NOTICE OF PARTISAN PRIMARY ELECTION

Tuesday, August 11, 2026

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to the municipal clerk.

A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen who:

- Will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day;
- Has resided in the ward or municipality where they wish to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election; and
- Is properly registered to vote.

Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

Requesting an Absentee Ballot by Mail

Voters may request an absentee ballot in writing or online at **MyVote.wi.gov**. Written requests may be submitted by mail, email, fax, or in person to the Municipal Clerk.

The **first day** to vote an absentee ballot in the Clerk's Office is:

The **last day** to vote an absentee ballot in the Clerk's Office is:

Friday, August 7, 2026

Please Note: Wisconsin law does not permit in-person absentee voting on **Monday, August 10, 2026** (the day before the election) or on **Election Day, Tuesday, August 11, 2026**.

The municipal clerk will deliver voted absentee ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place before the polls close. Any absentee ballots received after the polls close at **8:00 p.m.** on Election Day cannot be counted.
