- **9.21(3) EXTERIOR AREAS**. No person shall allow or permit the exterior areas of property which they own or occupy to be or remain in a condition that is not in accord with the following:
- (b) All exterior property areas shall be kept free from noxious weeds which includes Canada or other thistles, leafy spurge and field bindweed (creeping Jenny), giant ragweed, common ragweed, burdock, poison ivy and stinging nettles.
- (c) Lawns shall be maintained to a height not to exceed 6 in length. Plantings and trees shall be maintained so as not to present hazards to adjoining properties or to persons or vehicles traveling on public ways. Dead trees must be promptly removed to prevent possible spread of disease to other trees, hazard to persons and property from falling limbs and a blighting appearance to the neighborhood.

10.03 PUBLIC NUISANCES AFFECTING HEALTH.

The following acts, omissions, places, conditions and things are specifically declared to be public health nuisances; but such enumeration shall not be construed to exclude other health nuisances coming within the definition of §10.02:

(6) NOXIOUS WEEDS. (Am. #96-4) All noxious weeds and other rank growth of vegetation shall be kept cut to a height not to exceed 6". The Village may cause all weeds and grass in violation of this section to be cut and removed and brush to be removed and the cost thereof charged to the property owner under §66.60(16), Wis. Stats.

8.11 TERRACE AREAS.

(3) RESPONSIBILITY TO MAINTAIN. Every owner of land in the Village whose land abuts a terrace is required to maintain or have maintained by his tenant the terrace directly abutting such land as provided in this section and elsewhere in this Code. Every owner shall keep mailboxes located on a terrace free and clear of snow.

Terrace Areas. The land between the normal location of the street curbing and sidewalk. Where there is no sidewalk, the area 4 feet from the curb line shall be deemed to be a terrace for the purpose of this section. Where there i
