


City of Highland Haven Updates – March 2025 City Hall Changes

- Our City Secretary, **Lezley Baum**, retired on Jan. 23 after five years of dedicated service. She will remain in Highland Haven and may consult when available.
- The Board of Aldermen approved hiring Sarah Collard as the new City Secretary, effective Feb. 15. Her first day in the office was Feb. 18. Please stop by to welcome her to the City.

Municipal Elections

- The City of Highland Haven received candidate filings from only the three incumbents for the three available Alderman positions. The incumbents are Bruce Robertson, Lynn Smith and Terry Smith.
- Since each position is unopposed, the city is not required to hold an election, in accordance with





- The Board of Aldermen recently passed **Resolution 364**, outlining the city's legislative priorities for the **89th Texas Legislature**. This resolution details the city's stance on proposed legislation and emphasizes the importance of **decisions made by local elected officials.** Resolution 364
- Highland Haven supports legislation that preserves the authority of local elected officials to govern our
 community, rather than having those powers preempted by state laws. While some bills may be aimed at
 addressing issues in larger cities, they often have unintended consequences that negatively impact smaller
 communities like ours.
- Residents are encouraged to stay informed and engage with state lawmakers by writing letters/emails to our representative and senator. Protecting Our Water System: Proper Use of Shut-Off Valves

- Each home in Highland Haven has a **city-owned water shut-off valve (curb stop)**, but residents should **never use this valve** to turn off water to their home. Instead, homeowners should use their **customer-side shut-off valve**, typically located past or in the meter box.
- The city's shut-off valves are **designed for infrequent use**, primarily for **city technicians to use for meter repairs**. Improper use can cause damage, leading to costly repairs and water outages for surrounding homes. Recently, a city valve was broken by a customer, resulting in an unexpected 2-hour service interruption while repairs were made.
- To help maintain our water system, please use your homeowner shut-off valve when necessary. If you have trouble locating it or need assistance, contact City Hall. Any damage to the city's infrastructure caused by improper use will be **billed to the party responsible**.
- Thank you for helping us keep Highland Haven's water system running smoothly!



Drought Update

- Good News! Thanks to your conservation efforts, we stayed under our reduced water limit for 2024!
- Bad News: Drought conditions persist. The 15% mandatory water reduction remains in effect through Dec. 31, 2025.
- Our groundwater permit is reduced to 69 acre-feet—please continue conserving water!

Landscape Planning

- Plan for continued drought—70% of residential water use goes to landscaping!
- Use native, drought-resistant plants & check these resources:
 - o <u>Lawn & Landscape Tips</u>
 - o Tree Planting Guide
- Trim tree limbs to 15 feet above streets for emergency vehicles & large trucks.

Comprehensive Plan/Survey Update

- The Planning and Zoning commission is updating Highland Haven's Comprehensive Plan, the document (required by state law) that helps guide how we manage and grow our city.
- The first step? Hearing from you! On January 13, we sent out a community survey, and we're thrilled to have already received over 100 responses—thank you to everyone who has participated!




