2023 Road Projects

This year, the Town of Vienna solicited road bids for the Red Bird and Dekorra residential roads and work was completed by end of May. Also underway are two major culvert replacements on Patton and Hahn Roads. Because these culverts are larger than 36" each, they both qualify for Dane County Culvert Aid (aka bridge/culvert aid) where 50% of the total cost are reimbursed. This is an aid the town takes advantage of anytime we do work that qualifies. We also bid out Chip Sealing this year for this year. Roads to be improved are Madigan, Hahn, Hickory Lane and Meek Road. This year Scott's Construction was awarded the bid. Work will commence later this month.

Nature Valley Subdivision

The town has noticed how the roads within the first addition of Nature Valley subdivision are deteriorating. The town board has decided to perform a land survey to determine the areas most in need of repair. Our town Engineer has completed the survey and will gather the findings to provide a report to the town board. A project this size will take extra planning and meetings to finalize prior to any project commitment. The town anticipates this project to commence in 2024 or 2025, depending on the findings. More information will be provided as this moves forward.

Bulk Waste Event a Success

On Saturday, June 17th from 8am-12pm the town will have a dumpster available for disposing bulk items such as furniture, mattresses, couches, cabinets and construction materials. Since this is the first year with Pellitteri, we are not sure about all acceptable items so we have a requested a list. This will be available on our website upon receipt.

Roadside Mowing

Roadside ditch mowing will begin in mid June. The first round should be completed by early to mid July. The second round will include mowing the ditches out to the fence lines and a final round will be done in the fall, weather permitting. Thank you to all our Adopt a Road participants for cleaning the ditches along the road. This helps keep our blades sharp!

Electronics Recycling Event

Another successful year! This was held on Saturday, May 20th and the town filled a semi load of electronics, free to residents. We received laptops, computers, printers, and lots of TV's. Hopefully everyone took advantage of this. It is a great way to dispose of items that do not belong in landfills.

Trash Recycling Bins

It is important to have your bins out the night before or by 6:00am in the morning. We were informed that the drivers start at 5:30am and can be in our area as early as 6:00am to start their route. Please remember to keep your bins in your driveway for pick up and not in the street.

The brush site days and hours for the month of June are scheduled as follows. Saturday, June 3rd from 9AM-2PM and the following Wednesday, June 7th from 4PM-7PM. Town of Vienna Board Minutes May 1, 2023

The regular meeting was called to order on May 1, 2023, at 7Pm by Chair Jerry Marx. Supervisors Steve Ruegsegger, Sherri Meinholz, Gary Endres, Tim Hoege, Public Works Supervisor Scott Benson, Public Works Billy Newman, Treasurer Nikki Roessler and Clerk Kathy Clark were present. Also in attendance Town Engineer Scott Anderson, and residents Nancy Caldwell and Doug Schey.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Public Comment: Endres asked about the town loans and how much the bank insures or if we get information on this. Roessler explained the town gets a monthly statement.

Approval of Minutes: Motion by Ruegsegger, second by Meinholz to approve the minutes for the April 18 and April 26, 2023, town board meetings. Motion carried (5-0)

Discussion and possible action on Nature Valley Subdivision Survey: Anderson explained that the subdivision was developed in 2004. The drainage design was a new approach to force water to the side of the lots flowing to the rear of the house. Once the homes were built, different elevations and home designs created an issue for the excess water to drain. In 2019, the town repaired a section on Meadowside Lane where the large culvert was designed to drain the water. The road had to be reshaped and curbed to make the water flow properly into the culvert. To correct this issue in other sections, a complete road survey should be performed as the first step to deciding what areas need repairs. The estimated cost for this is \$7,000-\$10,000. Marx asked if the town would need a right-of-way to go between the houses. Anderson said a temporary grading easement would work. Hoege pointed out areas where the water just sits on the road. Ruegsegger asked if this was in the budget for this year or wait until next year so it can be budgeted for. Motion by Endres, second by Hoege to approve performing the Survey of Nature Valley Subdivision. Motion carried (4-1)

Discussion and possible action to proceed with TDS to Convert Phone/Internet to Fiber Optic: The town received a mailer from TDS with a special offer to sign up for internet services. Clark called on it and was provided an estimate for converting internet from Centurytel DSL to TDS Fiber Optic. The new service would include upgrading the phone services through TDS once the wiring is completed. Motion by Ruegsegger, second by Endres to proceed with TDS for services. Motion carried (5-0)

Discussion and possible action JRC Investments Application for Fireworks Sale Permit: Motion Hoege, second by Ruegsegger to approve JRC Investments for Fireworks permit. Motion carried (5-0)

Operator's License: None

Town Supervisor Reports: Supervisor Ruegsegger meeting with the DeForest Area Senior Center is scheduled for Tuesday, May 9th. Supervisor Hoege meeting with Waunakee EMS is scheduled for Thursday, May 11th. Supervisor Meinholz meeting with Dane-Vienna Fire Department was held for Monday April 24th. Supervisor Endres meeting with Waunakee Fire Department was scheduled for Monday April 24th but was cancelled.

