

VILLAGE OF AUGUSTA

ORDINANCE NO. 96Adopted: *November 18, 1967*Effective: *December 4, 1967*

An Ordinance to repeal Ordinance No. 41; to require a license for the purpose of hawking, peddling, soliciting, or otherwise attempting to obtain orders for any goods or merchandise within the Village of Augusta and to set the fees for such license, as well as penalty for violations.

THE VILLAGE OF AUGUSTA, KALAMAZOO COUNTY, MICHIGAN,

ORDAINS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 41, enacted on the 9th day of March, 1926, pertaining to licensing and regulating hawkers and peddlers, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 2. License Required. No person, persons, firm or corporation, shall engage in the business of hawking, peddling, or soliciting orders for any goods or merchandise without first obtaining a license therefore. No such license shall be granted except upon certification of the Chief of Police. The fee for such license shall be as follows: \$3.00 per day per person, provided that a license for a period of three days shall be at the rate of \$6.00. Each additional day beyond the three day period shall be at the rate of \$3.00 per day. A yearly license for a firm, person or corporation may be secured at a fee of \$50.

Section 3. Fixed Stands Prohibited. No licensee shall stop or remain in any one place, upon any street, alley, or public place longer than necessary to make a sale to a customer wishing to buy.

Section 4. Practices Prohibited. No person, whether licensed or not, shall shout or cry out his or her goods or merchandise, nor blow any horns, ring any bell, or use any similar

devises or methods to attract the attention of the public for the purpose of calling attention to the sale of any goods or merchandise.

Section 5. Exempt Persons. This ordinance shall not apply to any farmers or truck gardeners selling or offering for sale any products grown, raised or produced by them, or to any person under 18 years of age when engaged in peddling, selling, or soliciting in the neighborhood of his residence on foot under the direct supervision of any school, like organization, or recognized charitable or religious organization.

Section 6. Penalty. Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not more than \$100 or not more than 90 days imprisonment, or shall have both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the Court.

Section 7. Any Ordinance or part of an ordinance in conflict herewith is herewith repealed.

Section 8. Severability. The provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or subsection is declared void or inoperable for any reason, it shall not affect any other part or portion thereof.
