levied, or so much thereof as it is not then required by the Town

Board to be deposited in cash, shall be made payable in several annual installments, the exact number to be determined after the public hearing, together with interest, all as provided in Section 66.54(7), Wisconsin Statutes.

- 4. That Lynn Brown, the Clerk of the Town of Blooming Grove, for said project shall prepare and submit to this Town Board a report in conformity with Section 66.60(3), Wisconsin Statutes, consisting of:
  - (a) Preliminary or final plans and specifications;
  - (b) An estimate of the entire cost of the proposed work or improvement;
  - (c) An estimate, as to each parcel of property
     affected, of:
    - 1. The assessment of benefits to be levied;
    - 2. The damages, if any, to be awarded for property taken or damaged;
    - 3. The net amount of such benefits over damages or the net amount of such damages over benefits; and
    - 4. A statement that the property against which the assessments are proposed is benefited.







Mrs. Ezell is against the license because her neighborhood abounds the area of the Depot. Another place that sells liquor is not needed in the area. She feels that buying cheese doesn't necessarily coincide with buying wine. She doesn't like the idea of selling liquor in a grocery store. ELONG THE WARRENCE TOWN HALL. The face of Sen I Wen Rose or Sun Merinami de  Mr. Kraft asked if the Town will be maintaining the April Hill Park. They will be instructed not to use Rustic Drive. They have 26 parking places so far and bleachers may be installed eventually. The boys are 9 years to 15 years of age. They would play on Saturdays and weekdays but not Sundays. The children don't usually stay around after the games.

Arthur Petersen, Little League Board, District Administration, said they can't schedule games on Sundays and they can't advertise alcoholic beverages on the fence. This is a supervised program that operates under a charter through Williamsport, Pa. The registration is \$20 per child per year.

Officer Hodges said the boys are well disciplined and organized. He transported his boy and friends for years. Mr. Foster has heard nothing but good about this league and he doesn't feel it will hurt the area at all. Mr. Connell thinks it will be an asset to the area.

Most of the neighbors agreed that they moved into Rustic Acres to live in a residential area in the country for peace and quiet and they paid the price to get their privacy.

The majority of the people present are against the change in zoning to RE-1. It could be used for many recreation activities. They wondered what would happen if this league disbanded. They could rent or sell the property to another recreational organization that may not be as reputable. Mr. Connell said the property would revert back to charity - back to Williamsport, Pa.

A-l District allows for ag uses, utilities, farm family, roadside stands for farm sales, structures and improvements consistant with agricultural uses, home occupations as defined by the Zoning ordinances. Conditional use permits are available for people who live there that are not part of the farm operation but are relatives. Conditional use permits are required for

all governmental uses, churches, separation of existing farm dwellings (farms are consolidated and want to sell and set up buildings).

The procedures are to file petition 2057 for A-1 district. The cost is \$10 per year and you have to file and pay each year. You are then entitled to an income tax credit based on family income and real estate taxes. If propose to build a residence for a farm employee, whether a relative or not, a certification has to be given to Zoning that that is the purpose of the new house.

Sale of land for non-farm use by non-family or non-employee of the farm then change of zoning is consistant with the Town plan.

Mr. Fleck explained that if we adopt exclusive ag zoning we can change some of our zoning on a one-time basis. Our zoning plan must be finished by September 1st to be eligible for tax credit for 1983 taxes.

A-1 is exclusive farm land, A-2 is our current A-1 zoning now and A-3 is farmland preservation classified as development potential area.

Mr. Georgeson moved we file a petition to Dane County Zoning for re-zoning to exclusive ag zoning. Seconded by Mr. Voges and carried.

Due to Mr. Hoover's lack of cooperation with the Town Board and Town employees, Mr. Georgeson denies the change in zoning request. Mr. Hoover is treating each of these duplexes as 3 units after several warnings from the Town Chairman and building inspector and from the County Zoning Dept.

Mr. Virchow said you can't have an apartment in the basement without pop out windows and fire stops. Mr. Voges said we would also require him to post a \$50,000 surety bond.

Mr. Smithson asked if we would approve the zoning with the above restrictions? Mr. Georgeson said we may approve the zoning after the changes are made. Mr. Smithson thought this unfair to request his client to expend the money first. Mr. Georgeson said once the Zoning is approved Mr. Hoover probably would not comply to our restrictions. If Mr. Hoover is able he should come to our meeting on Monday, October 10 at 9:00 a.m. and we will discuss this with him.

Mr. Bindl from Gunderson Funeral Home said there is a problem with the lot we buried Judge Byrne's son on. Five lots were purchased from Mrs. Carl Lipps of Arizona for \$1000. She sent the original deed (deeded to her mother, Mattie Christ-offerson) and a letter deeding the 5 grave sites over. They sold 4 graves to Judge Byrne and buried his son there Now Alan Christofferson (grandson of Mattie) is suing Gunderson for buying the lots when they had no right to. The will left the property equally to Mattie's three children and their children. He has three sisters and brothers so he is entitled to on-fourth of his fathers third, which isn't even one grave site. Mr. Bindl wants to know our policy-is the one who holds the deed entitled to the lot? We are not sure but we feel this is between Gunderson and Mr. Christofferson and Mrs. Lipps.

Alex Falch had applied for 45 acres to be rezoned from A-1 excl sive to RH4. He is changing his request for 15 plus acres to RH4 on CTH BB in Section 12. Board approved.

We reviewed the request from Mr. Brabender to lay a sidewalk at 401 Rethke from side door to Thurber Ave. Board viewed the property and decided it shouldn't be allowed. They would leave hills by the road to indent the sidewalk and we could possibly ruin the wing on our plow.

Mr. Voges moved to grant a license to Furniture Outlet Center of Rockford, Illinois to hold furniture sale at Holiday Inn S.E. on October 8 and 9, 1983. Seconded by Mr. Mahnke and carried.

Mr. Voges moved to grant a license to Azurean Galleries of Sun Prairie to hold an antique show and sale at Holiday Inn S.E. on November 18, 19 and 20, 1983. Seconded by Mr. Mahnke and carried. Clerk suggested we order new bicycle license plates from Wisconsin Corrections Industries. Mr. Voges moved to order 150 pike licenses, blue background with white numbers to be good 1984 and 1985. Since this area is not in Blooming Grove we will have our attorney answer the notice as such.

Wm. F. Sorenson, d.b.a. The Kernel, applied for licenses to sell pop and popcorn in Thurber Park at the car show on October 2, 1983. He paid \$10 for each license for one day only. He would like the licenses extended to June 30, 1984 since he paid the same amount  $\rho$  as other businesses in the Town. Board will not extend the licenses since he does not have a permenant place of business in the Town. If and when he wants to sell in Thurber Park again he is to re-apply and wi will see about the price.

