Water System

- On December 15, 2023, the Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District voted to continue the 15% MANDATORY Drought Water Reductions for <u>all exempt and non-exempt water wells</u>. <u>The MANDATORY reductions are effective January 1 through December 31, 2024</u>.

 - The City of Highland Haven groundwater permit has been reduced from 82-acre feet to 69-acre feet; therefore, all Highland Haven water customers are required to <u>continue their efforts to reduce water</u> use.
- The City of Highland Haven follows the LCRA outdoor watering schedule. <u>Effective February 21</u>, <u>LCRA reduced all outdoor watering to once a week</u>. Below is a link to the LCRA news release announcing this change.

 - Outdoor Watering Schedule
 - Saturday for addresses ending in odd numbers.
 - Sunday for addresses ending in even numbers.
 - Hours: Midnight to 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. to midnight.
 - November through February: No watering.
- Texas A&M has developed a lawn irrigation application "<u>Water my Yard</u>" that uses local rainfall data to provide weekly watering advice. We have used this application for over a year now and it is very accurate and helps with reducing water use and maintaining our lawns. See link below for more information.

- The water storage tank project is under construction! We are building Tank 2 first and after it is operational and testing is complete, we will dismantle Tank 1 and replace it. Tank 1 has been in operation for over 20 years and needs to be replaced due to corrosion issues.

Landscape Planning

- This is the time of the year to start landscape planning. Property owners and residents should plan for continuing drought conditions. 70% of all residential water use is for watering landscaping. Review watering requirements for any new or replacement lawns and landscaping. Consider using plants and trees native to our area. Research water requirements as you plan for new landscaping plants. - Please check and make sure your tree limbs are trimmed back to provide a minimum clearance of 15' above streets to accommodate emergency vehicles, trash trucks and RV's.

Eclipse Planning

- The Solar Eclipse will occur on April 8, 2024. Burnet County is in the path of the eclipse. State and local governments have been planning for this event and reviewed actions of other areas of the country impacted by past eclipse events.
- Over 100,000 visitors are anticipated to travel to Burnet County to watch the eclipse. This will impact traffic, restaurants, food stores and fuel stations. Additionally, cell phone and computer services may be impacted.
- Visitors may arrive several days prior to the event and stay a few days after. It is anticipated that many visitors will drive in for the day to view the eclipse which will lead to significantly more traffic on area highways and roads.
- Residents will need to prepare well in advance for this event by scheduling travel plans, doctor appointments and shopping activities around this event. Below are links for more information.



Financial Overview:

The single largest expense under office and administrative is insurance. Insurance for 2023 totaled \$11,558, nearly 30% of our annual operating expenses.

- POA Insurance Increased \$2319 for Total \$11,558
- Office & Administrative and Software Increased \$3,956 for Total \$13,601 Increase in cost of Insurance, Office Supplies, Software and Newsletter Fee
- Maintenance & Repairs Increased \$7,418.16 for Total \$13,568.93
 Weed Remediation/Brush Removal, Maintenance & Repair of Parks, Storage Rentals and Community Center

A LOCALS GUIDE TO PREPARE FOR APRIL 8, 2024



 Burnet, Lampasas, Lometa, Llano & Marble Falls schools are closed Monday, 4/8.

 Fill up your gas tank the weekend prior to the eclipse.

 Stock up on supplies ahead of time (groceries, water, prescriptions, etc.).

 Be sure to pick up eclipse glasses to ensure viewing of the eclipse safely!

 Do not schedule appointments or errands to be run on 4/8.

 Coordinate with your employer the possibility of working from home or have a plan for the additional traffic on your work commute.

 Note that cell and internet service will be overwhelmed with additional crowds.
 Be sure to have a back-up communication plan.

 Be mindful that all local aid and first responders will be in extreme demand during this event.
