Dear Clerk/Treasurer Luanne Rady,

As a responsible operator with people who live and work in the communities we serve, nothing matters to us more than safety. We recognize that an unplanned release of gas on December 25, 2025, that resulted in the precautionary evacuation of residents was both inconvenient and unsettling, and we want to provide information to help address your questions.

Late that evening, we responded to a report of a natural gas release at TC Energy's Kewaskum Compressor Station in the Town of Scott. We contained the release within the facility's fenceline, and gas vented safely into the atmosphere as designed. The release was stopped within an hour. Out of an abundance of caution, local officials evacuated sixty-three residents in the area.

The release was caused by a communications error in a recently upgraded system that allowed venting to continue longer than the designed five-minute limit. We have corrected this error, and the facility has returned to normal operations. We apologize for the disruption and inconvenience caused, particularly during the holiday season, and thank local first responders and the community for their cooperation. We are scheduling additional training with local fire departments to improve future engagement and coordination.

We'd also like to provide information about an unrelated earlier third-party-related incident. On November 14, 2025, TC Energy was notified of damage to its pipeline caused by a third-party conducting activity unrelated to TC Energy. The damage resulted in a release of gas nearby in the Town of Mitchell. Upon further investigation, it was determined the incident was caused by heavy equipment operated by an external party installing fiber optic cable. This external party is not affiliated with or contracted with TC Energy.

Compressor stations are designed to be remotely operated in a safe and efficient manner. Several systems are built into compressor stations to ensure the safety of the community, our employees, the environment and the facility. Our pipeline systems (including the Kewaskum CS) are monitored 24 hours a day, 365 days a year by trained operators in our Operations Control Center. Our industry-leading asset integrity programs manage our pipelines and facilities for their entire life cycle to provide safe and reliable energy to consumers in Wisconsin and throughout North America. We currently operate eight compressor stations in Wisconsin and hundreds of additional stations across the U.S. and North America, connecting the critical natural gas supply that communities rely on.

We have a dedicated Emergency Preparedness and Response team on call at all times to quickly and effectively respond to emergencies and mitigate any potential impacts to public safety, property or the environment. We are ready to respond safely and effectively to any incident in partnership with local first responder agencies along with regional and national authorities. On the night of the December 25, 2025, incident, local technicians were dispatched immediately upon notification, and the matter was resolved within one hour.

In the event of an emergency, anyone may contact TC Energy's 24-hour emergency line at 1-800-447-8066. This is the most effective number for a point of contact to ensure that all relevant TC Energy personnel are notified of the incident and dispatched in the fastest manner.


