The Highland Haven POA will hold a voting meeting on February 12, 2019 at 7:00 pm at the Community Center. The agenda will include regular reports from Directors, the Audit results, a vote on by-law revisions and the election of three new Directors. An absentee ballot for the by-laws and for the Directors will be sent via email.

There are five candidates for the three open positions. As was stated in the Call for Director Nominations, each candidate will have an opportunity to speak at the POA meeting to introduce themselves and provide their qualifications to the membership. The candidates are *(in alphabetical order)*:

Major proposed by-law changes include:

- 1. Allow UP TO two part-time residents of the City of Highland Haven. This will allow for greater representation to those members of our community as well as broaden the pool of people to serve on the Board.
- 2. Hold two semiannual meetings. Since there has always been a provision to call special meetings when necessary this number should allow the Board to operate efficiently.
- 3. Change the day of the semiannual meetings from Tuesday to Saturday in an effort to increase attendance at meetings.

Flood News

The October Flood event is well behind us; however, many of our neighbors are still working to recover from its effects. Almost 30 homes were impacted by this event and home owners are now in various stages of cleanup and reconstruction. Virtually every waterfront dock structure received some type of damage and these owners are also working to make repairs.

Property Owners impacted by the flood have reported that a number of people are walking into construction areas and into structures that have been damaged. These area are very dangerous and uninvited visitors are putting themselves at risk. We have been asked to tell everyone to not visit these areas without the owner's consent. Entering these areas without permission could be considered trespassing.

Do not use construction site dump trailers unless you have the permission of the home owner and contractors. This too could be considered an illegal activity.

Highland Lakes Crisis Network

Due to the many flood damaged homes in Burnet and Llano Counties, a long-term recovery assistance program has been developed to assist those in need. Anyone affected by the flood and needs assistance should contact the <u>Highland Lakes</u> <u>Crisis Network, 325-423-3662</u>. This group has 200 caseworkers currently assisting those impacted with a number of services including cleanup, construction, financial and spiritual aid.

Highland Lakes Crisis Network is made up of representatives from the Highland Lakes area churches, civic groups, local government groups and individuals. These representatives are working together to assist those impacted by the October Flood with donated resources. Donations at any level are appreciated. The Highland Lakes Crisis Network is a 501 c3 non-profit corporation.

Solid Waste Services

- The City is finalizing contract negotiations with Waste Management Inc. for residential trash service for the City of Highland Haven, Shady Acres sub-division and Nobles sub-division.
- We are planning to start up Waste Management's service the first week of April 2019.
- The monthly base fee is proposed at \$25 per month, plus 6.25% state sales tax.
- The monthly base service will include 1- 95 gallon Poly Cart for landfill trash and 1- 95 gallon Poly Cart for recycling.
- Trash carts will be emptied every Thursday and recycling carts will be emptied every other Thursday.
- Next month, all property owners and residents will receive a letter further explaining the service and a service application. Property owners and residents who wish to have this service will need to complete the application and return it along with payment to the City of Highland Haven.
- The City will coordinate the trash cart change out with the current trash services. Residents are requested to not contract and/or pay for services with the current trash service contractors beyond March 31.

City Elections

City Elections are scheduled for May 4. There are 3 Alderman positions up for election. The incumbents are **Lonnie Ball**, **Alvin Kahanek** and **Bill Passmore**. Candidate application packets can be obtained from the City Secretary at City Hall. Completed application packets must be submitted to the City Secretary no later than 5pm, February 15.

Administrative Assistant Position Now Open for Applications

- The City of Highland Haven is seeking a part-time administrative assistant, Application packets can be picked up at City Hall from the City Secretary.

Board of Alderman

- Next BOA Meeting is scheduled for **Tuesday**, **February 4**, **7pm**.
- These meetings are open to the public, residents and property owners are encouraged to attend.

Planning and Zoning

- Next P&Z Meeting is **Thursday**, **February 11**, **6pm**.
- These meetings are open to the public, residents and property owners are encouraged to attend.

HH Water System

- New water rates go into effect this month and will be reflected on your February bill.
- Highland Haven customers will see a \$1 increase to their monthly base rate, \$33 to \$34.
- Shady Acres and Nobles customers will see a \$3 increase to their monthly base rate, \$33 to \$36.
- Water use rates above the initial 2,000 gallons included in the monthly base rate will increase 3%.

Streets and Drainage

- Debris from the October Flood event may have blocked drainage pipes in your area. Please check drainage around your property and clear any potential blockage to avoid flooding.
- Contact City Hall if you need assistance with clearing drainage culverts in the street right of way.
- The October Flood event also brought to light a number of drainage ditches in the street right of ways that need to be excavated to direct water to storm water drainage pipes. You may see construction equipment in front of your property in the future as we excavate these drainage ditches to correct the flow.
- Be sure to clean leaves from roof rain gutters as well as drainage ditches around your property.

Traffic Safety

- Please help us keep Highland Haven residents safe by obeying posted traffic signs.

Fire Safety

- All homes need house numbers that are visible from the street to assist first responders.
- <u>Granite Shoals Fire Dept. needs volunteers!</u> Besides fire fighters, they need non-emergency support assistance too. Call Chief Austin Stanphill at 830-596-8110 for more information about volunteer opportunities.
- Before burning, contact the Granite Shoals Fire Dept. and the Burnet County Sheriff's Office.
- Burning of construction material and trash is prohibited.

These programs included presentations by local, State and County representatives as well as area engineering firms. **Donna Green** is the Floodplain Administrator for Highland Haven.
- Property owners with property in a floodplain should take time to understand the FEMA requirements for managing and maintaining their homes in a designated floodplain area.
- Property owners with property in a designated floodplain are encouraged to get an Elevation Certificate and maintain flood insurance on these homes.
