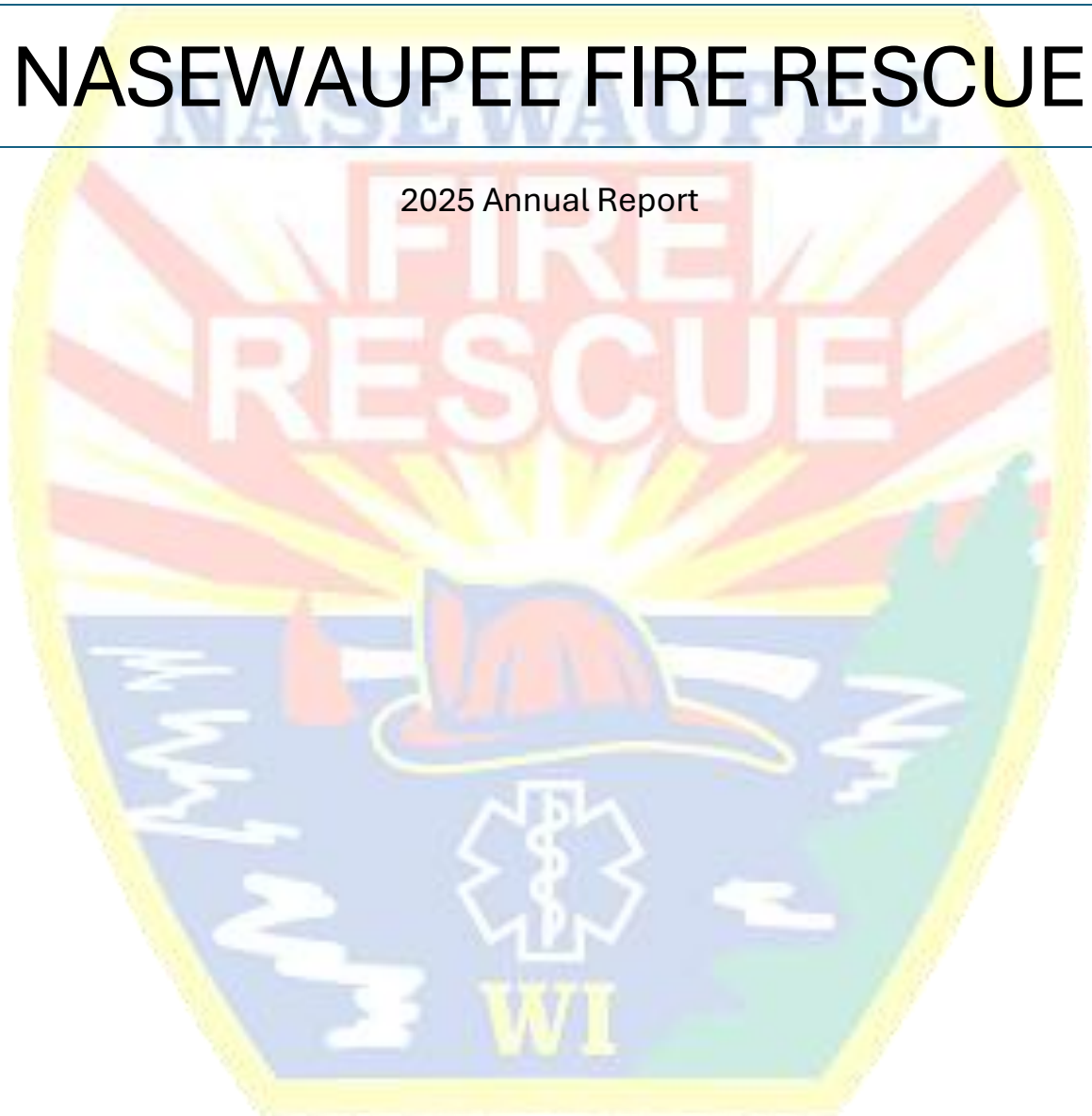

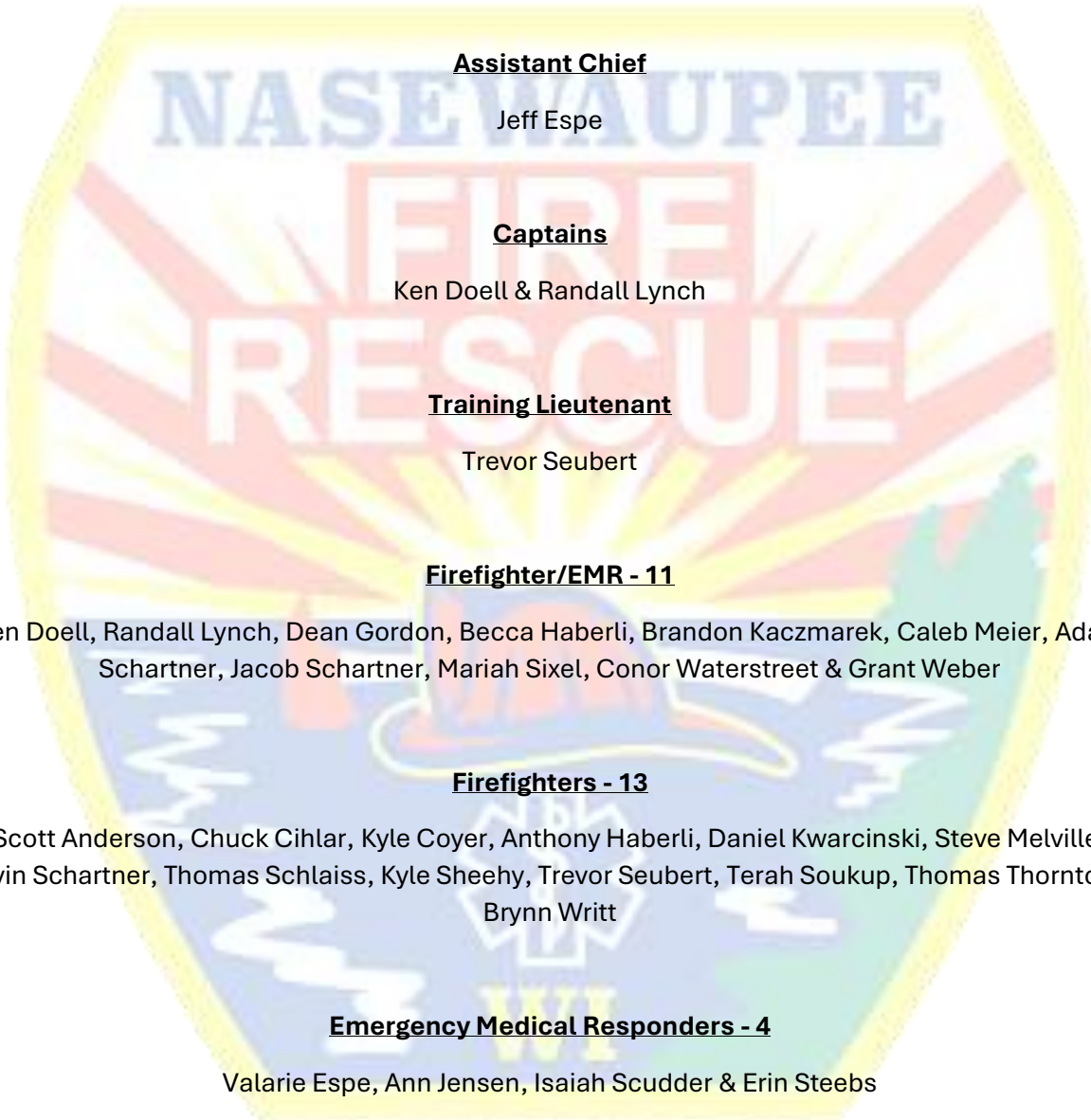

- Tender 11-12 – 1991 International 4900 w/ 1800 gallon tank
 - Seating for 2 personnel
- Tender 11-14 – 2008 International 4900 w/ 2000 gallon tank
 - Equipped w/ hydraulic driven pump w/ pump & roll capabilities
 - Seating for 2 personnel
- Tender 11-15 – 2017 Westernstar 4700 w/ 3450 gallon tank
 - Equipped w/ small diesel driven 275 GPM pump
 - Seating for 2 personnel

