Board of Alderman

- The Board of Alderman has finalized the budget for next year. A public hearing for the budget was held on August 2nd and we had a great citizen turnout. The Board took the comments from the public hearing and adjusted the budget to address resident concerns at a budget workshop on August 12th. The Board adopted

- the budget on August 16 and adopted the tax rate of 1260 per 100 valuation on August 23rd. This is the same tax rate as last year.
- This budget includes funding for a staff cost of living increase and the phase-in of a city administrator. These increases will help us retain staff and provide our community with a city administrator to manage day to day operations and manage the water system. Water fees were increased by 3% which will help us fund continued improvements to our system. The adopted budget can be viewed online at:

- The adopted budget is also posted on the bulletin board behind City Hall.
- Our fire contract with Granite Shoals will remain at \$85,000 for next year. G.S. Fire and Marble Falls Area EMS contracts currently require approximately one half of our total city property tax collection.
- City staff continues to work on our codification project (reformatting ordinances), as well as, transitioning to a new accounting program.
- Next BOA meeting is 7pm, September 6th. BOA meetings are open to the public. Residents and property owners are encouraged to attend.
- BOA meetings are held in the Community Center.

Water System

- We are still in Stage 4 CRITICAL drought conditions. Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District moved into Stage 4 CRITICAL drought conditions effective June 13th. Stage 4 is the highest out of a total of four stages. Stage 4 calls for voluntary conservation of groundwater by 30 percent. Our water system is permitted by Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District.
- Our voluntary conservation efforts **have not** generated a reduction in water use.

- Highland Haven water system supply is from water wells (groundwater) so everyone should voluntarily reduce use.
- We are asking everyone to reduce their outdoor water usage and follow the LCRA lawn watering schedule below.
 - Wednesdays and Saturdays for addresses ending in odd numbers.
 - o Thursdays and Sundays for addresses ending in even numbers.
 - o Hours: Midnight to 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. to Midnight.

- If you are using lake water for irrigation, you should monitor your system and immediately remove any debris or zebra mussels to avoid pump damage.

Fire Safety

- Burnet County Burn Ban is still effective.
- Please help us keep our community safe and remove all brush piles. Whittlesey Landscaping in Granite Shoals will take brush and lawn clipping for a small fee.
- Piles of brush, limbs, leaves, and lawn clippings should be removed as soon as possible to lower the risk of an accidental fire around our homes.

Trees and Shrubs

- Property owners need to continue monitoring their trees to determine if their trees need dead limbs removed. Weekly we see tree services working in Highland Haven cutting out dead limbs or removing dead trees.
- Contact Pedernales Electric Cooperative if you have limbs that could fall and damage powerlines.

- Please check and make sure your tree limbs are trimmed back to provide a minimum clearance of 15' above streets to accommodate emergency vehicles, trash trucks and RV's.

Biannual Meeting Update



Summary of Budgeted Income vs Expenses (as of July 31, 2022)

There were several important and significant changes to our 2022 operating budget. As you are probably aware, inflation shows up everywhere. For the POA, this impact was felt most acutely for our property and liability insurance expenses. Through the efforts of several of our POA Board members, we spent a lot of time reviewing our liability coverages and property coverages. Despite our best efforts, to find the right-size coverages, our 2022 insurance expenses have TRIPLED from 2021. Insurance expenses and Repairs & Maintenance now make up nearly 60% of the POA operating budget. Here's pie showing an expense break down the 2022 POA operating budget.
