

Village of Mishicot Welcomed into WEDC's Downtown Revitalization Program

Mishicot, WI. January 5, 2026 — The Village of Mishicot has been accepted into the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC)'s Connect Communities Program, an initiative that works with communities to advance downtown and historic commercial corridor revitalization efforts.

Mishicot is one of nine communities that will join the program, bringing the total number of participants to an even one hundred.

The new Connect Communities participants are:

- City of Brodhead (Green County)
- City of Richland Center (Richland County)
- City of River Falls (Pierce County)
- Hurley Chamber of Commerce (Iron County)
- Thrive on Five (Antigo, Langlade County)
- Village of De Soto (Vernon County)
- Village of Mishicot (Manitowoc County)
- Village of Random Lake (Sheboygan County)
- Village of Williams Bay (Walworth County)

The Connect Communities Program was launched in January 2013. It provides access to resources and training to help communities pursue revitalization and redevelopment efforts. Since its inception, participating communities have reported adding 876 net new businesses, more than 3,385 jobs, and \$3.9 billion in private investment.

"WEDC congratulates Mishicot for being accepted into this program," said Sam Ridders, deputy secretary and COO of WEDC. "A vibrant downtown or neighborhood commercial district is key to the overall economic health of the community, and we applaud Mishicot for taking this step toward making its business district even stronger."

“Connect Communities gives Mishicot the tools and partnerships we need to advance priority projects and build a strong, sustainable future for our village,” said Bernie Samz, Village President.

In order to be admitted to the program, each applicant community provided an overview of the existing condition of their downtown/commercial district, identified key individuals who will be involved in revitalization efforts, and identified near term goals that they hope to achieve within their district.

“Assisting Mishicot with its Connect Communities application reflects Progress Lakeshore’s commitment to helping local communities access state resources that strengthen economic vitality across Manitowoc County,” said Jamie Zastrow, Executive Director of Progress Lakeshore, Inc.

Village Budget Challenges and Rising Service Costs

The Village of Mishicot would like to update residents on the financial challenges impacting our future budgets. Like many communities across Wisconsin, we are facing increasing costs while revenues remain limited.

- **Village revenues continue to grow very slowly and are not keeping up with the increased cost of expenses:** State of Wisconsin shared revenue and other state funding sources have provided only small increases again this year (3% in 2026, amounting to \$5,607.64). With such limited growth, it becomes more difficult for the Village to keep up with essential service costs.
- **Decades of under-funding relative to needs and inflation:** Over the past several decades, shared revenue allocations stagnated or grew far slower than inflation and rising costs. That means communities are effectively receiving less “real value” over time, while demand for services and costs (labor, maintenance, infrastructure) have increased.

- **Limited alternative revenue options:** Local governments in Wisconsin face constraints on raising revenue beyond property taxes (e.g., limited ability to raise local sales or income taxes, restrictions on new taxes) due to state laws.

Fire Protection Costs Rising Significantly

One of the largest pressures on our budget is the sharp increase in fire protection charges. Over the past seven years, the cost of the fire department contract has increased by **65%**. It is currently at \$135,032, which was frozen for one year but next year will be back at a large increase of 15% or more just for one year unless we can negotiate a better contract with the Fire Dept. Fire protection remains essential to community safety, but it carries a growing financial impact.

General Operating Costs Up Across the Board

Like households and businesses, the Village is experiencing higher costs for nearly everything we rely on to operate. Insurance rates continue to rise, energy and fuel costs are increasing, and general operating expenses have grown significantly compared to previous years.

Street Construction Costs Rise

Street construction costs rise every year and without the funds to pay for the streets, village streets will continue to deteriorate. Even a small, short street can run over \$65,000 or more. When the village is forced to borrow funds for these streets, the interest adds more money to the cost and this additional cost is then put on all the taxpayers via the tax levy.

