Water System

- Good News!! Our 2023 water conservation efforts paid off and we kept the volume of water pumped from our aquifer below the 15% mandatory reduction restriction!
- Bad News! We have received insufficient rain to improve area aquifers. On December 15, 2023, the Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District voted to continue the 15% MANDATORY Drought Water Reductions for all exempt and non-exempt water wells. The MANDATORY reductions are effective January 1 through December 31, 2024. https://www.centraltexasgcd.org/drought-status/
- The City of Highland Haven groundwater permit is reduced from 82-acre feet to 69-acre feet; therefore, all Highland Haven water customers are required to continue their efforts to reduce water use.

Landscape Planning

- This is the time of the year to start landscape planning. Property owners and residents should plan for continuing drought conditions. 70% of all residential water use is for watering landscaping. Review watering requirements for any new or replacement lawns and landscaping. Consider using plants and trees native to our area. Research water requirements as you plan for new landscaping plants. - Please check and make sure your tree limbs are trimmed back to provide a minimum clearance of 15' above streets to accommodate emergency vehicles, trash trucks and RV's.

Eclipse Planning

- A solar eclipse will occur on April 8, 2024. Burnet County is in the path of the eclipse. State and local governments have been planning for this event and reviewed actions of other areas of the country impacted by past eclipse events.

- We anticipate a <u>very large</u> number of visitors to travel to Burnet County to watch the eclipse. This large number of visitors will impact traffic, restaurants, food stores and fuel stations. Additionally, cell phone and computer services may be impacted.
- Visitors may arrive several days prior to the event and stay a few days after. It is anticipated that many visitors will drive in for the day to view the eclipse which may lead to significantly more traffic on area highways and roads.
- Residents will need to prepare well in advance for this event by scheduling travel plans, doctor appointments and shopping activities around this event. Below are links to more information.


