Regarding your question about the roadway width on the new local road design. ACHD recommends that this roadway be constructed as a 36-foot wide commercial street section with vertical curb, gutter, and 5-foot wide concrete sidewalk on both sides of the roadway.

Hi Jenah,

I think we could help at a “planning level” by adding in that connection in the model and look at “possible” % changes in demand.

The model likely doesn’t know the magnitude of the cut through but by providing a % change in demand with a new connection it could help tell a story.

Could you tell me a little about the two developments – location, number of units or non-residential or share the application with me.

Also, we have 2025 to 2050 (in 5 yr increments) model sets so we need to determine what year would be most useful.