At the request of Mr. Georgeson, Clerk sent a certified letter to George and Wilma Paul, 3355 Swinburne Drive to clean up and dispose of all trash, rubbish and brush in their front yard within ten days of September 27, 1983. If they do not comply with this order, we will clean it up at their expense of not less than \$200. Mr. Mahnke will let us know if the Pauls do not remove the junk.

Treasurer's report was read. Receipts \$2,969.78; disbursements \$11,375.79; balance October 1st is \$42,598.71. Receipts include \$2,048.00 Federal Revenue Sharing.

Checks and vouchers were signed and meeting adjourned.

There will be a small sanitary system and leachete collection system with an 8" pipe along Highway 12 & 18 to hook onto Motel 6. Mr. Martinelli will have a petition drawn up for the Town to sign. 

Madison Wild Waters Group, Dick Green, Harold & Millie Curley, Mabel Schultz, Wm. & JoAnn Delaney, Harold Olson, Pauline Johnushka & Nancy Turcotte.

Art Sandridge is interested in making a water park on lot 9 in There would be an access off Long Drive through 1 lot 8. The parking lot is in the flood plain but the rest of the park would not be. Jim Bankson said there would be a water slide, a wave pool, a speed slide, an innertube slide and more, but will be built in phases. The area will be fenced in and landscaped. We expect approximately 700 cars maximum per day.

Mr. Sandridge has checked with the State and sees no problems. There is about 16.7 acres but the park area would be about 7

Mr. Mahnke questioned how much water would be used and wondered if our tower has the capacity to handle this park. Where would they get the water from? Dale Huston said they would fill a 32" deep pool by 40' round and then just need to keep filling what evaporates. He wondered if they need to drill their own well.

The Board agrees with the concept of the water park but a lot of questions need to be worked out. They cannot disturb the volume or capacity of the flood plain. The water may have to come out of a hydrant through a meter. If the pump goes out we don't have a reserve so we need certification from a qualified engineer that our well will be capable of handling this park. Mr. Huston said they will have Midstate Engineering from Baraboo work on this.

It is deteriorating rapidly. He would like a retirement community for age 55 and older with 55 2-bedroom units. He is requesting re-zoning. The cemetery would be re-located. He would keep the recreational center so it could be used by outsiders for Harold Olson, an engineer, has a new proposal for Queen of Apostles. recreational center so it could be used by outsiders for scouts or other organizations but it wouldn't be rented out.

He would need B-1 zoning for the neighborhood service center which would have a small grocery store, barber and beuty shops, craft items, lawn and garden shop and conditional use permit for gas pumps. The rent would be computed on the cost of renovation - not subsidized. Pallottines gave him a ten year loan at reasonable interest.

Mr. Voges moved we recommend adoption of the change of zoning at the zoning hearing. Seconded by Mr. Mahnke and carried.

Mrs. Schultz asked if John Richardson can be stopped from running a house for wayward boys. The boys he has had living with him in the past were very rude and vulgar to the neighbor women. Mr. & Mrs. Curley are concerned their property value is decreasing because of the environment. Mr. Voges will contact Stan Cline, Chief Deputy Sheriff, to see what he suggests.

Pechmann Memorials has made us an offer to keep the cemetery looking good. First they would re-set the tipped memorials (of which there are many) and install a five inch wash along with a proper foundation on these memorials. This is limited to the memorials their equipment can handle and would be of no cost to the Town. They would also donate 5% of the memorial selling price in the name of the purchaser to our perpetual care fund (of the memorials they sell for installation in our cemetery). Mr. Mahnke moved to accept Pechmann Memorial's proposition except the 5% which we would like them to subtract from the customers cost. Seconded by Mr. Voges and carried.

City of Monona has renamed Raywood Road to South Towne Drive and requested us to change the name of our section of it. Monona still has a street named Raywood Road immediately parellel to the new South Towne Drive. Mr. Voges moved we change the name of P.23 3 Raywood Road to South Towne Drive as requested by Monona. Seconded by Mr. Georgeson and carried.

The Sheriff's Dept. has analyzed the placement of stop signs in Gallagher Plat and made recommendations for a few changes. Board agreed to table the issue until spring when we will be able to check traffic patterns and make changes easier.

Since the Feb. 27th primary election should be so lightly attended, we should have less election clerks. Mr. Voges moved to hire three election clerks for the primary election. Seconded by Mr.  $\rho$ . 93 Georgeson and carried.

Mr. Georgeson said he is being pressured by some Town residents to change the first installment due date from January 31 to the end of February each year. Mrs. Rickman suggested if we change it we should make it February 20th because the end of February  $\rho$  253 is too busy with all the full-payment taxes due. We would have to hire extra workers and then too many errors could be made. No decision was made.

Mr. Voges moved we buy three new phones for the Hall at \$59.95 each from the Telephone House (each phone has a hold button) and hire someone to install them. Seconded by Mr. Georgeson and carried. Waumona Sanitary District will reimburse us for one-third of the cost.

Treasurer's report was read. Receipts \$224,622.80; disbursements \$407,996.75; balance February 1st is \$144,691.91. Receipts include taxes and \$5,018.35 State Transportation Aid. Disbursements include \$240,000 C.D.; advance school tax levies to Madison \$120,693; McFarland \$25,000; Monona \$2,000; Oregon \$3,000 and Sun Prairie \$3,000.

Checks and vouchers were signed and meeting adjourned.

Mr. Knutson is concerned about City of Madison annexing Queen of Apostles now that there is a big computer company there. Is there any possibility to protect ourselves by becoming a village? Mr. p.915 Voges said you have to have a post office to be a village and we are also too spread out.

Mr. Voges moved to grant a license to Bill Hallman to sell file Christmas trees at 3802 Milwaukee Street from 11/25/84 to 12/25/84. Seconded by Mr. Mahnke and carried.

Mr. Georgeson suggested salary raises for Rocky Redepenning, Steve Armstrong and Todd Taylor. Mr. Armstrong is an experienced driver now, Mr. Redepenning has been with us five years and Mr. Taylor pass been with us ten years.

Mr. Kraft asked if the Town will be maintaining the April Hill Park. We will not be mowing it because we are short of funds now and must stay as close to budget as possible and this is not in our budget. Mr. Kraft understood that the Town would maintain it. They are still repairing other peoples cars, it's still against zoning, and it creates too much noise. Mr. Curley took pictures of them working on Mr. Richardson's work truck from Red Arrow. I was completely dismantled. Something has to be done about this because it's not fair to the neighbors or to other businesses that obey the zoning laws. 3213 Thurber Avenue. Road setback is 16', back yard is 4' and side yard is 2½' with 57' between the house and garage. Board has no objections but the County Board of Adjustments has the final sav. final say.

