

VILLAGE OF AUGUSTA

ORDINANCE NO. 80

ADOPTED: May 10th, 1965

EFFECTIVE: May 30th, 1965.

An Ordinance to prohibit racing and exhibition driving within the Village of Augusta, Michigan, to set penalties for the violation of this Ordinance, and to repeal any Ordinances or parts of any Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance.

THE VILLAGE OF AUGUSTA, KALAMAZOO COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

Section 1. Any person who engages in any motor vehicle race, drag race or the exhibition of speed or acceleration on any public street, or aids or abets another so to do, whether or not the authorized speed limit is exceeded, and whether or not conditions of competition exist, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 2. Penalties for Violation. Any person, or persons, who violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment in a County Jail for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or sub-section is declared void or inoperable for any reason, it shall not affect any other part or portion thereof.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect on the 30th day of May, 1965.
