City Elections

There will be a city election on <u>May 10 for Mayor and Aldermen</u>. Alderwoman Irene Dauphin and resident Lynn Sheffield have filed for the position of Mayor. Residents Olan Kelley and Bill Passmore and Alderwoman Betty Ward have filed for a two-year term for city alderman. Resident Charles Webb has filed for a one-year term for city alderman.

<u>Early voting will be from April 28 to May 6</u> at both the Burnet County Court House in Burnet and at the Marble Falls Court House Annex on Highway 281 South in Marble Falls.

Election Day Voting on May 10 is at the Highland Haven Community Center from 7 AM to 7 PM.

Rain Harvesting & Drought Resistant Plants

Residence Lawn Mowing

Lawns (and weeds too) have begun to grow rapidly with the warmer weather. Residents are requested to make arrangements to have lawns mowed once per week to maintain our beautiful city. Once every ten days or two weeks is not often enough.

Burn Ban Off

The burn ban has been lifted in conjunction with the Burnet County burn ban lifting.

Drought Restrictions

Highland Haven, LCRA and Central Texas Groundwater Control District drought restrictions continue. Please limit irrigation system operation to once per week. Hand watering may be performed at any time. Our reservoirs, Lake Buchanan & Lake Travis, are down to only 37% capacity with no relief in sight.

Vacant Lot Mowing Program

The city vacant lot mowing program will begin soon. Letters have been sent out to vacant lot owners inviting them to participate in this program that helps keep our city looking good. Lots are mowed when vegetation grows to sixteen inches. This is a very good program particularly for absentee owners. If interested, please call City Hall at 830 265-4366.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

CERT is a training program that prepares you to help yourself, your family and your neighbors in the event of a disaster when emergency personnel may not be able to reach everyone right away. This is an 8-week course on Thursday evenings from 7 to 9:30 pm starting May 1st at the Freedom Flyers, 3202 US 281 in Burnet. FLOODPLAIN TIDBITS

During the past several Alderman meetings, the idea of creating our own community FEMA Flood Plain Levels have been thoroughly discussed, pondered and discussed again. Brought on by purchase of a lot in the Zone "A" area made us all too aware that this area needs to be resolved. Surveying techniques between two local companies resulted in a 4.5' BFE disparity on the exact same lot.

When Sunrise Beach had the Big Sandy Flood several of the homes were destroyed or had severe water damage. That act resulted in the community being able to ascertain flood heights of their waterfront boundaries that allowed them to set their own flood plain levels. Surveyors state in their Elevation Certificates that the Floodplain Level has been determined by the Community.

The issue as to which elevation to use has been resolved by the insurance company that requested a "submit for bid" for insurance purposes through NFIP with the homeowners basically splitting the disparity of the two heights and adding our two foot required freeboard. In the meantime and with a new slate of Alderman plus Mayor coming up shortly, the process was basically tabled / resolved enough to let the future group determine if this is something we should address. We are still awaiting information about a possible 25/75 grant from FEMA that would resolve the "Zone A" issues for us.

The Morgan's began their marriage during the trying times of World War II. Shortly after their wedding, Milton was deployed overseas to Europe to serve with the Infantry Unit Command 3rd Army Headquarters. This was the first of many assignments around

In 1955, they became the proud parents of one son, Tommy, who, over the years, learned and respected Army life. During their thirty one years with the Army, Norma had to pack the family and move twenty five times during Milton's career.