Mr. Voges said Karmichael Court slopes to the east and the blacktop is 22' wide instead of 20' as was decided by us and county. Mr. Erickson said there was never an engineer on the project and a transit or grade was never used. Mr. Pursell said there is no room for shoulders now because the road is too wide and there is quite a drop off on either side. Mr. Mahnke moved to have Mr. Georgeson go to County Highway in person to try to correct the road. We should try to have County fix the ditches for shoulders at their expense. On 3/8.71 Mr. Haugan was told an engineer would have to be hired at Mr. Wills expense to bring the road up to Town specs. Clerk wondered if we should turn this over to the attorney to try to get it out of the books. No decision was made.

We received an estimate from Dane County Highway for Wills Road. Grading and culvert is \$6,000 and base course is \$7,000 for a total of \$13,000. Bituminous concrete would be \$7,500 for 22' mat; 5' shoulders for \$750 plus 10% contingencies of \$1,750 for a total of \$10,000. The blacktopping would not be required. For Wills Road to be accepted by the Town this grading and graveling will have to be done at Mr. Wills expense.

Attorney Smithson, representing Dave Hoover, requested change in zoning from R-3A to R4 for the two duplexes at 4002-04 and 4006-08 Bruns Ave., Lots 1, 2 & 3, Block 3, Gallagher Garden Subdivision. The proposed use is multi-family apartments. Mr. Smithson said the area is changing and demanding more apartments and efficiency units.

Due to Mr. Hoover's lack of cooperation with the Town Board and Town employees, Mr. Georgeson denies the change in zoning request. Mr. Hoover is treating each of these duplexes as 3 units after several warnings from the Town Chairman and building inspector and from the County Zoning Dept.

Mr. Virchow said you can't have an apartment in the basement without pop out windows and fire stops. Mr. Voges said we would also require him to post a \$50,000 surety bond.

Mr. Smithson asked if we would approve the zoning with the above restrictions? Mr. Georgeson said we may approve the zoning after the changes are made. Mr. Smithson thought this unfair to request his client to expend the money first. Mr. Georgeson said once the Zoning is approved Mr. Hoover probably would not comply to our restrictions. If Mr. Hoover is able he should come to our meeting on Monday, October 10 at 9:00 a.m. and we will discuss this with him.

Mr. Bindl from Gunderson Funeral Home said there is a problem with the lot we buried Judge Byrne's son on. Five lots were purchased from Mrs. Carl Lipps of Arizona for \$1000. She sent the original deed (deeded to her mother, Mattie Christ-offerson) and a letter deeding the 5 grave sites over. They sold 4 graves to Judge Byrne and buried his son there Now Alan Christofferson (grandson of Mattie) is suing Gunderson for buying the lots when they had no right to. The will left the property equally to Mattie's three children and their children. He has three sisters and brothers so he is entitled to on-fourth of his fathers third, which isn't even one grave site. Mr. Bindl wants to know our policy-is the one who holds the deed entitled to the lot? We are not sure but we feel this is between Gunderson and Mr. Christofferson and Mrs. Lipps.

Alex Falch had applied for 45 acres to be rezoned from A-1 excl sive to RH4. He is changing his request for 15 plus acres to RH4 on CTH BB in Section 12. Board approved.

We reviewed the request from Mr. Brabender to lay a sidewalk at 401 Rethke from side door to Thurber Ave. Board viewed the property and decided it shouldn't be allowed. They would leave hills by the road to indent the sidewalk and we could possibly ruin the wing on our plow.

Mr. Voges moved to grant a license to Furniture Outlet Center of Rockford, Illinois to hold furniture sale at Holiday Inn S.E. on October 8 and 9, 1983. Seconded by Mr. Mahnke and carried.

Wm. F. Sorenson, d.b.a. The Kernel, applied for licenses to sell pop and popcorn in Thurber Park at the car show on October 2, 1983. He paid \$10 for each license for one day only. He would like the licenses extended to June 30, 1984 since he paid the same amount  $\rho$  as other businesses in the Town. Board will not extend the licenses since he does not have a permenant place of business in the Town. If and when he wants to sell in Thurber Park again he is to re-apply and wi will see about the price.

At the request of Mr. Georgeson, Clerk sent a certified letter to George and Wilma Paul, 3355 Swinburne Drive to clean up and dispose of all trash, rubbish and brush in their front yard within ten days of September 27, 1983. If they do not comply with this order, we will clean it up at their expense of not less than \$200. Mr. Mahnke will let us know if the Pauls do not remove the junk.

Treasurer's report was read. Receipts \$2,969.78; disbursements \$11,375.79; balance October 1st is \$42,598.71. Receipts include \$2,048.00 Federal Revenue Sharing.



Art Sandridge is interested in making a water park on lot 9 in There would be an access off Long Drive through 1 lot 8. The parking lot is in the flood plain but the rest of the park would not be. Jim Bankson said there would be a water slide, a wave pool, a speed slide, an innertube slide and more, but will be built in phases. The area will be fenced in and landscaped. We expect approximately 700 cars maximum per day.

Mr. Sandridge has checked with the State and sees no problems. There is about 16.7 acres but the park area would be about 7

Mr. Mahnke questioned how much water would be used and wondered if our tower has the capacity to handle this park. Where would they get the water from? Dale Huston said they would fill a 32" deep pool by 40' round and then just need to keep filling what evaporates. He wondered if they need to drill their own well.

The Board agrees with the concept of the water park but a lot of questions need to be worked out. They cannot disturb the volume or capacity of the flood plain. The water may have to come out of a hydrant through a meter. If the pump goes out we don't have a reserve so we need certification from a qualified engineer that our well will be capable of handling this park. Mr. Huston said they will have Midstate Engineering from Baraboo work on this.

It is deteriorating rapidly. He would like a retirement community for age 55 and older with 55 2-bedroom units. He is requesting re-zoning. The cemetery would be re-located. He would keep the recreational center so it could be used by outsiders for Harold Olson, an engineer, has a new proposal for Queen of Apostles. recreational center so it could be used by outsiders for scouts or other organizations but it wouldn't be rented out.

He would need B-1 zoning for the neighborhood service center which would have a small grocery store, barber and beuty shops, craft items, lawn and garden shop and conditional use permit for gas pumps. The rent would be computed on the cost of renovation - not subsidized. Pallottines gave him a ten year loan at reasonable interest.

Mr. Voges moved we recommend adoption of the change of zoning at the zoning hearing. Seconded by Mr. Mahnke and carried.

Mrs. Schultz asked if John Richardson can be stopped from running a house for wayward boys. The boys he has had living with him in the past were very rude and vulgar to the neighbor women. Mr. & Mrs. Curley are concerned their property value is decreasing because of the environment. Mr. Voges will contact Stan Cline, Chief Deputy Sheriff, to see what he suggests.

