
Let me try this without the text at the bottom of the prior e-mail that was not relavent.

Although our office is not involved as a design consultant for 208 East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street, we have been involved on the 34<sup>th</sup> Street Quarter project on the corner of East 34<sup>th</sup> and Carr streets. We wanted to divulge this. This e-mail is under the auspices of the city engineer's position.

As far as the subject application, we do not have any comments other than with the deletion of permeable pavers within the public R/Ws and the expected projects being comprised of improvements with little permeable area, site and street drainage will need to be addressed with applications. The loss of permeable pavers along street frontages will create complications for designers to properly handle and mitigate storm drainage.