Considering Responsible Solutions to Address Budget Pressures

To continue providing essential services without compromising safety or quality, the Village Board is evaluating several possible budget strategies:

- **Implementation of a Wheel Tax (Vehicle Registration Fee)**

This option would provide a dedicated funding source for street and road maintenance. By law, wheel tax revenues may only be used for transportation-related costs such as street repairs, reconstruction, and maintenance. The fee would be \$20/vehicle with certain vehicles excluded. More information on the wheel tax can be found here: <https://wisconsindot.gov/pages/dmv/vehicles/title-plates/wheeltax.aspx>.

- **Enact an Ordinance Assessing Property Owners for the Street Construction Costs**

Another option to fund street construction would be to assess each property owner of the street being reconstructed a portion of the cost of the street via a local ordinance.

- **Moving Fire Protection Costs to the Property Tax Roll**

Currently, fire protection expenses are funded through limited general revenues. Placing these costs on the tax roll would increase transparency and provide a more stable funding source for this critical service. Tax exempt properties would also share in that cost where now they don't.

- **Adding Street Lighting Costs to the Property Tax Roll**

The cost of operating and maintaining street lights continues to rise due to increasing energy and equipment costs; currently almost \$50,000 per year for the village street lights. Shifting these expenses to the tax roll would help ensure that this important safety feature remains adequately funded.

Next Steps

The Village Board and staff are reviewing these and other options carefully. No decisions have been made, and resident feedback will be an important part of the process. Our goal is to maintain high-quality

MISHICOT MAINTENANCE–SNOW REMOVAL Many questions have come up regarding snow removal policies within the Village of Mishicot. The following is the village’s ordinance concerning sidewalk snow removal:

6.08 SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL. (1) FROM SIDEWALKS. All village residents and property owners have 24 hours after the snowfall to remove snow and ice from their sidewalk; otherwise, the village will clear the sidewalk and send you an invoice. Failure to pay the invoice will result in it being applied to the tax roll as a special charge.

(2) DEPOSITS IN STREETS PROHIBITED. It is unlawful for any person in clearing snow from parking lots, driveways, filling stations, garages, retail stores, apartment buildings, or other areas to pile or distribute snow, or cause snow to be piled or distributed, in a street or alley in any manner that tends to narrow the traveled portion of the street, prevent parking at the curb, or in any other way impede snow removal or create a traffic hazard. Persons having an accumulation of snow that cannot be removed as set forth in the Section shall be responsible for its handling at their own expense without depositing same in the public streets or alleyways. (12-03-96). Also, remember that the village has a winter parking ban between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. during the months of December 1 through March 31.

TAX SUMMARY

The 2025 total tax rate of \$20.22 per thousand of assessed valuation is higher than the 2024 rate of \$17.10. The net 2025 tax levy after applying tax credits totaling \$178,194.19 is \$354,605.04 more than the 2024 tax levy of \$1,831,981.11. The 2025 assessed value of the Village is \$108,133,500, an increase of \$998,800 over the 2024 assessed value of \$107,134,700.

REAL ESTATE TAXES

The first installment of your real estate taxes must be paid on or before January 31, 2026. The second half must be received by the Manitowoc County Treasurer on or before July 31, 2026 to avoid interest. The lottery credit for 2025 only applies to property that you own that was used as your primary residence on January 1, 2025. If property you claim as your primary residence does not have a lottery credit on it and you feel you qualify for it, please contact the Village Hall. The lottery credit for qualifying tax bills in 2025 is \$198.86 compared to \$188.31 in 2024. The first dollar credit for most parcels with improvements is \$66.29 for 2025 compared to \$58.49 for 2024.

TAX COLLECTION

You can pay your taxes by mail, in the drop box outside of the Village Hall or at the Village Hall during regular business hours. **Village Hall will be closed all day on Wednesday, December 31, 2025.** Any payments in the drop box by 8 am on Friday, January 2nd will be credited to December 31, 2025, unless specifically requested otherwise. Make checks payable to the "Village of Mishicot". **Please return the first payment stub along with your payment. If you would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope along with your tax payment.**

PLEASE NOTE: postmark regulations have changed and your mail will no longer be postmarked the day you drop it off. It will be postmarked a day later at the processing facility. Keep this in mind when mailing in your tax payments near the end of the month.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE THAT DOG LICENSE FEES WILL INCREASE EFFECTIVE 1/1/2026.

