Summary

- ❖ **142** calls for service in the Village of Denmark from **2/1/2023 – 2/28/2023**
- ❖ Brown County Sheriff's Office (BCSO) deputies provide additional enforcement, police services and respond to calls for service when DEOs are not available.

In the Community

- ❖ **PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK** - As a reminder, this drop off site is open Monday – Friday during normal Village of Denmark municipal hours.
- ❖ **Coffee with a Cop** – Tuesday mornings from 8-9am DEO's are at DeGrand Family Restaurant for Coffee with a Cop, residents can come in ask questions, voice concerns, and get to know the Village Officers!

Meetings, Associations & Presentations.

- ❖ Denmark Municipal Court is scheduled for **April 5, 2023**, at 6:30PM. Court is normally scheduled for the first Wednesday of the month at 6:30 PM (subject to change).

Traffic / Ordinance Enforcement

- ❖ Officers use **traffic enforcement** as one mean to modify, correct and educate operators on dangerous driving behavior. Traffic citations are issued to gain compliance with the law.
 - ❖ There were **28** traffic contacts initiated and **6** traffic crashes in the Village of Denmark.
 - Of those traffic contacts, **19** traffic citations issued, and **23** traffic warnings issued.
 - **0** OWI arrests / citations.
- ❖ **Ordinance citations** are used to enforce the codes that are specific to Denmark. There were **33** ordinance citation(s) issued.

Administrative

- ❖ Denmark DEO's actively assisting BCSO Investigative with **1** case
- ❖ **Significant Calls for Service:**
 - ❖ **Theft from vehicle** – BCSO Deputies responded to the village for a theft from a vehicle. Damage was done to the vehicle to gain entry and items of significant value taken. DEO Rusk assisted.
 - ❖ **Theft from construction vehicles** – DEO Rusk responded for a report of several construction vehicles that were entered and items of significant value were taken.

- ❖ **Eviction** – DEO Rusk assisted the BCSO Civil Process Officers with an eviction
- ❖ **Chronic Nuisance Properties (CNP)**
 - ❖ Currently, there are **2** properties deemed a CNP in the Village of Denmark.
 - ❖ DEO's working with Landlord(s)/tenants
- ❖ **Sex Offender Registrants**
 - ❖ Currently there are no active Sex Offender Residency Appeals.
 - ❖ Currently **0** Sex Offender (pending) Appeal process for Residency within the Village.
- ❖ **Patrol Vehicles/Equipment**
 - ❖ New Panasonic Toughbook squad computers are in and installed!
 - ❖ Police Department Office computers will be updated in 2023

Joint Efforts

- ❖ **Crime Stoppers**
 - ❖ Both DEOs continue to monitor anonymous tips that come in through Green Bay Area Crime Stoppers. These tips are received at Crime Stoppers through phone or online. DEOs are then forwarded these tips for follow-up.

Information Bulletin

- ❖ **Park hours**
 - Reminder, park hours for the public are from 8:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. No person shall be present in the park after hours. Parking ordinances are also enforced within park after hours.
- ❖ **Overnight Parking**
 - ❖ Reminder: **Village Code 289-5(B)** states: “No person shall park any vehicle between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from November 1 to April 1 on any village street.”
- ❖ **Animals at Large**
 - ❖ Reminder, **Village Code 111-3(A)** states “No person, owner, or custodian shall permit an animal to be at large within the Village. Any animal shall be deemed to be at large when it is off the premises owned or leased by its owner or custodian unless crated, penned, or under the control of a person able to control the animal by means of a leash of sufficient strength to control the action of the animal or such other personal attention as will reasonably control the conduct and actions of the animal.
- ❖ **Keeping of Cats**
 - ❖ Reminder, **Village Code 111-5(C)** states “Number of cats limited. No person shall own, harbor, or possess more than three cats on any residential lot without the prior approval of the Village, except that a litter of kittens, or a portion of a litter, may be kept for not more than eight weeks from birth. An application for prior approval of the Village shall be signed by the applicant and the owner of the residential lot if the landowner is not the applicant. If more than one family resides on a residential lot, then only three cats

shall be allowed on the residential lot unless the prior approval is obtained from the Village. For the purpose of this subsection, the term "family" shall be defined as one or more persons."

Crime Prevention

❖ House Check Requests

- ❖ Remember, if you're leaving town for a weekend or taking a vacation or traveling –fill out a house check request form; it can be located on the village website. These forms are forwarded to DEOs for documentation, checks, and extra patrol. These checks offer extra supervision over your home and provide DEOs information on who to contact while you are away if needed as well as what to expect for activity/vehicles at your home.

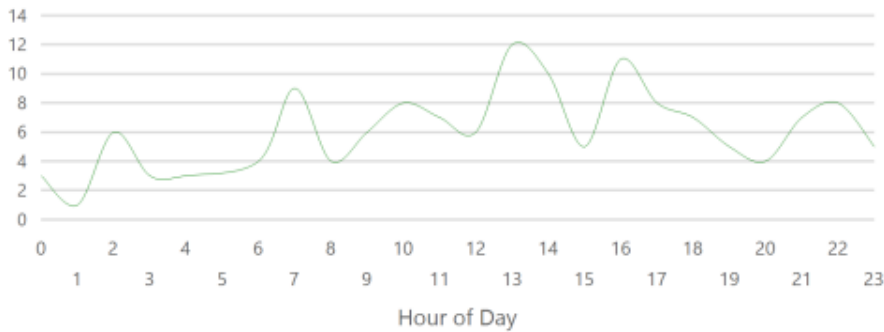

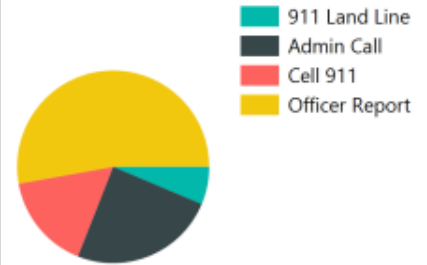
