Summary

- ❖ **100** calls for service in the Village of Denmark from **9/1/2022 – 9/30/2022**.
- ❖ Brown County Sheriff's Office (BCSO) deputies provide additional enforcement, police services and respond to calls for service when DEOs are not available.

In the Community

- ❖ **PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK** - As a reminder, this drop off site is open Monday – Friday during normal Village of Denmark municipal hours.
- ❖ **Denmark High School Homecoming Parade** – On 9/30 SRO Dzekute and DEO Rusk assisted with the Homecoming Parade
- ❖ **Police Lights of Christmas** – On 9/21 DEO's Rusk and Estano attended a fundraising event at Culver's – Proceeds go to gift cards to help neighbors in need throughout Brown County

Meetings, Associations & Presentations.

- ❖ Denmark Municipal Court is scheduled for **November 2, 2022** at 6:30PM. Court is normally scheduled for the first Wednesday of the month at 6:30PM (subject to change).

Traffic / Ordinance Enforcement

- ❖ Officers use **traffic enforcement** as one mean to modify, correct and educate operators on dangerous driving behavior. Traffic citations are issued to gain compliance with the law.
 - ❖ There were **12** traffic contacts initiated and **4** traffic crash in the Village of Denmark.
 - Of those traffic contacts, **5** traffic citations issued, and **8** traffic warnings issued.
 - **0 OWI** arrests / citations.
- ❖ **Ordinance citations** are used to enforce the codes that are specific to Denmark. There was **1** ordinance citation(s) issued (Disorderly Conduct).

Administrative

- ❖ Denmark DEO's actively assisting BCSO Investigative with **1** case.
- ❖ **Significant Calls for Service:**
 - ❖ DEO Estano assisted BCSO deputies and investigators with a sexual assault investigation
- ❖ **Chronic Nuisance Properties (CNP)**

- ❖ Currently, there are **2** properties deemed a CNP in the Village of Denmark.
- ❖ DEO's working with Landlord(s)/tenants.
- ❖ **Sex Offender Registrants**
 - ❖ Currently there are no active Sex Offender Residency Appeals.
 - ❖ Currently **0** Sex Offender (pending) Appeal process for Residency within the Village.
- ❖ **Patrol Vehicle**
 - ❖ New Durango is complete and officially being used for duty!!
 - ❖ Patrol Cars will need updated computers in 2023
 - ❖ Police Department Office computer

Joint Efforts

- ❖ **Crime Stoppers**
 - ❖ Both DEOs continue to monitor anonymous tips that come in through Green Bay Area Crime Stoppers. These tips are received at Crime Stoppers through phone or online. DEOs are then forwarded these tips for follow-up.

Information Bulletin

- ❖ **Park hours**
 - Reminder, park hours for the public are from 8:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. No person shall be present in the park after hours. Parking ordinances are also enforced within park after hours.
- ❖ **Overnight Parking (Starting November 1st)**
 - ❖ Reminder: **Village Code 289-5(B)** states: "No person shall park any vehicle between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from November 1 to April 1 on any village street."
- ❖ **Parking within the Village**
 - ❖ Reminder, **Village Code 289-5(D)** states "no person shall park any vehicle on any street, roadway, highway, or alley within the village at any time for more than 48 continuous hours without movement."
- ❖ **Noise prohibitions**
 - ❖ Reminder, **Village Code 213-6** states "no person shall make or cause to be made any loud, disturbing, or unnecessary sounds or noises such as may tend to annoy or disturb a person of ordinary sensibilities in the vicinity thereof in or about any public street, alley, park, waterway, or any private residence unless..."

Crime Prevention

- ❖ **House Check Requests**
 - ❖ Remember, if you're leaving town for a weekend or taking a vacation or traveling –fill out a house check request form; it can be located on the village website. These forms are forwarded to DEOs for documentation, checks, and extra patrol. These checks offer extra supervision over your home and

provide DEOs information on who to contact while you are away if needed as well as what to expect for activity/vehicles at your home.

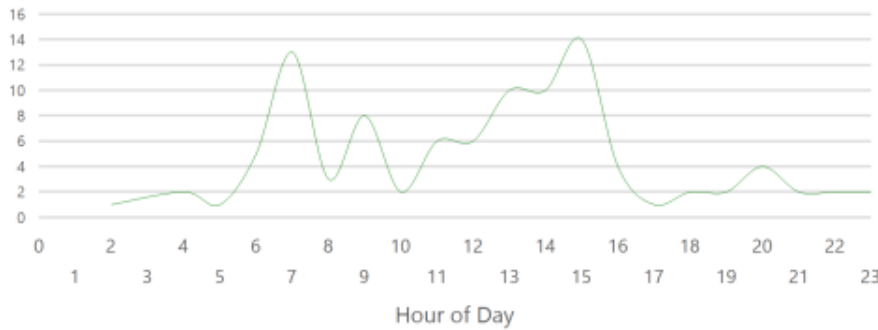

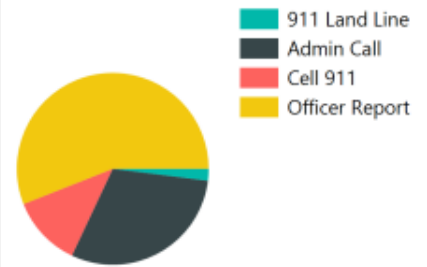
