City Elections

City Elections are scheduled for May 6, for 4 Aldermen positions. Applications can be obtained at City Hall. Applications must be submitted to the City Secretary between January 18 and February 17.

Board of Alderman

- The Planning and Zoning Commission and the Board of Alderman have reviewed and updated a number of City Ordinances in the past few months. Updated versions will be uploaded to the website soon for the following ordinances.

City Hall Staff Changes

- Stop by when you get a chance to introduce yourself and welcome our **new City Secretary**, **Jeannie Gruetzner**.
- Be sure to thank **Dana Turner**, our outgoing City Secretary, for her 8+ years of service. Dana is leaving at the end of February and will be missed.

HH Water System

- New water rates are now in effect.
- Many water customers are opting to "pre-pay" their water bills, especially our weekend property owners. This saves the Water System data entry costs and helps property owners avoid any late fees because they forgot to pay their bill. Water bills are still sent and it will show your balance.

Channel Cleanup/Waste Management

- We have received number of complaints about folks dumping trash in the dumpsters/trailers provided for construction projects. Construction dumpsters are private property. Do not dispose of trash in them without permission.
- Disposal of trash and debris from waterfront cleanup is the responsibility of the property owner.
- A number of residents have inquired as to whether the City will remove and dispose of tires found in the channels. The underwater land in the channels is private property and cleanup is the responsibility of property owners. Residents might consider contacting a lake dredging or lot maintenance company if you need assistance with debris removal.
- It is illegal to dump tires and other such items into the lake. If you observe dumping please use this web link to report it to LCRA http://www.lcra.org/water/quality/Pages/report-illegal-dumping.aspx

Streets and Drainage

- Check drainage around your property and clear any potential blockage to avoid flooding.
- Be sure to clean leaves from roof rain gutters as well as drainage ditches around your property.

Planning and Zoning

- P&Z and the BOA are currently reviewing several ordinances for updates. Watch future agendas for public hearing dates

Fire Safety

- The Burn Ban has been lifted. All brush piles should be removed as soon as possible. If property owners cannot burn the brush piles, they must make arrangements to have the brush removed. Some property owners arrange to have brush chipped and hauled away instead of burning.
- Burning of construction material and trash is prohibited.

Regional Notification System (Emergency Notification System)

- Capitol Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) Regional Notification System (RNS) uses a "reverse dialing" method to notify residents in the 10-county region of critical emergency information in situations where property or human life are in danger. It also can be used to notify residents of other events that affect them.

- Starting a project before receiving a building permit will result in a "Stop Work Order", higher fees and possible removal of your project.

- We have received complaints about construction activity occurring during "quiet time" in the City. Construction activity is restricted to Monday-Saturday 7am-7pm. Please pass along this information to all contractors you may be using.
