❖ All property owners in Highland Haven are automatically members of the Association and the Board welcomes and encourages your participation in all regular meetings. If you have ever wondered how the POA functions, how it is funded, or how decisions are made, this is a great opportunity to learn and engage.

The biannual meeting was held Saturday, February 8th. This year's meeting included <u>highlights and accomplishments</u> of 2024 and plans for 2025:

- ❖ Great news for uncovered storage renters! The Highland Haven water system upgrade is complete, and trailers can soon be returned to their previous locations. Unfortunately, the POA did lose some space because of the water system expansion and contingencies will have to be developed for some items. Stay tuned for more information!
- ❖ New signage! You might notice new signs at the entrances to the rental storage areas. Unauthorized use of both covered and uncovered storage areas has been an issue for several years and the Board has necessarily taken action to address this. Unauthorized use of rental spaces deprives the POA of important revenue and can cause hardship for legitimate renters who are unable to use the space(s) they pay for. Going forward, the rental areas will be more closely monitored, and if unauthorized vehicles or trailers are found, and if the owners of those vehicles cannot be located, the vehicles are subject to being towed. If towed, the owner will be responsible for the towing and storage fees assessed by the towing company.
- ❖ More news about Rental Spaces! All POA storage spaces are full and there are currently thirty neighbors on the waiting list. Please be mindful that storage spaces are of varying sizes and not all vehicles will be appropriate for a given space. Therefore, when space does become available, it might not meet your storage needs. Next month's newsletter will feature additional information about storage and storage contracts.

City Hall Changes

- Our **City Secretary, Lezley Baum**, submitted her resignation on November 21, 2024, her last day in the office was January 23, 2025. Lezley has committed 5 years of dedicated service to Highland Haven. Lezley is resigning to spend more time with her family and travel. Lezley retired from the City of Hobbs New Mexico after serving there for 30+ years before moving to Highland Haven. Lezley is a great asset for our community and will be missed at City Hall. She is not leaving Highland Haven and has indicated her willingness to provide consultation when she is in town.
- Upon receiving Lezley's resignation, the Board of Alderman approved advertising for the City Secretary position. We were very fortunate to receive an application from a very qualified applicant, Sarah Collard.
- The interview panel recommended hiring Sarah to the Board of Alderman and the Board approved hiring her effective February 15. Sarah's first day in the office will be February 18.

Municipal Elections

- Elections are scheduled for May and candidate filing continues through February 14.
- Three alderman positions are scheduled for election. The incumbents are **Aldermen Bruce Robertson**, **Lynn Smith** and **Terry Smith**.
- Candidate filing packets are available at City Hall.

Texas Legislature Update

- It is important that our community closely monitors city related bills that have been filed. Please take time to review the TML Legislative Update and read the synopsis of these bills. The Board of Alderman will review such bills at their BOA meetings. The community is encouraged to attend and participate in these discussions. Once the Legislature approves a bill it becomes law, and the City of Highland Haven will be required to comply with these laws. - Residents are encouraged to send letters/email to our State representatives and senators letting them know your opinions on proposed bills.

Water System

- Good News!! Our 2024 water conservation efforts paid off and we kept the volume of water pumped from our aquifer below the mandatory reduction restriction!
- Bad News! We have received insufficient rain to improve area aquifers. On December 20, 2024, the Central Texas Groundwater Conservation District voted to continue the 15% MANDATORY Drought Water Reductions for all exempt and non-exempt water wells. The MANDATORY reductions are effective January 1 through December 31, 2025. https://www.centraltexasgcd.org/drought-status/
- The City of Highland Haven groundwater permit is reduced from 82-acre feet to 69-acre feet; therefore, all Highland Haven water customers are required to <u>continue their efforts to reduce</u> water use.

Landscape Planning

- This is the time of the year to start landscape planning. Property owners and residents should plan for continuing drought conditions. 70% of all residential water use is for watering landscaping. Review watering requirements for any new or replacement lawns and landscaping. Consider using plants and trees native to our area. Research water requirements as you plan for new landscaping plants. - Please check and make sure your tree limbs are trimmed back to provide a minimum clearance of 15' above streets to accommodate emergency vehicles, trash trucks and RV's.
