2015 Budget & Tax Rate

The Board of Aldermen approved the fiscal year 2015 budget (Oct 1, 2014 – Sep 30, 2015) and the tax rate for the 2014 property taxes due in January 2015. The budget calls for balance with an income of \$341,599.66 and expenditures of \$339,264.50. The budget includes both city and water system income and expenses.

The tax rate remains the same 11.25 cents per \$100. The tax rate will result in a tax increase of \$1.50 for a property valued at \$100,000.

As previously noted, we now pay an equal amount for fire protection services as Granite Shoals taxpayers based on property valuation. We pay Granite Shoals Fire Department \$68,291.00 and Marble Falls EMS \$10,080.00. As you can see this is approximately \$80,000 of our budget. It is imperative that we keep Highland Haven safe and protected.

If you are going to build something, please get your building permit first. If you have a question, please call the office.

Emergency Preparedness

The Lone Star State encounters at least one major disaster nearly every calendar year. We regularly face floods, wildfires, tornadoes, hurricanes and other severe weather. It is time to get prepared.

I encourage everyone to assemble a disaster supply kit of important emergency supplies including a first aid kit, a battery operated radio, flashlight, medication, non-perishable food items, and bottled water. Be aware of where the nearest storm shelter is located, know where you and loved ones will go if an evacuation is necessary, and develop an emergency plan for communicating with family and friends.

Parking on grass

Please keep vehicles, boats, and trailers on paved areas at your homes.

Septic Test Holes

If you are going to dig septic test holes, it requires a permit.

Street Maintenance

We invited the road supervisor with precinct one to drive the roads in Highland Haven. From his recommendation, we only had them chip and seal a few roads this year. The same crew replaced drainage pipes on Lark and Robin. We will continue to monitor the streets and drainage pipes and appreciate you keeping us informed when you see an area that is of concern to you.

Those voting members unable to attend the meeting are asked to complete the following proxy and return it **prior to October 14, 2014**. Proxies can be mailed to the HHPOA at 510-B Highland Drive, Highland Haven, Texas 78654. Your representative can also bring the proxy to the membership meeting if you prefer.

The members of the Association shall be all persons who are 21 years of age or older and who own a minimum of one (1) full lot, or a residence, located within the city limits of the City of Highland Haven. Each owner, or joint owners of one lot or more, shall be entitled to only one vote among them, irrespective of the number or residences or lots owned within the city limits of the City of Highland Haven.
