RE: Rock County Erosion Control and Storm Water Management Ordinance Administration

Dear Town Official,

The Land Conservation Department administers the Rock County Construction Site Erosion Control and Storm Water Management Ordinances in the unincorporated areas of the County, with one exception for the Town of Beloit, which administers their own ordinance.

The **purpose of the Erosion Control Ordinance** is to minimize the amount of sediment and other pollutants carried by runoff or discharged from land disturbing activities to waters of the state or adjacent property *during construction*.

The purpose of the Storm Water Management Ordinance is to minimize the *post-construction*, long-term, adverse impacts of land development on stream flows, groundwater recharge capability, existing drainage system capacity and water quality in general. The intent is to establish cost effective long-term practices that are designed to meet standards for peak discharge rates (detention and retention), discharge quality (total suspended solid reduction) and infiltration (discharge quantity).

We are requesting your assistance in our public education efforts for the County Erosion Control and Storm Water Management Ordinance requirements as adopted by the County Board in 2004.

If a citizen or contractor requests approval from your Town for a project, please inform them their project will require a Rock County Erosion Control and/or Storm Water Management Permit if:

- 1. Land filling or excavation of four thousand square feet or more (or one thousand square feet or more near a navigable body of water). Examples include:
  - Site preparation for buildings (shops, sheds, office space, etc...) not associated with one and two-family dwelling construction if a building permit has been issued;
  - Construction of parking lots/areas;
  - Construction of ponds.
- 2. Construction of a new access road or driveway exceeding 100 feet in length.
- 3. Post construction sites that have land disturbance 1 acre or more, needs a Storm Water Management Permit.
