## **City Elections**

There will be a city election on May 10 for Mayor and Aldermen. Along with the Mayor position, there are three Aldermen positions open, two each for a two-year term and one for a one-year term. Applications will be received from January 29 through February 28. Applications can be obtained from City Secretary Dana Turner at City Hall. Please consider serving your city as Mayor or on the Board of Aldermen.

### **Granite Shoals Emergency Siren Testing**

Granite Shoals will test their emergency siren every Tuesday at noon. This may be heard in some parts of Highland Haven.

#### **Fund Raising Fish Fry**

A fish fry will be held at the Bluebonnet Café in Marble Falls on March 5 from 4 to 8 PM. Proceeds from the fish fry will go to the Marble Falls EMS that serves Highland Haven.

#### **Financial Audit**

Keith Neffendorf of Neffendorf CPA associates of Fredericksburg presented the annual financial audit to the Board of Aldermen on Tuesday, February 18. Mr. Neffendorf reported that the city is in good financial shape and found the city financial records in good order. He particularly noted the positive results to date of the purchase of the water system.

To date the water system has produced a net income after all expenses including bond principal and interest payments of \$116,565.86. At the end of fiscal year 2013 on September 30, 2013 there was a city cash balance in the bank, including water system accounts, of \$195,701.15.

The audit report is available for review at city hall.

#### **EMS Contract Renewal**

The city contract with Marble Falls EMS was renewed through 2015. The annual cost is \$10,080, which has not changed since 2004. There were 41 EMS ambulance calls in

Highland Haven in fiscal year 2013. The response time for 75% of the calls was in eight minutes or less. The longer response times would mostly occur when the Granite Shoals ambulance is out on a call and response to Highland Haven would come from Marble Falls or elsewhere.

The HHPOA Board of Directors held their February Biannual membership meeting on the 11<sup>th</sup> at the community center. There were approximately 30 members in attendance. We had several last minute guest speakers arrive that were candidates for the upcoming Burnet County elections. Special thanks to Dan Varick, Bill Passmore and Andi Ball for all their work on the Nominating Committee.

The newly elected directors will be replacing board directors Jim Garrow, Rod Goergen and I.

**Jim Garrow** has been a director for 4 years and was the boat trailer storage coordinator. He worked endlessly reorganizing the storage facility and meeting the member's requests for available spaces. He was faced with seeking compliance or enforcing violations which was not an easy job but it was all for the good of the membership and we all benefited. I personally want to thank him for all that work which leaves the upcoming coordinator a clear path to running the facility.

**Rod Goergen** served 2 years as a director and was tasked with the Community Center Coordinator position. He is a fine example why it is important to get new directors on the board. Rod found several overdue repairs needed on the center and spent numerous hours researching and organizing the center projects and doing several repairs himself. Thank you Rod for your commitment and hard work.

# LET'S TALK ABOUT FLOODS (Cont'd)- A LITTLE HITORY

In January I covered floods that have affected our area beginning in 1991 and continuing to February, 1997. This is a continuation of that article.

On June 21, 1997, major flooding passed down the James River and South Fork Llano Rivers into the Llano mainstream above Mason. Many homes flooded along the Llano River. The water treatment plant in Llano flooded to the roof, putting the town without water several days. In Kingsland, docks, boats, jet skis, house boats, anything near the river washed downstream. Homes, apartments and recreation resorts were damaged severely. Kingsland Lodge again had a duplex washed away and destroyed. Downstream in Marble Falls, the Colorado River/Lake Marble Falls backed up Backbone Creek flooding 35 homes.

It is said that periods of extreme draught are followed by severe floods. Highland Haven is lucky to have not yet had a 100-yr flood to date. Hopefully we will be prepared when that day happens.