Pechmann Memorials has made us an offer to keep the cemetery looking good. First they would re-set the tipped memorials (of which there are many) and install a five inch wash along with a proper foundation on these memorials. This is limited to the memorials their equipment can handle and would be of no cost to the Town. They would also donate 5% of the memorial selling price in the name of the purchaser to our perpetual care fund (of the memorials they sell for installation in our cemetery). Mr. Mahnke moved to accept Pechmann Memorial's proposition except the 5% which we would like them to subtract from the customers cost. Seconded by Mr. Voges and carried.

City of Monona has renamed Raywood Road to South Towne Drive and requested us to change the name of our section of it. Minutes of May 6th were read and approved.

Mr. Halvarson, Collman Insurance Services, responded to a letter from Town Attorney John Mitby. Halvarson reviewed our policies with us. We have no liquor legal liability on contract and neither do any other municipalities. Our Errs and Ommissions is a claims made policy which is the only way it comes. Claims made is not to our benefit. There is no overlapping coverage. It starts as an inexpensive policy but raises each year. There is twice the premium penalty for changing companies. This policy does not include the fire department. We are on the 3rd year of our 3-year policy. Errs and omissions for the fire department would cost \$803.40 per year for \$500,000 coverage. All our other policies are occurance versus claims made and the cost is up from 1985 about 9%. Worker's compensation is higher because the state controls it.

Board approved paying the insurance bill of \$13,380.98 which does not include the fire department errs and omissions. This addition will be decided at the next meeting.

Ed Normandeau, 4116 Brums Avenue, asked to re-zone his lot to B-1. His wife grooms dogs. Everything is done inside so there is no mess, no noise, no breeding or selling and no boarding. She grooms about four dogs per day starting at about 6:45 a.m. P.395 All the neighbors he spoke with approve except Cecil Daugherty next door. He objects to the noise of door slamming which wakes up his ailing wife. No decision was made although the Board said they would vote with the area residents at the County Zoning hearing.

Chief Moody asked the following:

Board approved the purchase of 30 batteries for 15 pagers - each pager needs 2 batteries.

Is it o.k. for a fire truck to be in area parades? Yes - one truck, no throwing candy and no drinking.

Can two men take the new fire truck to Monroe Fire School if they remove some equipment to be left at the station for use in case of fire? Yes.

straightening the flag pole at the Hall. They didn't charge us for this service. us for this service.

Clerk is to call John Norwell, Dane County Highway Dept., to send us a bid for putting the Town streets and road signs on the County computer.

We will need to adopt an ordinance by January 1, 1987, that all newspapers must be bundled and sorted for our landfill and the county landfill.

We discussed selling the grader. We have about four miles of gravel roads which we could hire grading when needed.

Motion by Mahnke, Hall second, to accept the bid of \$6,345 from Monroe Truck Equipment to revamp the old fire truck to a 1000 gallon tanker. Motion carried.

We will ask the fire chief if he would be willing to omit the following items from their 1986 budget so we can use these funds to make the tanker possible:

Hose dryer \$5,000 4 Safety belts \$200 Keystone valve \$700- came on new truck Air hammer chizel \$300- Assn. purchased. Total saved is \$6,200.

## LIBBY ROAD PUBLIC HEARING ON SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

Present: Messrs. Voges, Mahnke & Hall, Mrs. Brown, Atty.Mitby, John Norwell (Dane County Highway Dept.), Atty. David Billing, Reginald Kilps, Bernard Blaser, Homer & Mary Ellen Libby, Joe & Leona Rane, Mike & JoAnn Frior & Connie Dollard.

The purpose of this hearing is to discuss special assessments for reconstruction of Libby Road. The following questions were asked:

Rane asked how we figured the cost for each lot? Voges- Total  $\rho$   $\sqrt{7}$  cost divided by total footage gives us the cost per running foot, then we multiply cost per foot times each lots front footage. The cost we have now is based on the estimate. We understand the bids should be alot less.

Rane-Use doesn't enter into it? Voges-No.

Rane-Who initiated the reconstruction-not the residents on Libby Road. Voges-The complaints we received about the poor condition of the road.

Blaser-Why is Dane County charging us? Isn't it the Dane County Park at the ent? Voges-Dane County is paying one-half of the cost because they own all the property on the north side of Libby Road. When you put in a road, each side pays their share.

Rane-In 15 years from now when it needs to be done again because of all the County Park traffic, will we be assessed again? Voges-No. We will have an ordinance that any road that doesn't meet State code will be improved at landowners expense. Libby Road will be a state approved road.

Mrs. Dollard-When we had a meeting for Libby landfill, they did a survey to count cars on the road. Why didn't the Town do a survey at the end of the residential houses to see how much park and boat landing traffic there is? Voges-You can't put in a road just for yourselves, it is for the public's use.

Mrs. Dollard-Why can't the residents pay part and Madison and Dane County pay the larger share? Voges-Madison doesn't pay anything because they don't own any adjacent land.

Mitby-There isn't any provisions in the Statutes to assess cars on the basis of traffic.

Mrs. Rane-You said that after the road was all improved that it would be inspected by the State? Voges-It will be inspected while it's being built.

Mrs. Rane-Fine. O.k. It's inspected and everything is o.k. and they pass it and then ten years from now with all this traffic, it's shot again. Then you're going to come back and say that we have to pay another \$20 per foot because all the boaters went and messed it up?

Mrs. Dollard-You're going to have camping in there too.

Voges-They still have a right to use that road.

Mrs. Dollard-Of course they have the right. We're not questioning their rights. We're questioning how much we should pay of it. We don't feel it's fair what you're asking us to pay. Voges-That's the way the Statutes are set up.

Hall-This is true with any part of the City. You may only use a small part of that road to your house, but the general public, and you are part of the general public, use that road that you're not paying for. This road is in front of your house so the Statutes require us to charge you for that part of it while you get to use all these other roads that you're not paying for.

Billing-I'm representing Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation and Joe and Leona Rane. You mentioned there will be a state inspector inspecting the re-building of this road. Voges-No, not the state, it will be county.

Billing-Is there any upgrading in the road involved right now? Norwell-Yes there is. It's classified as a local road but it's a narrow road right now between 19 and 20 feet wide and will be widened to 22 feet of surface.

Billing-What will it's classification be after it's upgraded? Norwell-It won't be changed.

Billing-It seems to me there are some serious objections to the notion of even doing the road. I'm wondering if there isn't a cheaper way of accomplishing maybe a repair to the road without doing the entire road. There is some real question as to why the road is being re-built the way it's being proposed here. Voges-About every 2 years that whole road has to be repaired and there is no foundation under it so there has to be something more permanent.

