





VILLAGE OF DENMARK SUMMARY

- Denmark had 158 total incidents in May
- DEO Dzekute and DEO Delebreau handled 100 of the 158 incidents in the village (63.3%)

VILLAGE OF DENMARK PATROL

- DEOs made 28 traffic stops, issued 15 citations, and 21 warnings. There were also 3 parking tickets issued.
- County Patrol made 2 traffic stop and issued 3 citations

BROWN COUNTY DRUG TASK FORCE IN DENMARK

- The DEOs have been able to verify that one of the drug tips relating to a residence in the village has been cleared up.
- Both DEOs continue to monitor the drug tips to keep up to date on any possible drug activity in the village.
- There have been drug tips from some residents that have come in to the DEOs and they will be following up on them

• The DEOs continue to work with and communicate with the BCSO Investigators about open cases and current investigations.



- There were several reckless driving complaints tha came in that were looked into but none of them turned out to be drunk drivers.

- The rummage sale went off without a hitch on our end. This year we didn't have any parking complaints or accidents that came in. We hope everyone's sales were successful. Thanks to everyone who participated in this years sale as either shopper or a seller.
- During the month of May DEOs assisted county patrol with 16 calls outside of the village.





- 05-05-17 Both DEOs attempted to follow up on an animal complaint. The complaint was regarding some dogs that are constantly barking and possibly vicious or aggressive. We were unable to contact the owner of the dogs, but the complaint is still being looked into.
- 05-05-17 Both DEOs deployed the speed board on North Ave near the intersection with Red Clover.
- 05-06-17 Both DEOs were on duty during the village rummage sale. For another year it seemed to be a great event.
- 05-06-17 Both DEOs responded to a call of a small child that was walking on Highridge Ave. The child was located and we were able to find where the child lived.
- 05-06-17 DEO Dzekute attended part of the high school baseball games.
- 05-09-17 DEO Dzekute was contacted by Ms. Kittell at the high school in reference to an issue with some students who were walking to school and weren't crossing the road by the crossing guards. The students were later located and talked to about the proper way and location to cross the street.
- 05-14-17 DEO Delebreau observed a possible intoxicated driver in the village. He was able to stop the vehicle and through his investigation determined that the driver was in fact operating while intoxicated. An arrest was made.
- 05-15-17 DEO Delebreau attended a planning meeting for the "Rockin' The Hill" concert.
- 05-17-17 DEO Delebreau did some follow-up at the high school after there was a level 3 lockdown. Everything was ok at the school. The lockdown was cancelled and classes went on as usual the rest of the day.
- 05-22-17 DEO Dzekute responded to the elementary school to talk to a student who was afraid that his father was going to go to jail. I was able to explain the situation to the student and cleared up the issues that he had. The student was able to go back to class and was feeling much better after our discussion.
- 05-24-17 Both DEOs attended a training at GBPD. The training was on bicycle and pedestrian safety. We were able to obtain some information regarding bicycle and pedestrian laws. There are handouts at the village hall if anyone would like to read more information about the specific laws.
- 05-26-17 DEO Dzekute assisted with "Bring Your Tractor to School Day." The event was great and everyone made it to the school safely.
- 05-30-17 DEO Dzekute was called to the elementary school to talk to a student who has been stealing items. He was talked to and consequences were explained if the behavior continued. The student left with a much better understanding and he agreed that he would stop stealing things.
- 05-30-17 Both DEOs assisted with a damage investigation in the village. Mailboxes were hit by a vehicle on Wisconsin Ave. and the suspect vehicle then left. Security video was viewed to try to locate and ID the suspect vehicle.
- 05-31-17 DEO Delebreau attended a planning meeting for the "Rockin' The Hill" concert.



INFORMATION BULLETIN

- The weather is finally getting nicer out so get out there and enjoy it. Just make sure you are safe while you are outside. Remember hydration and sunscreen on the hot sunny days.
- There are also a lot more people out walking, running, and biking with the nice weather. If you are driving please be aware of the non-motorized commuters. Remember that pedestrians have the right of way while in crosswalks and that means marked and unmarked. Please make sure you share the roadways with bicycles, they have the right to be there just like vehicles do. For those of you walking please make sure you are crossing streets at the crosswalks since this is the safest place to cross. If you must cross mid block or in an area where there isn't a crosswalk you are legally allowed to in the state of Wisconsin but we ask that you make sure you are looking both ways for traffic before crossing. The preferred area is always a crosswalk. If you must walk on the road please make sure that you are walking on the left side of the roadway (against the flow of traffic). If you are biking and over the age of 12 please use the roadway as vehicles are classified in Wisconsin as vehicles. Younger riders are still allowed to ride on the sidewalk and should use caution when approaching or passing pedestrians.
- IRS scams are still going around so please be aware of anything you think is a scam. A big thing to remember is that the IRS is going to use the postal service if there is going to be any contact. If you receive a call that you feel is a possible scam **don't** give out any information and report the incident by calling **920-391-7450**
- Just a reminder to keep all vehicles, homes, and outbuildings locked. We may trust our neighbors, but can we always trust the stranger that finds their way into the village. **DON'T** be a "soft target" for criminal activity.
- It is important to remember to call in any type of suspicious activity. With the recent string of thefts we have had some incidents that have not been called in when they happen. The sooner the activity gets called in the sooner we can get officers in the area and hopefully get this problem to stop. The number to call is <u>920-391-7450</u>. If it's an emergency always dial 911.
- The voicemail in the DEO office is now set up. We will be checking the voicemail throughout our shift. If you need an officer to come out please continue to use the non-emergency number listed above or below or 911 for an emergency.
- If there are any drug issues that you notice throughout the village and you would like to report them please call the **Brown County Drug**Task Force tip line: 920-437-DRUG(3784). The tips that come in from the village will get sent and viewed by both DEOs. We can then follow up on the tips.
