Village Board – DEO Verheyen and DEO Estano both attended the monthly village board meeting on April 6.

Traffic / Ordinance Enforcement

Officers use traffic enforcement as one mean to modify dangerous driving behavior. **Traffic** citations are issued to gain compliance with the law.

There were 3 traffic stops initiated and 1 traffic crash in the Village of Denmark in April.

Of those traffic contacts,

- 3 traffic <u>citations</u> issued
- 1 traffic warnings issued

Ordinance citations are used to enforce the codes that are specific to Denmark. There were 2 ordinance citations issued in April.

Reckless Drivers – DEOs received complaints in April of trucks driving recklessly in DayBreak Estates. DEOs were able to identify the said operators and enforce ordinances / issue citations / talk with them.

The **speed board** remained set up monitoring speeds

along Woodrow St in **April** in attempts to deter motorists from speeding, in addition to traffic enforcement. DEOs have received complaints on Woodrow St for vehicles speeding. This is a posted 25mph zone.

Construction – Brown
County Sheriff's Office
deputies and traffic team
continue to add extra
patrol and enforcement in
the village to assist in the
construction zones with the
CTH R bridge projects.

Administrative

Trespass – DEOs continue to work together with property owner(s) in April on ordinance violations including trespassing and damage to property.

Specifically, 305 S Wall St as it is vacant and has obvious No Trespassing signs.

Chronic Nuisance Property

Currently, there is 1
 property that is deemed a
 Chronic Nuisance Property
 (CNP) in the Village of
 Denmark.

Federal Tobacco 21 Law -

The Federal Tobacco 21
Law that went into effect
as of December 20th makes
it illegal to sell any tobacco
products, including ecigarettes, to anyone
under the age of 21.
However, the Federal Law
does not require states to
amend their state laws
addressing tobacco sales
to minors.

At this time, in the State of WI, only the FDA has the

authority to issue citations to tobacco retailers/vape shops who sell tobacco/ecigarettes to anyone 18-20 years of age.

Joint Efforts

Brown County Drug Task Force (BCDTF) – DEOs continuously work with the BCDTF on any drug tips / cases in the Village.

Investigative Division – Currently, there are _ open cases with BCSO

investigative division. Both

DEOs continue to work closely with, communicate, and assist this division.

School Resource Officer – DEO Verheyen and DEO Estano maintain close communication and participate in events with SRO Dzekute at all the Denmark schools.

Building Inspector – DEOs work together with the Village Building Inspector on enforcing ordinances and increasing the overall appearance/safety of the Village and its' residents.

Information Bulletin

Garbage Collection Changes – Due to COVID-19 and effective March 23, the garbage collection procedures by Advance Disposal in the Village have changed. All dumpsters are at Memorial Park on Wisconsin Avenue. All trash/refuse must be bagged and placed in containers. Garbage is to be dropped off at the site by Village residents. This is not open to the public outside of the Village. The site will be closely monitored. Certain waste is prohibited by the Village of Denmark from being placed for removal.

Park hours – Reminder, park hours for the general public are from 8:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. No person shall be present in the park after hours

Parking – Reminder, overnight parking on village streets, roadways, highways, or alley opens back up for the season, beginning **April 1**. We appreciate your compliance during winter months. However, remember **Village Code 289-5(D)** states "no person shall park any vehicle on any street, roadway, highway, or alley within the village at any time for more than 48 continuous hours without movement."

Noise – Reminder, Village Code 213-6 states "no person shall make or cause to be made any loud, disturbing, or unnecessary sounds or noises such as may tend to annoy or disturb a person of ordinary sensibilities in the vicinity therof in or about any public street, alley, park, waterway, or any private residence unless..."

House Check Requests –

There were 0 house check requests in **April**.