Billings-I understand it would be nice to have a maintenance free road but it's our feeling the whole reason behind having this road redone is to serve the County Park. We suspect the great amount of traffic on that road is generated by the park. It seems to me there is a way available for the Town to impose more the cost of redoing this road, it it's actually necessary, on the property that's actually benefitting the road and that is the park owner. What you've done here is you've chosen to use the taxing authority under the special assessment statute which basically says you can assess for an improvement that's necessary but the amount of the assessment for each parcel has to have some correlation to the actual benefit derived from that improvement. W.A.R.F. and the Ranes are particularly concerned about this since they're picking up about 3/4 of the assessments against the property located on the south side of the road. The problem is that all this land is zoned A-1 Exclusive so we're stuck with a situation that nobody can use that land for anything except agricultural pursuits. It's difficult to say that W.A.R.F. is going to benefit to the tune of \$34,000 and the Ranes about \$14,000. You have to bear in mind what these lands are used for.

Mitby-What is W.A.R.F. zoned for? Billing-A-1 exclusive. Mitby-What about Rane? Billing-A-1 exclusive I think.

Billing-Under this zoning you can't use it for anything. You can have residential buildings located on there that are grandfathered in and all those houses are grandfathered in under the old zoning. W.A.R.F. rents out the farm at what they think is market rate at \$85 per acre for 110 tillable acres. They gross about \$9500 a year off that.

Voges-A-l exclusive can be changed anytime through Dane County Zoning. They get a tax credit on this zoning.

Billing-The nature of the area is still agriculture. Using the amount you propose to assess the Ranes, about \$14,100, against what their assessed value is, you're saying is that property is going to increase in value by over 16% just because of a new road. The same is true with W.A.R.F. Comparing their assessment against their assessed value, for tax purposes, you're saying that their property value is going to increase by over 15%. We just don't think that's possible in light of todays agricultural economy.

Voges-We aren't basing it on that. We're basing it on front footage not on land value.

Billing-That's a common way of assessing but it may cause the Town some real problem. The question here is-is W.A.R.F. benefitting \$34,000 and Ranes \$14,000 from this new road? If it's not, then the difference between the actual benefit and the cost is going to have to be paid by the Town. Unless there is some design to spread the cost over the properties that are actually benefitting in a more accurate manner. We think the park land is benefitting proportionately more. I think there is a basis in the law for using what they call an area assessment. It could be used in this case because the whole county would benefit because of the parks.

I've been told that the people that are proposing to develop that Libby Farm as a landfill. The study says they estimate between 80 to 150 heavy trucks will be coming to that landfill everyday making two trips per day on the road. They think they will use Lake Farm Road as the main access but are not making any guarantees they won't use Libby Road. Voges-Libby Road is not named in the Landfill negotiations. The loan could be 8 or 10 years at about 8% interest.

Norwell-The Town realized the road was in poor condition and came to County Highway. We realized the Parks Dept. was the park owner so our office was the intermediary between the Township and the County Park to see that money was set aside in the County budget to offset the County's share of the cost of the project. Generally, front footage is the way to charge. The road is being upgraded to a certain extent, the drainage will be improved so the roadway itself lasts longer. Generally, improvements of this nature last from 15 to 20 years.

Frion-So what you're saying is the road wasn't done right to begin with? Norwell-No. The roadway itself was probably built as an old farm market road in the 1950's. They laid down about 4 to 6 inches of gravel and then put oil on it and called it cold mix pavement. That was fine 25 years ago when we didn't have heavy vehicles or the number of vehicles we do today.

Frion-Is this a 5 ton road? Voges-Yes and 3 ton in the Spring.

Billing-The way you propose to build it, it could handle heavy trucks. Norwell-Not the type that you're talking about for the landfill. The individual houses should not be subjected to the landfill truck traffic.

Rane- Will there be further improvements to the parks, camping and boat landing? Will it involve alot more traffic? Norwell-Parks is talking about some improvements as early as next year.

Mrs. Dollard-Who is responsible for the boat landing? There is just as much traffic to the lake as to the park. Voges-The County Parks will vacate the end of Libby Road.

Kilps-Dane County has approached me on a mutual agreement to abandon Libby Road from the bend to the lake. If this is approved by the City of Madison and the Town to dedicate the 2 rods to the County. The boad landing would go further to the north not right at the end of Libby Road. The statements that I've heard here tonight are very true. I don't feel the residents have done anything to increase the traffic on the road. I don't feel the road improvement is going to benefit me.

Mitby-The cheapest way to do a project is through Dane County. To a certain extent there is a problem. The Town Board can say no to the project and leave the road the way it is. I don't think this road can be patched and it won't solve the problem. Obviously, all the people that live on the road aren't interested in having the road approved. That's a fact the Town Board has to consider. The statute talks about whether or not the improvement benefits the property. It doesn't talk about how much it benefits - that's a very difficult concept. Normally you don't do street assessments on anything other than front footage. Since Dane County will pay half of the cost of improvement, the south side owners won't get it done any cheaper. From a legal standpoint, the Town Board obviously has the power to pass the assessment and try to minimize the impact by doing it over a ten year period of time. There is only two people that have large assessments. The others are normal.

Frion-Would you consider only improving half way down the road?

Mitby-That's a possibility but it's an engineering question. I understand there is a problem. If the people don't want the road done, do you have any alternative? All I've heard is 1. possibly not doing the whole road and 2. is there a cheaper way of doing it. Unfortunatly there doesn't seem to be a cheaper way.

Mrs. Dollard-Can't you find another way to finance the improvement?

Rane-You said Dane County Parks offerred to pay for half of this road.

Norwell-They didn't agree to pay for anything. They are being assessed the same as you are. They've already budgeted for their half. They were aware of the fact that the Town was planning to improve Libby Road. The Town brought up the fact they wanted the road improved.

Mitby-When are they scheduled to start the work on the road? Voges-They've got the bids out now. Norwell-We'll schedule the work once the Town makes a decision. The bids are out and will be left unaccepted until the Town gives us the go ahead. They will be coming in July 11th. We have 30 days to either approve or reject those bids. We're estimating an average of 250 to 400 cars per day within 20 years.

Mitby-It seems to me there are three possible solutions:
1. For the Town Board to proceed to make the assessments in accordance with what the schedule of benefits are.
2. To refer it to an engineer and then wait to see if the bids will come back less than \$120,000. 3. For the Town Board to forget about the project at this point in time but I'm certain that if that happens we'll be back here in a year and it'll cost more.

It's up to the Town Board as to what they want to do. My suggestion is the Town Board consider having an engineer look at it to see if half the road could be done, or assessed by front footage or what. If the engineer says this is the way to go and the time is now and the most equitable way is on the basis of front footage, I think the Town Board would be compelled to proceed with the project. If you ask people whether or not they want to be assessed they always say no but that doesn't necessarily mean that's in the best interest of public safety.