Town Clerk's Report: Clark reported that the salt shed had been inspected. The report stated the cement walls have cracks that need to be repaired. This is in addition to last year's report that required the old doors on the salt shed be replaced with doors that seal the salt shed from the roadside. The Plan Commission meeting is May 8th and there is an ETZ meeting scheduled May 9th. Board of Review is scheduled for May 22nd, from 5pm to 7pm, with the Town Board Meeting to follow.

Review and authorize payments of current town and utility bills, wages, and expenses: Motion by Ruegsegger, second by Meinholz to approve the current town bills as stated in the amount of \$51,531.87; Payroll \$19,585.14; Town Bills \$3,401.41; Utility 1 \$17,152.11 and Utility 2 \$11,393.21. Motion carried (5-0)

The Town of Vienna Plan Commission meeting was called to order on Monday, May 8, 2023, at 7:00PM by Chair Brian Meinholz. Commissioners Steve Herbrand, Cathleen Heath, Todd Mallon, and Clerk Kathy Clark were present. Residents Stewart, Josh, Jackie Stewart and Alysen Tierney with United Grading and Surveying were also present. Commissioner Jim Koch was present via phone conference.

Recite the Pledge of Allegiance

Public comment: None

Approve the minutes: Motion by Mallon, second by Heath to approve the minutes for the April 10, 2023 Plan Commission meeting. Motion carried (5-0).

Presentation by Dane County Senior Planner, Curt Kodl Comprehensive Plan Proposal: Kodl provided a power point presentation on the Comprehensive Planning process. It outlined each section of the plan including the schedule of meetings and hearings that will need to be scheduled. Kodl also had prepared a proposal with estimated costs-based hours involved. The total for this could range from \$4,900 to \$7,300. In addition, it was recommended to complete a survey design at a cost of \$3,200 to \$4,800. The primary focus will be updating all zoning ordinances referenced, land use and future development. Clark will bring this to the town board for final approval.

Discussion and possible recommendation on Josh Harris Rezone application Parcel # 0909-132-8002-7: Clark informed the commission that this property is located in the Extraterritorial Zoning (ETZ). The Village of DeForest has zoning rights for properties located in the boundary area of both Vienna and DeForest. The CSM has been submitted to Dane County for review and approval before the Town and Village review. The property owner has enough acreage to create a buildable parcel. Discussion followed. Motion by Herbrand, second by Heath to recommend approval of the rezone application with a deed restriction of seventy-five acres. Motion carried (5-0)

Adjourn: Motion by Heath, second by Mallon to adjourn. Motion carried (5-0) Meeting was adjourned at 7:43pm.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Public Comment: Haney asked about a few properties that are overgrown with weeds, old vehicles and overall scraps and debris all over the property. Clark will speak with our Dane County Community Deputy to request help with approaching the property owners. There have been other complaints about the same properties and letters have been sent but his will need more official help to resolve.

Approval of Minutes: Motion by Meinholz, second by Hoege to approve the minutes for the May 1, 2023, town board meeting. Motion carried (4-0).

Discussion and possible action on Bid Seal Coating Bids: Clark explained that two bids were received, one from Scott Construction and one from Fahrner. Scott Construction came in \$10,000 lower then Fahrner bid. Motion by Hoege, second by Ruegsegger to award Scott Construction the 2023 bid award. Motion carried (4-0)

Discussion and possible action on Josh Harris Rezone Application, Parcel 0909-132-8002-7: Owners Cheryl and Stewart Harris requested a rezone for two acres so their son Josh could build a home. This property is located in the ETZ area. It was reviewed by the Plan Commission and ETZ Commission and both recommended approvals. The town board reviewed the application and required a deed restriction of 75 acres per the Comprehensive Plan. Motion by Meinholz, second by Ruegsegger to approve the rezone application with a deed restriction for the split. Motion carried (4-0)

Discussion and possible action on R&M Enterprise Application for Firework Stand: Snap Fireworks is the stand name for the R&M Fireworks. They have set up their stand at Ehlenbachs over the last few years and there has never been an issue. The Fireworks are locked up and secure when the stand is not open. Motion by Ruegsegger, second by Meinholz to approve the R&M application for a Fireworks stand. Motion carried (4-0)

Discussion and possible action on Dane County Proposal for Comprehensive Plan: Clark explained that Dane County Representative Curt Kodl prepared a proposal for assisting the town with updating the Comprehensive plan. Dane County has assisted many other municipalities with updating or rewriting their comprehensive plans. The cost can range \$5,000 to \$7,000 since staff hours are estimated. To have a consulting firm do this would cost much more. Motion by Ruegsegger, second by Hoege to approve estimated cost proposal and schedule to work with Dane County. Motion carried (4-0)