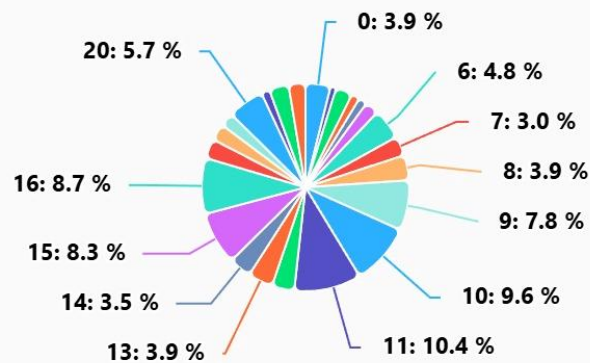

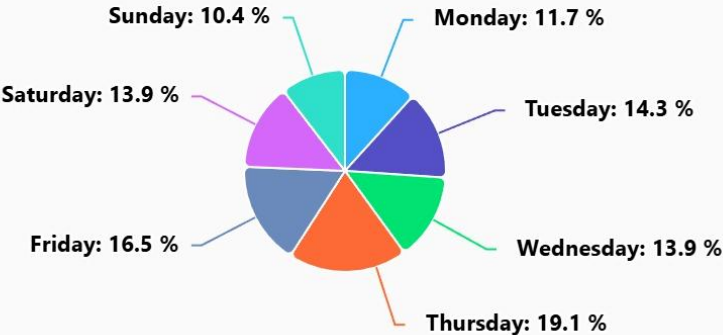

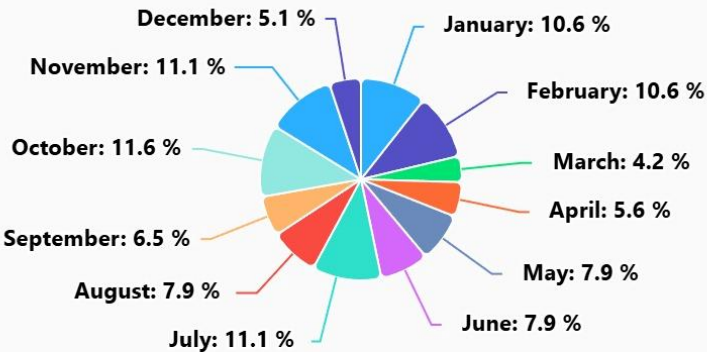
Fire (NFIRS) count by Hour

January

- 31st - Flashover training in green bay at the public safety building 4 NFR members attended

June

- 9th - Driver ops training at Cherryland Airport
- 14th - Car show at Hainesville Church tender 11-14 was brought

July

- Egg Harbor parade
- Southern Door Picnic Parade
- Belgian Days Parade
- In house mock fire drill training took place, scene size up and advancing lines.

August

- An audit happened by the Wisconsin DNR for the FFP grant items we received. We need to keep records of this grant for 3 years.

September

- NFR took a moment to have a bell ceremony. This is to remember and reflect on all those who were lost on 9/11. During this time we also remember Capt Aric Weber.
- **13th** - Bus extrication training at Gibraltar Fire Station put on by Public safety. 4 members of NFR went to this. This training was offered to all departments in Wisconsin. Aside from Gibraltar, NFR was the only Door County department there. Engine 11-08 was used.
- **15th** - Ropes and ladder training, this was a combination of 2 nights. The final night was at the Sturgeon Bay burn tower and training facility.
- **19th** - Idlewild First Responders Golf For Gear fundraiser. Tender 11-14 used for the siren start and the UTV was there to show the community what they helped purchase.
- **29th** - NFR anniversary dinner at Beach Harbor Waterfront Marys

October

- Run Wild at Potawatomi State Park. 4 EMR's on site with the UTV. The UTV was used to locate a person with a medical emergency, triaged then called Door County EMS
- Fire Prevention at Southern Door School for the elementary grades. 11-08 was used with 2 NFR personnel. NFR personnel went over the importance of seat belt safety and even firefighters wear them. The students jumped in 11-08 and found the seat belts firefighters wear.
- Brussels Brush Fire - Engine 11-07 filled 31,000 gallons the first night.
