TOWN OF SPRING PRAIRIE

CHAPTER XX

PARKING

SECTION 20.00. <u>Official Parking Restrictions</u>. Areas of motor vehicle prohibition and parking restriction on Town roads shall be shown on an official listing or map on file in the office of the Town Clerk, which listing or map is adopted as part of this section. Failure to observe the restriction shown on such listing or map shall be a violation of this Chapter. The Town Board may, from time to time, make additions to or deletions from such listing or map by formal resolution.

SECTION 20.10. <u>Winter Parking Restrictions</u>. No person shall park a motor vehicle on any of the following Town roads during any period of time commencing with a snow accumulation in excess of two inches (2") until 11:59 p.m. on the second calendar day following such snowfall: East Lakeshore, West Lakeshore, Old County DD and Old County D.

SECTION 20.20. Violation of Parking Restrictions.

- 20.21. Forfeiture. Any person who receives a notice from a Town official that he has violated any of the provisions of this Chapter may, within five (5) days of the date when such notice was given to such person or attached to his motor vehicle, pay to the Town Clerk-Treasurer a forfeiture of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for the parking violation, as a penalty for and in full satisfaction of such violation. Each additional day of violation after the first day during which such violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense and violation.
- 20.22. <u>Penalty</u>. Any person who fails to make such payment or payments within the five (5) day period shall be mailed a "Final Notice of Payment Due" which increases the penalty for late payment to forfeiture of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00).
- 20.23. <u>Penalty on Conviction</u>. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Chapter and fails to pay the forfeiture as set forth in Sections 20.21 or 20.22 above shall, upon conviction, pay a fine of no more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and the prosecution cost.

SECTION 20.30. Removal of Illegally Parked Vehicles. In the event a vehicle remains illegally parked for more than a 24-hour period without being moved, or in an emergency, or to facilitate snow removal, any Town official so authorized or a Walworth County Deputy may cause to be removed any vehicle parked in

violation of the restrictions contained herein or shown on the official traffic listing or map. The cost of such removal and vehicle storage shall be charged to the owner of the vehicle in addition to any forfeiture imposed as a penalty.

SECTION 20.40. <u>Sign Control</u>. The Town Board shall cause to be erected or installed all regulatory signs and road markings necessary to give notice of the parking prohibitions and restrictions provided for by this Chapter.