Blaser-We don't want the road done at all. It makes everything more hazardess than it is now.

Mitby-There's nothing mor hazardess than having a road that doesn't function as a proper road and has a lot of traffic on it. Then you are going to have problems.

Hall-The problem is that sooner or later it has to be done.

Rane-The other half is all County so they don't have any choice either?

Kilps-The County is essentially getting a new road for half the cost and the rest of us are going to foot the bill for the other half.

Norwell-I had two calls from the County Executive last year at the time that it was going in the budget. He said is there anyway out of these because we don't want to pay anything? I said no, it's a special assessment and if the Town cares to go ahead you're going to be assessed for it. State statutes are pretty clear on it. So there's no dealing, they are two separate departments-Dane County Highway and Dane County Parks. We operate separately, we each have our own budgets. A portion of the general tax levy, that you pay, part of it goes to the Parks Dept. and part of it pays to the Highway Dept. and all the other County departments.

Mitby-The reason why we go through the County normally is because they re set up to do it. The town could hire an engineer and bid the project themselves and get involved in that. Normally instead of the bid being \$122,000 it would be about \$140,000.

Norwell-The County is doing some of the work. The bituminous will be let out on contract, the base will be let out on contract, the County will do the grading and placing the base. Plus the supervision of the job, the inspection of the materials and the bituminous contractors.

Voges-If we hire an engineer to go out there thee cost will be added to your road assessment.

Rane-You're putting the cost on the people that live there not the users. Voges-Where is it done otherwise?

Mrs Dollard-Let's get some money form the people that use the boat landing.

Mitby: There isn't any law that allows you to collect a toll tax from people that use a road.

Billing-I urge the Town to make a very careful decision here because you've chosen to use the taxing power. The law says you can't assess more than what the value of the benefit to that land is. So if you go ahead and assess it, it's possible the Town's going to end up picking up part of this cost.

Mitby-If the W.A.R.F. comes in and challenges assessments, and assuming they're successful, which I doubt they would be, then all the rest of the people sitting here are going to have higher assessments. The issue tonight is a preliminary assessment not final assessments.

Frion-And they're the ones that are going to do the work? Mahnke-They will supervise it.

Mrs. Dollard-I'm saying o.k. You can assess us but I'm asking you how much. I know that some of the road needs fixing. We're just asking you to please find some other source of getting the money besides hitting us with such a heavy load, because the people that are benefiting from it are the boaters, the fishermen, the park users. When will the camping ground be open?

Mahnke-We have not been informed about a campground. Ask the Parks Dept.

Mitby-I'm a firm believer that the people have a lot to say in terms of what goes on relative to government. There are some questions to be looked at: 1. Whether or not this whole road should be done. 2. What these bids are going to be. 3. State Statutes says you have to assess people over a ten year period of time. Somewhere along the line we have to come up with a solution to the problem because this problem isn't going to go away.

Mrs. Libby-You say you're going on a ten year assessment. What are we paying in interest in those ten years? Mrs. Brown-Approximately 8% interest from Monona Grove State Bank.

Mitby-We'll check with the State funding for a loan at about  $6\frac{1}{2}\%$ .

Voges-We'll close this hearing and in the meantime we'll discuss it and see what the bids will be. After that time we'll send you another notice of what's going to happen.

Some further discussion followed and then meeting was adjourned.

Discussion on Libby Road Improvement

Introductions were made.

Presney, Director, Dane County Parks, - The purpose of this meeting is to see if this can be a viable project. The bids for bituminous surfacing expire August 11th. So this meeting is to see if we can come up with a solution to recommend to the Town Board for the re-construction of Libby Road. The County is interested in the project. Libby Road is unsafe as it is now.

Norwell, Dane County Highway Dept.-I think with the oil costs rising now that it is necessary to proceed while the costs are lower.

Presney-County has appropriated monies in their 1986 budget anticipating the road reconstruction. Whether we'll be able to save the \$61,000 from the budget is another problem.

Billing-W.A.R.F. is a farm that generates no traffic and Ranes live there with some agricultural business. It's zones A-l exclusive which means you can only use it for farming. My two clients own about half of the south side. The problem they have is the enormous assessments for these two owners. W.A.R.F. is about \$34,000 and Rane is about \$14,000. Admittedly, the road has pot holes and needs repair or blacktop. But are these properties benefiting that much? We think the County is benefiting the most for the park use and will create quite a bit of traffic on that road. We don't agree that each property will benefit by the amount of front footage. There is still a question that the Libby Landfill could have access off Libby Road which would generate 50 to 100 garbage trucks per day. Is it fair that this kind of use equals 100' of footage for their access?

Voges-The Landfill negotiating committee has agreed to use Lake Farm Road access.

Billing-They still have 100' access on Libby and it could be used in the future.

Mitby-If the new bid proposal is \$90,000 to \$95,000 what would their share be if County paid 65%?

Billing-W.A.R.F.'s share would be \$20,000 and Rane's would be \$8,000. Our appraisers say that we will not have any benefit from this. The range of reasonableness is 75% to 25%.

Mitby-If County pays 75% to 25% what is the change in your numbers.

Billing-W.A.R.F. would be about \$13,800 and Rane \$5,700.

Olson-The money budgeted for this road will disappear if not used now. Safety should come first and Libby Road is not safe now.

Presney-The County can build an internal road within park property for \$61,000 if they get a waiver that they won't be assessed for Libby Road. We have just as easy access off Lake Farm Road as we do on Libby Road.

Mitby-The Town Board has done a good job in the sense that I think they're sensative to the problem. Now they convinced the County to pay 65% and the bids appear to be somewhat reasonable at this time. If the Town doesn't go forward with this the County will not have the funds and you won't get the project done for \$100,000. From everybody's stand point it seems to me we have two choices:
1. Either we stop now and wait a year and the cost goes
up or 2. we do it now, it's in the publics interest to get this project done, and move on to something else. The Town Board ought not to take any of the heat on this, other than the safety of the road, it doesn't benefit from the road. The road ought to be fixed. How can we compromise? If you're \$8500 apart, what would be the problem if the County picked up 1/3 of that and the Town picked up 1/3 of that and Mr. Billing backed off and we'd be done with the problem. If the project is \$92,000 then 65% is \$59,800. The County has \$61,000. \$8,500 divided by 3 is \$2,833. County would pay \$59,800 plus \$2,833 equaling \$62,633.

Presney-We agreed if the project could get done, and the amount was around \$61,000, the two supervisors from that area would support it. The Park Commission definitely wants the road. Currently 1/3 of the traffic is lake use not park use but we anticipate more use.

Mitby-Is Mr. Billing willing to go along with this? The difference between 25% and 35% is about \$8500 split three ways.

