# President's Notes....Dr. Michael McCutcheon



# Note from the Administrator ...

#### **Brent Bristol**

This past month the 2017 Village of Ephraim budget was approved. The total tax levy for 2017 has increased from \$987,741 to \$991,415 for an increase of 0.4%. The Assessed Value of the village increased by \$245,000. The result is an increase in the village mill rate of \$0.01 per thousand to \$2.86. Again this year department heads, committees, and your village board have done an excellent job in producing a budget that reflects the fiscal responsibility that we have come to expect and appreciate.



#### Ephraim Tid Bits ...

Ephraim was founded in 1853, the population at that time was unknown. However, our population in 2016 is 288.

Ephraim is located at 45°9'23"N 87°10'16"W / 45.15639°N 87.17111°W / 45.15639; -87.17111 (45.156509, -87.171047).

According to the United States Census Bureau, the village has a total area of 7.16 square miles (18.54 km<sup>2</sup>), of which, 3,79 square miles (9.82 km2) of it is land and 3.37 square miles (8.73 km<sup>2</sup>) is water.

The highest point in the village (at the north end of North Orchard St.) is about 788 feet (240 m) above sea level, or 210 feet (64 m) above the surface of Green Bay.

Climate: The climate in Ephraim is temperate, with warm summers and cold winters. Guess we all knew that!



# **Ephraim Welcomes 2 New Trustees**

The April Election saw a change in the guard with Stephen Sauter retiring from service and Paul Roppuld elected to fill the vacancy. Roppuld's platform is based on continued fiscal financial solvency, conservation of natural resources and accountability.

In May of 2016 Cindy Nelson agreed to complete the term of Jane Olson, and will be up for election in the 2017 spring election. Cindy has provided excellent contributions to the Board meetings and is a former teacher who minds our p's and g's.

Speaking of Jane Olson, Jane departed our community on June 30th of this year. Jane served the Village of Ephraim well as an active member of the Board: June 2009-May 2016 8 years, Personnel Committee 8 years, Library Chair 2009-2016, Community Protection Committee 8 years, Physical Facilities 2006-2011 6 years, Election Inspector 2005-2016 12 years. Jane was honored to be presented a Fyr Bal Chieftain medal designed and fashioned by artist John Balistreri June of 2014, a title bestowed by the residents of the village for her service to the community.

# Maintenance Department News... Brad Rasmusson

Greetings from the maintenance staff. I would like to take this opportunity to inform our residents about our recycling facility and procedures. The facility is located right next to the Wastewater Treatment Plant at 10285 Town Line Dr. The recycling facility is open 24/7 365 days a year, which will continue as long as the facility is used correctly,. Please note that we do not accept garbage. The facility is open to recycling generated from properties and businesses within the Village of Ephraim **ONLY**. We now have 10 single stream recycling dumpsters, 4 large capacity, 3 low profile, and 3 large capacity with rear access doors for those not able to use the others. Please look at the Village of Ephraim website for information on what can and can not be recycled. We will also post this information at our facility.

There is a brush dump located behind the pole barn which we have expanded this year, we now have 3 separate areas, one for brush and limbs, one for yard waste, and a fire wood pile which anyone is allowed to take from if interested.

This year we installed traffic control signs at our facility for the safety of our residents and employees on the property. In the winter please allow a couple hours following a snow storm for us to make the facility safe for your use.

New in 2017, on Saturday June 10<sup>th</sup> from 8:00-noon we will be hosting an electronics recycling event which will include electronics, small appliances and much more. Please look at our website or look at upcoming minutes for future updates including a possible date change,. Brochures detailing what will be accepted will be distributed long before the event and we will post information at the recycling facility when available. Depending on the turnout we might make this an annual event.

#### News from the EFD... Chief Justin MacDonald

As winter approaches we encourage everyone to have their chimneys cleaned and other heating sources professionaly checked to ensure they are in proper working condition. We recommend everyone change the batteries in their smoke and carbon monoxide detectors annually and if those units are more than 10 years old to purchase new ones. If you have questions regarding smoke or CO detectors please contact the Fire Department. We will be happy to answer any of your questions.

The Fire Department is in the process of upgrading our Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) these are the breathing units we wear when entering a smoke filled or hazardous environment. The units we currently have are becoming obsolete and upgrading will improve the amount of time we can work in a hazardous environment, the new equipment will have a life expectancy of 15 years.

A brief reminder that the burning of brush can only be done when there is at least 2 inches or more of snow cover. To obtain a burning permit contact Chief MacDonald, Assistant Chief Havel or Captain Meyer prior to starting to burn. We will only issue permits on a day to day basis as weather and wind conditions quickly change.

#### Please do not wait until the middle of March or later to burn as you may not be able to get a permit.

## **Are You Ready for Winter?** Time to get your home and car ready for cold and snow

November 14-18, 2016 is Wisconsin's Winter Awareness Week. Now is the time to get ready before the snow and cold hit. Make sure you have an emergency supply kit in your car - it could save your life. If you slide off into a ditch and are stranded during a storm, food and other items in your kit could help keep you and your family safe until emergency help arrives.

An emergency vehicle kit should contain items such as flashlight, first aid kit, booster cables, emergency flares, water and snack food along with extra gloves, hats, scarves and blankets. In addition, make sure you have a shovel and **a bag of sand or kitty litter** to help provide traction if you get stuck.

# STREETSCAPE PROJECT UPDATE:

Beginning on Wednesday, November 30, 2016 at 7:00 pm and continuing into the month of December, the Ephraim Village Board will be having public meetings at the village hall, 9996 Water Street to discuss the proposed cross sections of the streetscape plan. The board has broken the project at this time down to three sections.

Section 1 - From the Wetlands Preserve to Village Firehouse Marina. Section 2 - From the Firehouse Marina to Visitor Information Center. Section 3 - From the Visitor Information Center to Anderson Dock.

Discussions on the 30<sup>th</sup> will begin with a focus on Section 1. Meetings will be posted on our village website and in the village posting boxes. Additionally meeting notification will be emailed out to those signed up to receive updates. Meetings will continue in the month of December with the section discussions moving north until all three sections are covered.

If a consensus is reached upon completion of these meetings the board will consider moving forward to the engineering phase of design in early 2017.
