Home Delivered Meals Seniors

(Contributed by Emily, Nutrition Program Coordinator; Aging & Disability Resource Center of the Lakeshore)
Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, a delicious, hot, home delivered meal. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the County. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances)
- A spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual, under the age of 60, who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.

Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a contribution basis, regardless of income or ability to contribute.

Building Permits – Before you start that home improvement project, be sure to contact Village Hall to see if you need a building permit. Building permits are required for most projects, including fences. If your project is an exterior project, please submit a site plan with your lot line measurements for your project or your permit could be delayed. For questions on what to include in your site plan, contact the Village Hall at (920) 755-2525.

Mishicot Public Safety Cadets always welcoming new members

The cadet program is for area youth that are interested in a law enforcement or public safety career. Joining the Mishicot Police Department's Cadet Program allows youth the opportunity to train with police officers firsthand and learn how to be a police officer. This will give students an advantage when in college. The Cadets attend local and state law enforcement conferences and competitions, have the opportunity to compete at a national level, and attend leadership training. In addition to training, the Mishicot Public Safety Cadet Program will also offer other opportunities such as community service activities, first aid training, and college scholarship opportunities. This is a great way to start your career early while still in High School.

In January of 2024, our Cadet post once again had a very strong showing at the WLEEA state competition. This year we had two teams from our post compete. We had 1st, 3rd, 4th, 5th place finishes in team events. One cadet placed 3rd in the air soft challenge. The cadets prepared by attending training at least once per week for several months leading up to the competition.

In the past year our post has taken tours of NWTC and Fox Valley Technical campuses. We have a tour of Lakeshore Technical College in the works. We believe in preparing the cadets for their future endeavors.

We are looking at ways to attend more competitions, and provide more training equipment for further growth of our cadets. The Mishicot Community Athletic Complex is seeking to acquire funds for an athletic complex in the Village of Mishicot. This will be self-funded by our organization and the Village of Mishicot. This investment will benefit hundreds of youth who will be provided with additional opportunities to participate in baseball and softball. The economic impact will be felt throughout Mishicot with the large amounts of people drawn to the area.

The Mishicot Community Athletic Complex Committee has been active in creating a development plan for a complex that will provide the opportunity for over 200 youth, ages 6-18, to participate in baseball and softball. The complex will consist of four diamonds that will allow multiple games to be played simultaneously, with one of the diamonds being a regulation baseball field. There will also be a sizable concession stand with large bathrooms. The facility is handicap accessible to fit the needs of the large number of people attending the games, which will allow this facility to support multi team tournaments.

When complete, this project will serve softball and baseball teams throughout Northeastern Wisconsin, and far beyond. Because we have consistently experienced a great demand for additional tournament space, we will be able to attract more than enough teams for at least six tournaments every season with 50 or more teams per tournament. We anticipate that our new sports complex will serve teams from at least 33 surrounding communities. The Manitowoc Area Visitor's Bureau estimated that these tournaments would draw a conservatively estimated 15,750 players, coaches, and their families to our community each season.



The Manitowoc Area Visitor & Convention Bureau's Economic Impact study for our project finds that the financial impact resulting from its successful completion will result in approximately \$640,695 inserted into our local economy every season, or \$106,782.50 per tournament hosted. This amount of revenue injected into our community each year would save the economy of Mishicot and pave our way to a successful and tourism-rich future.

The Mishicot Community Athletic Complex works through MAGIC (Mishicot Area Growth and Improvement Committee), which is a 501(c)(3), whose mission is to promote economic growth in Mishicot and provide opportunities for youth and the community of Mishicot to thrive. This complex will not only expand our community, but aid in teaching our youth skills such as teamwork, collaboration, and time management.