Voges-I think the County has tried their best and we consider the road hazardess, and I believe, according to the statutes, the Boa d has the right to improve the road as they see fit and charge it back to land owners. I feel 65% to 35% is more than fair.

Miller-If we have to pay 75% we would be better off going in the City. Better road and less per cent. Is the offer 65% plus 1/3 equals 68½%?

Presney-We're willing to go with this offer. If it comes over \$61,000 we'll have to pay our bill. We urge the Board to consider favorable action on the granting of the contract.

Billing-I have to check with my clients on the three way split.

Mitby-If the project is \$92,000 and the County picked up 75% of it that would be \$69,000. If the County picked up 65% that would be \$61,600. So the difference is \$7,400. One third of this is \$2,466 or so. The Town is asking you if the County is willing to go 1/3 would you recommend that in so far as your two clients are concerned?

Billing-The south side would pay 28-1/3? One of the reasons this is happening now is because it didn't happen 20 years When that road was originally covered with blacktop. The theory has been developed that you do it once and then anything after that is not a special assessment. How can we be sure the concept will be the same 20 years from now?

Voges-If it's built to State standards we won't re-assess. Mitby-The Board can't promise that a new Board will stay They can change the law. with our concept.

Billing-What is the Town's current position as far as term of payment and interest rates?

Voges-We can go for 8 or 10 years at about 8% interest. Mitby will check with State funding for a lower interest.

Billing-I will get back to you, Bill, by Monday the 11th as to my clients decision.

Mr. Statz owns 3.7 acres, Acme Welding. We would put the present tenants in a new metal building and destroy the existing building. Add a blacktop parking area, landscaping and new signage to create a much better appearing development than what is there now. As they would lease additional space, they would have phase 2 and phase 3 built. Smith Service Center building would remain with maybe an addition built onto it. There would be more parking area than Dane County Zoning requires. Statz said the whole idea of the renovation is to get parking off the street. They want to lease to smaller service type business. There shouldn't be any added truck traffic. Phase I would cover the old tenants and phase 2 & 3 would be built as they are pre-leased. Board approved at this time.

Mr. Redepenning syas the sander truck's back end is rusty and needs to be rebuilt. Drott Tractor will charge \$150 but Redepenning would like it shortened about 8" so it's not so low to the ground. Drott's charge would be \$150 to \$400. Voges suggests he get a bid from a company in Sun Prairie.

The plow needs some welding but Jones Company will have to repair the crack because they didn't build it strong enough.

The other plow needs adjustment on the brakes. Voges agreed.

Redepenning recommends we continue to take our trucks to M & J Truck Repair. Pete Maly appeared on behalf of his company, M & J, to answer any questions we may have. They had to raise their rates \$2 per hour due to liability insurance costs. Voges suggests that M & J send all bills to the department that brought them the truck so they can review the bills before giving them to the Clerk.

Redepenning cleaned the south side of the garage and he took all the trees down. Voges wants all the buildings cleaned and straightened up before bad weather begins. Redepenning would like a small building or wall built to store sand.

Voges said to put an ad in the Wisconsin State Journal for three consecutive days to advertise the sale of our Wausau one-way trip plow.

Joe Way, manager of Holiday Inn, S.E., and a representative of the Greater Madison Convention and Visitors Bureau. They would be grateful for a per centage of the room tax or a donation. The room tax has a negative effect on business. The motel used to give 10% discount to some groups and now have to give 20% discount because of the room tax and state sales tax. The convention and Visitors Bureau is a private non-profit corporation working to bring visitors to the Greater Madison area. They attract visitors through direct sales calls, direct mail, advertising and a variety of special promotions. He ultimately hopes a donation will help their business which adds to our room tax.

Voges said we had trouble with the water meter at Holiday Inn. The seal was broken when the meter was read on September 29th. The water useage for the 3rd quarter was about 150,000 cubic feet less than any 3rd quarter for the last 4 years. We feel this is suspicious but can't prove meter tampering. The master meter shows a loss of 210,000 cubic feet this quarter which is usually from 50,000 to 68,000 cubic feet each quarter. This shows that someone used about 150,000 cubic feet and aren't paying for it. Mr. Way doesn't feel any of his people are responsible for breaking the meter seal or for stealing water but he will send a memo to his employees warning against this.

Voges reported that A.A.&A. Oriental Rugs sold a used rug when advertised as new and wouldn't issue a refund. The newspaper article about this is on file at the Hall now. Motion by Voges, Hall second, we deny A.A.&A. further licenses for an undetermined period of time and send them a letter explaining this action and send a copy to Holiday Inn, S.E. Motion carried.

Redepenning said a 60' pine tree fell from Judge Byrne's lot in the cemetery. Clerk is to contact a tree trimmer to have this tree removed.

We discussed the newspaper recycling ordinance. Motion by Hall, Mahnke second, to adopt an ordinance for mandatory separation of newsprint from all other solid waste for mandatory recycling purposes to comply with Dane County Ordinance, Section 41.22(1). Motion carried.

Voges suggests we make newspaper pick-up once a month. Redepenning suggested the first Tuesday of every month, except snow days and holidays, then pick-up will be the following working day.

Redepenning asked for a raise. His last salary increase was January, 1985. No decision was made.

Voges asked that Redepenning and the Clerk inform the Chairman whenever they take vacation.

Redepenning advised we need a "divided highway" sign on Moorland Road in front of the sewage plant. We discussed asking Monona to install the sign since it's their divided highway.

We discussed stop signs at Memphis and Webb. Moody and Miller agreed that there are many cars that go through the 4-way stop without stopping. They will try to keep track of the time of day this happens wo we can inform the Sheriff's Dept.

Moody gave us a supply list for the fire station. Motion by Mahnke, Hall second, to approve the list of supplies. Motion carried. Most items on the list can be purchased at Woodman's.

Voges had stopped at the fire station to look at the bed to see if his mattresses will fit it but the fireman on duty said they don't need different ones. Moody will check into this because he was told they needed new mattresses.

Fire dept. still needs a typewriter and a 6' wood ladder. Board hasn't made a decision on a new typewriter for the clerk yet so they could have her old one, but board approved the purchase of a six foot wooden ladder.

The fire dept. portable radio squelch control is not working. Motion by Mahnke, Voges second, to approve to have the radio taken to a radio shop for repair. Motion carried.

Firemen's Assn. has about \$1700 toward air bags. Moody asked if the Town would donate the \$500 needed to buy air bags. Motion by Mahnke, Hall second, to donate \$500 to the fire dept. from the Town general funds for the purchase of air bags. Motion carried.

Motion by Voges, Hall second, to adopt an ordinance assuming responsibility of Treasurer, in case the treasurer shall fail to pay all taxes to Dane County Treasurer as required by law. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report was read. Receipts \$97,591.84 (includes State Revenue Sharing \$93,233); disbursements \$34,930.89; balance on hand December 1, 1986 is \$181,048.56.





