- Please vote! Highland Haven is known for its high percentage of active voters! Eligible voters have some very important decisions to make in the upcoming primary runoff elections.
 - o Early voting is open May 16-20
 - o Election Day is May 24

Water System

- Burnet County Groundwater Conservation District moved into Stage 3 drought conditions effective April 19th. Stage 3 is the second highest out of a total of four stages. <u>Stage 3 calls for voluntary conservation of groundwater by 20 percent</u>.

- Highland Haven water system supply is from water wells (groundwater) so everyone should voluntarily reduce use.
- We are asking everyone to reduce their outdoor water usage and follow the LCRA watering schedule.

Invasive zebra mussels and aquatic plant management info

- Many residents have been calling City Hall reporting invasive zebra mussels and aquatic plants. We have been in touch with LCRA and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept. and asked them for guidance as to how to manage both. Below are weblinks for more information regarding these invasive species.

- Managing these species are a responsibility of the property owners. Some neighboring property owners are coordinating their efforts around their adjacent waterfront areas to improve mitigation measures.

No Dumping in the Lake

- Please advise your neighbors, guests and lawn service companies that disposing of leaves, grass or other refuse in the lake is not allowed. It is a violation of Ordinance 58.
- According to LCRA, dumping of organic waste, such as leaves and grass, into the lake has a direct effect on water quality, and water quality is directly related to harmful algae growth.

Solid Waste Service

- The Citywide Document Shredding was a huge success we shredded over 2,500 pounds of paper.

Board of Alderman

- The Board of Alderman is working on the budget for next year. Daily the news has reported the rapid financial changes across the country. These changes will have a significant impact on our budget. Inflation is currently hovering around 9%. We don't have all the information yet for some of our critical services such as fire protection; however, below are some examples of issues we are facing.
 - o Fuel prices are affecting delivery costs for products. Chlorine, used for water treatment, is up 40%.
 - o Personnel costs are up. Many of the surrounding cities, school systems and the county are considering significant cost of living salary increases to offset the effects of inflation.
- Next BOA meeting is June 7th. BOA meetings are open to the public. Residents and property owners are encouraged to attend.
- BOA meetings are held in the Community Center.

Fire Safety

- Burnet County issued a Burn Ban effective 3/9/22. Burnet County has been in an elevated fire status for several weeks and many grass/brush fires have been reported.
- Piles of brush, limbs, leaves and lawn clippings should be removed as soon as possible to lower the risk of an accidental fire around our homes.
- Even though we have received some light precipitation recently, Burnet County remains in a drought status.

Trees and Shrubs

- Property owners need to monitor their trees over this spring to determine if their trees need dead limbs removed. Weekly we see tree services working in Highland Haven cutting out dead limbs or removing dead trees.
- Contact Pedernales Electric Cooperative if you have limbs that could fall and damage powerlines.
- Please check and make sure your tree limbs are trimmed back to provide a minimum clearance of 15' above streets to accommodate emergency vehicles, trash trucks and RV's.

Brief description of the classes

ONLINE AND EARLY VOTING in the 2022 PEC Board election is OPEN FROM MAY 18, 2022, 12:01 A.M. CDT THROUGH JUNE 10, 2022, 5:00 P.M. CDT. Vote early to be eligible to win bill credits. Winners will be announced at the Annual Membership Meeting and do not need to be present to win.

- 3 \$500 bill credits, 1st week of voting through May 25
- 5 \$250 bill credits, 2nd week of voting through June 1
- 25 \$150 bill credits, 3rd week of voting through June 8

Members must vote online or by mail (ballots have also been mailed) and can find the various methods for voting and instructions by clicking here. No in-person voting, or ballots will be accepted at PEC offices or at the Annual Membership Meeting. Board candidate information is available on both the online ballot and the mailed ballot.
