Ordinance 58 has been revised to prohibit the blowing or otherwise causing leaves and grass to be disposed of in the lake, canals, city streets or drainage infrastructure. Leaves and grass clippings should be mulched or otherwise gathered and disposed of but not blown into the street, lake or drains.

New Landscaping at City Hall

Parking in yards – Please make sure your boats/trailers/vehicles are parked correctly to comply with Ordinance 59

Ordinance 59 states:

- A. Parking of vehicles and trailers of any type in front yards except on the driveway is prohibited.
- B. Parking in side and back yards is prohibited except on hard surfaced pad or behind screening fence of six-foot height which blocks view from all streets and neighboring property. Such parking is limited to two vehicles or trailers or one combination thereof.

Permits

If you are having a new septic system put in, you need a permit from **LCRA** and the City of Highland Haven. You also need a permit to construct a fence on your property. Before beginning any work on your property, please call City Hall to see if you need a permit.

Planning and Zoning Commission

Resident Lawn Care

Lawn care by a significant number of our part time residents leaves much to be desired. More than a few non-residents only mow their lawns from time to time rather than on a weekly basis that is necessary during the growing season from March through October. Weeds that are often dispersed in lawn turfs grow as much as a foot per week when rain or irrigation is present. This past week many lawns had weeds two to three feet high. City Ordinance 058 requires that lawns be maintained at no more than six inches.

Please consider that routine lawn maintenance is a necessary expense in owning a residence in Highland Haven. It is simply unacceptable to mow your lawn when you visit from time to time or wait for a neighbor or the city to complain. Please also consider your fulltime resident neighbors who must look at these unkempt lawns every day. There are many lawn care services available. Please utilize these services to keep your lawns in a routine week-to-week presentable condition. Your city and neighbors will appreciate it.

Trash cans

Please place your trash bins at least 4 feet from any other object. This includes recycle bins, other trash cans, and mailboxes. The driver is trying not to knock over your recycle bins but if they are too close to the trash bin, it happens. Also, please place your bin at the edge of the street pavement to keep the truck from driving over the water line.

FLOODPLAIN TIDBITS

Mitigation is the act of reducing the severity, seriousness, or painfulness of something. We hear a lot more about it now than we used to for sure. How would you mitigate a flood in our area? There is a lot a homeowner can do. Make a list of your most valuable possessions, know where your bank information is, names and addresses and phone numbers of loved ones, names and addresses of creditors, names and addresses of your utility company. Stand in the middle of each room and take a picture of all four sides so you can remember where each thing is. Put your pictures on a hard drive or something to give to a family member in a different location. Take pictures of the outside of your home on all sides, boathouse and boathouse interior, shed and shed interior, everything. It might come in handy during some type of flood event.

Always keep a couple of gallons of water on site. Have a NOAA weather radio and know how to use it. Don't wait for the event to happen. Some units need batteries. Talk to your immediate family about where to meet if we are forced to leave and if we are asked to leave our homes, obey the instructions.
