



PIERMONT TRANSFER STATION PERMIT FEE HEARING



WHY HAVE PERMITS BEEN IMPLEMENTED?

To ensure that transfer station services are reserved for local residents and to help offset the rising costs of recycling and waste disposal, the transfer station is implementing a permit system that includes residency verification. This program will help maintain fair access, improve operational efficiency, and support the long-term financial sustainability of the facility.

WHY CHARGE FOR THEM?

The proposed \$25 permit fee will help offset rising operating costs without further impacting property taxes while maintaining transfer station services for residents. The fee will support the ongoing costs of waste disposal, recycling and help ensure the long-term sustainability of the transfer station.

Permits are not a replacement for the current Pay-as-you-throw system or fees for items

WHERE DO I GET A PERMIT?

Beginning June 15th, Permit Applications will be available in the Town Offices, Transfer Station, Piermont Library and online.

- Completed applications can be dropped off, mailed to the Town Offices or placed in the drop slot in the Town Clerk/Tax Collector Door.
- Permit applications will be processed by the Selectboard Office. They will be verified and completed for pick up or returned by mail

WHO NEEDS A PERMIT?

Anyone who uses the Piermont Transfer Station will need a permit. The Transfer Station is available to all full and part-time residents of Piermont.

WHEN IS THIS BEING IMPLEMENTED?

Permits will be required beginning July 1, 2026. The initial permit will be prorated for 6 months and valid until December 31. New Permits will be required annually, a renewal application will be available in November for use beginning in January of the following year.
