CAPCOG Emergency Notification System

The CAPCOG – Capital Area Council of Governments has added cell phone notifications to its emergency notification system. This system notifies subscribers of severe weather, flooding, dam floodgate operations etc. The signup process is very simple. Become a Master Gardener and Make a Difference in the Community!

The Highland Lakes Master Gardener Association is accepting applications for its 2015 class. The **deadline is Saturday, January 31, 2015** and the class will begin on Tuesday, February 17. This 13-week certification program sponsored by the Texas A&M Agrilife Extension Service provides a comprehensive background in horticultural principles and practices with an emphasis on conservation and sustainability. Equally important to Master Gardeners, however is service to the community. Class members must be committed to attend ALL classes to finish this course, volunteer in the community for 50 hours and complete 10 hours of continuing education.

The cost of the program is \$180 which includes resource materials, a t-shirt, and field trip admissions.
