(c). Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING EXISTING SOUTH AMHERST CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 921.07 and 921.19 AND ENACTING NEW SOUTH AMHERST CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTIONS 921.07 and 921.19, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH AMHERST, LORAIN COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1: The Council of the Village of South Amherst hereby repeals existing South Amherst Codified Ordinance Sections 921.07 and 921.19 and enacts new South Amherst Codified Ordinance Section 921.07 and 921.19 as follows:

921.07 STORM SEWER TAP-IN OR MODIFICATION TO EXISTING TAP.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to alter or install a new tap-in to the Village of South Amherst stormwater system, without first obtaining an approved permit from the SABPA.
- (b) Before any modification or installation of a new tap-in shall begin, the applicant shall submit a permit application along with a duplicate drawing of detailed plans and specifications of the proposed work. One set of plans and specifications are to be returned to the applicant upon approval or disapproval, with the second set to be kept by the SBPA.
- (c) Detailed plans and specifications shall be approved by the SBPA or their appointee for all modifications or new tap-in applications.
- (d) Check valves must be in existence or installed and exposed prior to final inspection of the SABPA appointee.
- (e) Failure of owner to obtain a permit prior to commencement of work shall result in a permit fee amount equivalent to original permit fee plus two times the permit fee amount. It is the property owner's responsibility to have the application filed and fee paid.
- (f) Permit Fee for a new tap- in will be five hundred dollars (\$500.00). Permit fee for a modification will be one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
- (g) A refund of fifty dollars (\$50.00) will be made to the property owner upon final inspection of approved project by the SABPA appointee.

921.19 METER OWNERSHIP, CONTROL AND REPAIR, TESTING.

(a) All services must be metered. Water meters shall be furnished and set by the Water Department and installation paid for by the owner of the property. All ordinary repairs and renewals of water meters shall be paid for by the Water Department. All ordinary repairs and renewals of damage by freezing, hot water, carelessness or abuse, shall be charged to the property owner or tenant. The size of meter, tap, service, etc., shall be subject to approval of the South Amherst Board of Trustees of Public Affairs.

(b) The water customer may request their meter be tested for accuracy. They will be responsible for the cost of testing the meter if the meter passes. If the meter does not pass, the water department will pay for the cost of testing and adjust the customer's water bill using a six-month average, and will replace the meter.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall repeal all Ordinances in conflict herewith.

SECTION 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Waterline Engineering

Modify OPWC plans to include waterline replacement on Annis Road from Squires Court to East Main Street (SR113). Prepare updated construction cost estimate. Field locate waterline markings and service valves. Modify Bid documents.

Waterline Engineering Professional Services Fee- cost not to exceed \$9,700.

Storm Sewer Engineering

Prepare master plan of possible storm sewer improvements within Phase 2 area of Annis Road. Prepare storm sewer design to meet the 10 year storm frequency while maintaining the 25 year hydraulic grade line below proposed catch basin rims. Field Investigate existing storm sewer at East Main Street (SR113). Modify bid documents to include storm sewer work. Prepare updated construction cost estimate.

Storm Sewer Engineering Professional Services Fee- cost not to exceed \$6,800.
