# **Parking**

- This past month we received many complaints about parking.
  - o Do not use a neighbor's carport or driveway without getting their permission.
  - o Do not use the HHPOA R/V and Trailer Storage areas without getting their permission.
- Temporary parking is allowed on the street rights-of-way; however, the streets must remain open to <u>allow</u> <u>clear passage of emergency vehicles and trash trucks.</u>
- Travel trailers can be temporarily parked in driveways.
- Vehicles and trailers cannot be parked in yards (front and/or back).
- Residents and property owners should discuss with their neighbors any special events planned that may impact the use of their property.

  - Do not blow lawn clippings or leaves into the water. This debris is blown downwind to you neighbors.
  - Property owners are responsible for the actions of their lawn contractors. Pass along these restriction to your contractors.

# **Building Permits**

- Construction and remodeling activities continue to be high in our community. Our building permit officer position is vacant, so we ask for your patience as our staff process these permits.
- The Building Permit Officer position has been filled by an Alderman volunteer; however, the time requirements for managing this program have increased significantly. The Board is considering how to best manage this program, which may include hiring a part time person.

# **Fire Safety**

- Hot and dry summer weather is here. Be careful with outdoor fires.
- <u>Contact Granite Shoals Fire Dept. and the Burnet County Sheriff's Office prior to starting any outdoor fires.</u>
- See Ordinance #27. Outdoor fires must be,
  - o a minimum of 50' from any structure
  - o continually monitored with water readily available to control the fire, and,
  - o completely out by sundown.
- Be kind to your neighbors and manage your burning to reduce producing smoke.

# **Public Safety/Street Maintenance**

- The Board of Alderman recently approved changing the citywide speed limit to 25mph. We will be ordering signs and working with the County to change speed limit signs on Highland Drive. Watch for the change coming soon.

- Summer and hot weather is here! Conserve water use in and around your home.
- No matter your water source, please follow the LCRA lawn watering schedule for irrigating your lawn and gardens
  - o Wednesdays and Saturdays for addresses ending in odd numbers.
  - o Thursdays and Sundays for addresses ending in even numbers.
  - o Hours: Midnight to 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. to midnight.
- We are currently updating our Drought Contingency Plan watch for changes in the future. TCEQ requires all water systems to file a Drought Contingency Plan.

# **Trees and Shrubs**

- Property owners are required to trim shrubbery, especially at street intersections and on right of ways. There are several intersections where bushes are now blocking the view of on-coming traffic.