In an effort to simplify this unwieldy structure, we may wish to merge these two entities into Complete Channel TV, Inc., prior to, or just after, the sale. The <u>shareholders</u> of CCTV, Inc., are the same persons, or organizations, as the <u>partners</u> in CCTV Company, and hold the same percentage of ownership in both entities. The owners are:

Tele-Communications, Inc. 33 1/3%

Midcontinent Broadcasting 33 1/3%

Carley-Wegner Group 33 1/3%

After the sale is completed, TCI (Tele-Communications, Inc.), now a 1/3 owner of both entities, will own 100% of both entities. Tele-Communications, Inc. believes there are unnecessary administrative complications (producing two complete sets of financial statements, for example) inherrent in the current corporate/company structure.

By adopting the attached resolution, you would authorize us not only to transfer ownership, but to consolidate CCTV, Inc., and CCTV Company, if evolving circumstances make this a desirable and necessary thing to do in the future.

Since it is not clear at this time whether this simple consolidation will take place, I am requesting the flexibility to do it in the future, should this become desirable. I would like to avoid a last minute effort to obtain this additional approval, just prior to closing, if that should become necessary.

Thank you very much for your cooperation in this important matter.



## TOWN OF BLOOMING GROVE

#### Board of Supervisors

Pursuant to sec. 80.13, Wis. Stats., the Town Board of the Town of Blooming Grove met in open session on October 24, 1984, at 9:30 a.m., to consider laying out a highway to the land owned by Don Simon, Inc., described as:

Starting at the Northeast corner of the Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 14, Township 7 North, Range 10 East, in the Town of Blooming Grove, thence South along the North-South centerline of said section to the junction with the East-West centerline of said section, thence West along said East-West centerline to the Eastern edge of the right of way for Interstate Highway I-90, thence North 13° 00' West along the Eastern edge of said right of way to the Northern edge of the Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter, thence East to the point of beginning.

Notice of said meeting was served as required under sec. 80.04, Wis. Stats., and published as a Class 2 notice under ch. 985, Wis. Stats.

Testimony was taken by the Town Board from Don Simon, President of Don Simon, Inc., Mr. L.E. Clark, Mr. Eugene Fobes and Mr. William Fobes, owners of the adjacent land. Don Simon, Inc., was represented by Attorney Michael K. Harris.

The testimony of those present at the meeting, the affidavit of Don Simon as President of Don Simon, Inc., and the various exhibits presented on Don Simon, Inc.'s behalf have been fully considered by the Board. The Board also considered Attorney Brill's letter of November 7, 1984. The requirements for laying out a right-of-way to enclose land, as provided in sec. 80.13,



Wis. Stats., have also been fully considered. Based on this information the Board hereby renders the following decision.

It is apparent that the land in question has no access to a highway. The land abuts the right-of-way for Interstate Highway I-90 on the west side. An award of damages for the loss of access due to the construction of the interstate highway was made by the State Highway Commission in 1960 (Exhibit 9). This is a limited access highway to which a right-of-way cannot be obtained. The nearest accessible highway is County Trunk A-B, also known as Buckeye Road. On the north, the land is separated from County Trunk A-B by a parcel owned by L.E. Clark (Exhibit 1). Mr. Clark has refused to sell this parcel to Don Simon, Inc. On June 24, 1984, Don Simon, Inc., offered to purchase the Clark land, which is approximately 4.09 acres, for Eight Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$8,000.00). (Exhibit 6.) On September 13, 1984, Don Simon, Inc., offered Twelve Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$12,000.00) for the same parcel of land. (Exhibit 7.) Mr. Clark stated that he refused the first offer but had no knowledge of the second; apparently the second offer was communicated to his sister who has had an interest in the property. Mr. Clark gave no indication at the meeting that he would be willing to consider the second offer.

The Board has been informed that since the time of the hearing, the Clark land has been sold to Eugene Fobes, one of the other adjacent landowners, who owns the property to the east of the Don Simon, Inc., property. The Board has also been informed



by Mr. Fobes that he does not, at least at present, intend to provide a right-of-way to the land locked parcel. It does not appear that Don Simon, Inc. has made an offer to purchase a right-of-way from Mr. Fobes.

Reviewing the statutory requirements found in sec. 80.13, Wis. Stats., it is apparent that the land locked landowner must do the following in order to fall within the statute:

- (1) He must present an affidavit to the supervisors of the town satisfying them that he is the owner of land which is cut off from public highways and,
- (2) The affidavit must state that he is unable to purchase from any of the owners of adjacent lands a right-of-way to the property or that a right-of-way cannot be purchased except at an exorbitant price, stating the lowest price for which it can be purchased.

Don Simon, Inc., has presented an affidavit to the Board, satisfying the Board that it is the owner of the parcel in question. Some question exists as to whether Don Simon, Inc., has met the remaining requirements of sec. 80.13, Wis. Stats., in that the affidavit and testimony at the meeting indicates that Don Simon, Inc., did not attempt to purchase right-of-way over the Clark property but made two offers for the entire parcel. Also, Don Simon, Inc., did not attempt to purchase a right-of-way over the adjacent Fobes property or from Eugene Fobes, the current owner of the Clark property.

Mr. Fobes is using the land as pasture for his cows. Due to the topography of the land, it appears that the only available site for the road would split the pasture approximately in half,

rendering a substantial portion of the field practically unusable for the current owner's purposes.

The Board is of the opinion that under the discretion granted the Town Supervisors under sec. 80.13, Wis. Stats., a right-of-way should not be granted to Don Simon, Inc., over the Clark property (now owned by Eugene Fobes) under the present circumstances. This decision is based upon both the procedural defects affecting the Board's jurisdiction over this matter and the effect such a right-of-way would have on the current use of the land.



  - 5. The principal amount of the Obligation will not exceed by more than 5% the amount necessary for the purpose of the Obligation; and
- 6. Even if the aforesaid expectations do not occur, the Municipality will not invest any of the principal amount received in a manner to cause the Obligation to be an "arbitrage bond."

To the best of my knowledge and belief, there are no other facts, estimates or circumstances that would materially change the foregoing expectations.

The present (1978) Arbitrage Regulations (proposed Regs. Secs. 1-103.13-15) designed to prevent municipalities from borrowing money to make investments, are extremely complex; therefore, this form, which should cover almost all cases, is not the only set of facts complying with the Regulations. If the municipality cannot make the certifications required, consult your attorney.

- 1. The Project must be underway or at least ready to go in the near future. Accordingly, the municipality must either have substantial contracts (at least 2½% of the Project costs) either in existence or to be finalized within 6 months.
