CONTACT PERSON NOTIFICATION PROGRAM



CONTACT PERSON NOTIFICATION PROGRAM (CPNP)

A statewide public safety initiative that allows residents to voluntarily provide contact information of a legal guardian or other individuals who can assist law enforcement in communicating with persons with cognitive impairment or other disabilities.

Applicants can provide one or two contact persons' information.


Applicants can also provide additional information, such as cognitive impairments, disabilities, or anything else that might be helpful for law enforcement to know.



PEACE OF MIND

Voluntarily submitting your loved one's information will give law enforcement additional knowledge on how best to interact with them and allow you, the caregiver, to be contacted directly and in a timely manner.

This helps prevent further delays in ensuring your loved ones receive the attention they need from law enforcement.



WHO CAN APPLY?

CPNP is a volunteer program open to anyone in the state of New Hampshire who would like law enforcement to have additional guidance on how to effectively communicate with them or their loved one, and provide a contact person who could assist in such interactions.

Information provided to law enforcement includes:

- Contact person's and participating person's name, address, phone number, and email.
- Physical description of the participating person, such as sex, height, weight, and eye color, along with any additional information to be aware of when interacting with the person, such as their sensitivity to loud noises, lights and sirens, or person's inability to make direct eye contact.

You can apply for yourself, on behalf of your child, or the person with a disability of whom you are a legal guardian.

The information you submit can be updated at any time or withdrawn completely.