DOG LICENSES – IMPORTANT NOTICE

State law requires all dogs to be licensed annually. Proof of current rabies vaccination must be presented before a dog license will be issued. **Please bring in your rabies vaccination** so we can update your dog's information. The new license fee is **\$10 for neutered/spayed dogs** and **\$15 for unneutered/unspayed dogs**. **There will be a \$25 late fee for all dogs not licensed by March 31, 2026. Owners can be fined for failure to license a dog annually.**

BUILDING PERMITS

Before you start that home OR business improvement project, be sure to contact the Village Hall to see if you need a building, electrical, HVAC or plumbing permit. **Building, electrical, HVAC, and plumbing permits are required for most projects, including fences.** Note that inspection fees are included with the permit fees. If your project needs additional inspections beyond the normal number of inspections, there will be an additional \$100 inspection fee billed to you. If your project is an exterior project, please submit a site plan with your lot line measurements for your project or your permit could be delayed. For questions on what to include in your site plan, contact the Village Hall at (920) 755-2525.

WATER SYSTEM CROSS CONNECTION PROGRAM

During 2010, the Village of Mishicot initiated a water system cross connection control program to ensure that water quality for customers of the Mishicot Water Utility continues to be maintained at the highest standards in the industry. These inspections will be required on all residential dwellings once in a ten-year period and will be scheduled well in advance at the convenience of property owners. There may be occasions where potential water system cross connections need to be corrected by the property owner, but there will be no charges from the village for the inspections services. We welcome any questions you have regarding our continuing efforts to protect your water quality.

TREES-EVERGREENS

Eastern Arborvitae (*Thuja occidentalis*): Fan-like glossy leaves • mature height 30'-40' • forms a wind tight barrier when used for screening or as hedging • prefers heavy damp areas, but adapts well to other soil types • provides year round color

Balsam Fir (*Abies balsamea*): traditional Christmas trees • mature height 75' • prefers well-drained acidic, moist soils • full to partial sun • excellent fragrance and good needle retention

White Pine (*Pinus strobes*): vigorous growing, open tree • grows over 35' • grows well in sandy and other soils • tolerates shade • soft bluish-green needles • a source of food for deer, so may need protection

American Larch (*Larix laricina*): also commonly called eastern larch or Tamarack • reaches 60' tall • grows in wet soils, ponds and bogs, but also uplands • Good fall color

White Spruce (*Picea glauca*): used for Christmas trees, wind breaks, and as ornamentals • matures height 70' • moist, fertile soils • full to partial sun stiff • green needles

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*): noted for its rapid growth • grown in average, acidic, evenly moist, well-drained soils in full sun • mature height 40' - 60'

TREES-DECIDUOUS

River Birch (*Betula populifolia*): reddish brown exfoliating bark • tolerant to many soil conditions • resistant to bronze birch borer • mature height 40'-70'

Flame Maple (*Acer Ginnala*): brilliant autumn colors, ranging from orange-red to deep red • can be grown as a tree or multi-stemmed shrub • mature height 15'-25'

White Oak (*Quercus bicolor*): provide food for turkey, blue jay, and ruffed grouse • mature height 50'-60' • wet, moist soil • yellow to purple fall color

Sugar Maple (*Acer saccharum*): official state tree of Wisconsin • tapped for maple syrup, wood used for furniture, flooring and fuel • mature height 80' • rich, moist soil • leaves break down quickly to make rich organic fertilizer

Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*): is a medium-sized, fast-growing forest tree • largest native cherry in North America • white flowers in spring give way to fruit • mature height 50' - 60'

BUSHES-SHRUBS

American Hazelnut (*Corylus Americana*): A large fast-growing shrub with showy spring flowers • Best used when naturalizing an area • mature height 10'-18'

Bush, Button (*Cephalanthus Occidentalis*): has some value as a honey plant • small bush that bears attractive summer foliage with creamy-white flowers appearing in late summer • full sun • mature height 5' - 15'


