Board of Alderman

- The Board and staff have been working on the FY23-24 budget at regular meetings and budget work sessions for the past 2 months. A public hearing will be posted in the coming weeks. The property tax rate is currently proposed to remain at .126 per \$100 valuation. This will support hiring a city administrator, a 5% cost of living increase for the staff and cover general fund operating expenses.
- Base water rates are proposed to increase 5% and additional fee tiers have been added for water use above base rates. The proposed water rates are comparable to area water systems and are necessary to cover operating expenses and fund repair/replacement of critical system components such as a new backup generator and pumping equipment.
- Building permit fees are proposed to increase to cover building permit operating expenses.
- Next BOA meeting is <u>Wednesday</u> 7pm, July 5th. The BOA is scheduled for a budget work session at 9am July 11th.
- BOA meetings and work sessions are open to the public and held in the Community Center.

Accidents on Hwy 1431

- **Jackie Garrow**, has organized a mail campaign to ask TXDOT to;
 - o Install a stop light at Highland Drive and Hwy1431, and,
 - o Reduce speed limits between Kingsland and Granite Shoals.
- Last month there were 3 serious accidents in 10 days, 2 in front of Twin Isles and 1 between Shady Acres and Granite Shoals.

Fire Safety

- Use of fireworks in Highland Haven is prohibited. Please advise your family and guests.
- Remove all brush and lawn trimmings stacked on your property as soon as possible.

 A burn ban could be implemented soon due to the hot dry weather we are experiencing.
- Be sure to follow the requirements in our ordinances regarding outdoor burning.

Water Conservation

- Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District (CTGCD) held their monthly meeting on June 16, 2023, and confirmed Burnet County is STILL in the Stage 4 Critical Drought Stage and further confirmed the 15% MANDATORY Drought Water Reductions are to remain in place. https://www.centraltexasgcd.org/
- We need everyone's assistance with conserving water to help us avoid any penalties for pumping too much water from the aquafer. Our CTGCD permit has been reduced by 15%-to-69-acre feet. Last year we pumped well above our normal permit level (82-acre feet) which could lead to CTGCD penalty fees this year.

Water System

- The construction project for 2 new storage tanks has been advertised and the bid opening is scheduled for June 30. This will replace the current tank which has corrosion issues and provide a second tank that will provide backup and supply for future fire improvements.

- Our water wells remain in good shape; however, we must reduce our monthly water use to comply with the Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District mandatory reductions.

Lawn Maintenance

- We are receiving complaints about high grass. Please mow your property as soon as possible.
- With the high heat and no rain, we can expect a burn ban to be implemented any day. Please make plans to remove brush piles as soon as possible to reduce fire hazards and breeding areas for rodents and snakes. Many area tree services have brush chippers that can make short work of disposing of brush piles.
- If you are planning to burn the brush, follow the requirements in Ordinance #27 re: outdoor burning and Ordinance #58 re: lawn and lot maintenance.
