Letter from the Village President...

Greetings friends and neighbors,

Thank goodness for spring! The Village has just come out of one of the toughest winters in recent memory. We experienced an abundance of snow and cold temps. Shovels and snow throwers received quite a workout and private snowplow operators had a very busy winter. Cross-country skiers and snowmobilers had several weeks of great snow conditions. But now it is time for spring cleanup and your village staff is gearing up for the challenge.

I would like to mention two projects that are scheduled for completion before Memorial Day. The Firehouse Marina boat channel dredging project is mostly complete. Those of you that are Firehouse Marina patrons will be happy to hear that the Wisconsin DNR granted the Village permission to widen and deepen the channel to more safely accommodate boating traffic traveling from the marina out to the deeper waters of Eagle Harbor. The second project I would like to mention is the Historic Ephraim Firehouse restoration. The project is moving forward with an anticipated completion just a few weeks away. This is a project the entire Village can be proud of. The building was in dire need of structural upgrades as well as a complete facelift. The old firehouse is being restored to appear as it did when it was built in the early 1930's. To enhance the look even further, the Village Board has authorized the removal of the overhead electric and cable TV wires on Moravia Street behind the old firehouse. In addition, there is a focus committee working on recommendations to clean up the Village owned land that runs south of the old firehouse between Water and Moravia Streets. Watch for a "Historic Firehouse" open house soon. Many thanks to the donors, the firehouse restoration committee, and to Keith Lindstrand, our firehouse project coordinator.

In my last news article I mentioned that the Village Board had created a direct email address for village taxpayers to communicate directly with the trustees. I would like to report that we have now expanded our email system even further. The Village President, each Village Trustee, the Village Administrator, and the department heads will each now have a direct Village email address. As before, an email to trustees@ephraim-wisconsin.com will be delivered to the entire Village Board of Trustees. All emails will be forwarded to the appropriate committee chairperson or department head for a timely response. As I start my second year of my term as Village President, I would like to thank everyone for his or her comments and words of encouragement. The Wastewater Department has been actively renovating the wastewater/water lab. A variety of upgrades include countertop resurfacing, new faucets, repainting metal cabinet doors and replacing the asphalt tile floor. These changes will keep the lab in great shape for years ahead. It looks like a new roof for the entire building will be completed this year too.

A reminder to all grinder pump owners - inspection notices will be sent out soon. If you do receive a notice, please schedule your inspection at your earliest convenience.

The well water testing is gearing up for another great year. The village encourages property owners to have an annual test of their well water (Ordinance Chapter 13.12). We offer a variety of state certified tests. You may pick up a testing kit at either the village office or the treatment plant.

Don't forget, we also offer septage hauling. We provide service for holding tanks within the village. For those of you on a three year inspection schedule with the Door County Sanitarian Department for your conventional septic or mound system, we provide a competitive service. Call to set up an appointment – 854-4991.

The two full time operators, Brad and Russ, have been busy working on various projects all winter long. They have done and continue to do a great job! No project would be possible without approval from our Wastewater Committee and Village Board. THANK YOU.

The Ephraim-Gibraltar Airport will boast a new self-fueling system for pilots by summer of 2009. This will lessen the need for personnel hours at the Airport as well as increase revenues, as the system will be available to pilots 24 hours a day.

Happy Spring! The Foundation is gearing up for a busy and exciting season. Our season begins with a special Anderson "Dock Party" celebration, which will take place on Thursday, June 12 from 5:00 – 8:30 pm. Join us for thirteen-piece brass band playing turn-of-the-century favorites, a picnic supper complete with a pie and ice cream, plus a talk by Charles Peterson, screenings of old-time movies, and a old-fashioned Family Sing-Along. The annual exhibit at Anderson Barn opens that evening and deals with the history of the Anderson family.

Melissa Ripp, Business & Marketing Director, has been hard at work on a self-guided tour, an hour-long recorded iPod tour through historic Ephraim. The Ephraim Visitor's Center will be renting out the audio tours on our behalf, and they'll include free admission to all of the five restored museum buildings.

The Foundation takes in a significant amount of archival materials and artifacts every year with the objective of preserving and making those articles useful and acceptable. Additional office and work areas, plus space for storage, cataloging and public research will appear with the construction of the new Archival Resource Center (ARC) beginning this fall. Happenings at The Hardy Gallery ...

- In April the FHCA kicked-off the arts mentorship component of its new art education program, Exposure to Creativity (ETC). Through a partnership with Gibraltar High School and FOG, the FHCA is able to reach out to young people ages 14-18 years old and expose them to different creative professions. The FHCA hopes to empower young people to develop creative practices they can sustain throughout their lives. Room Tax Update

The estimate of money to be received from 2008 room tax in Ephraim is \$110,000, with 50% of those funds going to the Ephraim Business Council for marketing of the Village. The Village Board decided to collect the room tax for a year and expend it the following year, to make sure we knew how much money we could allocate toward projects. From 2007 tax, we have approximately \$87,000 to work with this year.

Our portion of funds must be used for tourism-related infrastructure, and we have many projects and uses on our "wish list" for the future. This year the Board has voted to use a portion to redo the landscaping from the south point of Moravia to the newly renovated fire station, bury wiring on Moravia for a better viewscape, update signage and crosswalk signs, light the south-end entrance sign, and purchase new lit Christmas garland for the streetlight poles. These are items that would end up on the tax roll if not paid for by room tax, so thank an innkeeper when you see them!
