From the report February 2018 ...

We performed an audit of the Financial Statements of HHPOA for year ended December 31, 2017. We found the financial statements to be free of any material misstatements. We found the records to be well organized, well documented and extremely accurate. We commend the board members for maintaining the HHPOA financial records with such professionalism.

Pet and Resident Safety

- A number of rabies cases have been reported in Burnet County. Please check and confirm your pet's rabies vaccinations are up to date.
- One resident has reported that unattended outdoor pet food will attract wild animals and may expose your pet to wild animals that might carry rabies and other diseases.
- Reduce nesting areas for snakes, skunks and possums by hauling away any brush and leaves stored on your property. Warmer weather also means snakes and other pests are starting to move about and brush piles provide great nesting areas.
- There have been several reports of snake bites in Burnet County in the past few weeks.

Fire Safety/Yard Cleanup

- Contact the Burnet County Sheriff's Office and the Granite Shoals Fire Dept. before starting any outdoor fires. Their phone numbers can found on the first page of the Highland Haven Directory.
- Red Flag Warnings Burnet County prohibits any outdoor burning on days when the National Weather Service issues Red Flag Warnings.

- Burnet County is one of many counties recently included in a drought disaster declaration by the Governor.
- Burnet County Commissioners will be considering a burn ban next week at their meeting. Watch our Burn Ban sign at the entrance to Highland Haven or check the Burnet County website for Burn Ban status at http://www.burnetcountytexas.org/page/environ.burn
- Recently there was a devastating fire that <u>completely consumed a waterfront home</u> in Granite Shoals. The home had recently been completely remodeled. The smoke detectors installed in the house woke a sleeping resident and gave him just enough time to escape with minor injuries. Granite Shoals Fire Chief Austin Stanphill strongly urges all residents to check their smoke detectors, change batteries and contact the Fire Dept. if you need assistance with installing smoke detectors.
- Construction materials such as boards and plywood cannot be disposed of by burning.
- Please cleanup any brush and leaf piles to reduce fire hazards.
- Do not use the lake for dumping anything, including leaves and grass clippings.
- Granite Shoals Fire Dept. needs volunteer firefighters and non-emergency auxiliary staff. Call Chief Austin Stanphill at 830-596-8110 for more information.

Board of Alderman

- The City of Highland Haven recently sent out a residential garbage service survey. Property owners and residents should have received it by now. It was sent out using the same method and addresses we use for the newsletter (email or U.S. Mail). Please complete and return the survey to City Hall as soon as possible. If you did not receive a survey you can pick one up from the City Office. Deadline is Friday, April 27.

Streets and Storm Water Drainage

- Check drainage around your property and clear any potential blockage to avoid flooding.
- Be sure to clean leaves from roof rain gutters.
- Clear driveway drainage pipes and maintain drainage ditches around your property.

HH Water System

- Please help our meter readers by trimming shrubs and grass from around water meters. They too do not like to fight through brush and encounter snakes to read a meter.
- Protecting our drinking water is everyone's responsibility. TCEQ requires municipal water systems to monitor and guard against any cross connection with other water sources such as wells and lake irrigation systems. Please help us keep our water safe by checking your water systems to make sure there are no cross connections. If you need assistance call City Hall.

Traffic Safety

- Carts operated at night and during low light periods must have and use head and tail lights.
- All carts must be equipped with a reflective triangular "slow moving vehicle" sign.
- Only licensed drivers can operate motorized vehicles on City streets.

Highland Haven Ordinances/Building Permits - http://www.highlandhaventx.com/

- Please help us by reminding your contractors that both the **property owner** <u>and</u> the contractor named in the permit application are responsible for the following:
 - o Parking by the tradesmen and workers is restricted to the property that is the location of the building or construction. No parking on neighboring properties is allowed without the consent of the neighbors.
 - Workers must adhere to the work hours of 7AM to 7PM Monday through Saturday, no work allowed on Sunday.
 - O Building setbacks included in our City ordinances are the minimum distances that must be maintained between the <u>surveyed property line and any part of a building, including eaves, overhangs, or other projections</u> on the façade. This should be kept in mind by the owner and contractor when planning the location of slabs or foundations.
- Please review our ordinances before starting <u>any</u> additions or construction projects on land or water (including floating Jet Ski docks and fences).
- Starting a project before receiving a building permit will result in a "Stop Work Order", higher permit fees and possible removal of your project.

RESIDENTIAL WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICES SURVEY

Due to recent changes in residential garbage services and rates, many residents have contacted the City of Highland Haven concerning these changes and asking for assistance. Residents have indicated they would like to see the following issues addressed:

- 1. Re-establish a recycling program
- 2. Establish a long-term contract with consistent rates
- 3. Contract with one garbage service to lessen truck traffic on our streets

In response to these inquiries, the City is investigating the option of contracting with a single residential waste management service for our community. Therefore, input from property owners & residents is important so we can understand what direction needs to be taken.

A survey with 11 questions was sent to property owners and residents using the same method and addresses we use for the newsletter (email or U.S. Mail).
