



120-Day Emergency Shelter Program

The emergency shelter program is a comprehensive and secure shelter with 24-hour advocate assistance, private rooms, and common living facilities available to women and children fleeing domestic violence and/or sexual abuse. All residents receive the benefit of individual therapy, groups, court advocacy, child care, and case management; free-of-charge.

Therapy

Licensed Master's level clinicians and interns provide therapeutic services to adults and children who are survivors of domestic violence, childhood sexual abuse, and/or adult sexual assault. Many insurance carriers and Victims' Compensation may be billed, otherwise, counseling services are free-of-charge. For more information, please call 208-343-7025.

Case Management

Bachelor's level case managers provide case management services to individuals who are survivors of domestic violence and/or sexual abuse. Individuals are assisted in setting and meeting needs/goals such as housing, employment, medical, completing victims' compensation applications, and more. These services are free-of-charge. Safety Planning

Clients can complete a personalized safety plan with trained Victim Advocates. Calling ahead to schedule an appointment is recommended. Please call a Victim Advocate at 208-343-3688 ext. 200 for more information.

Court Advocacy

Trained advocates assist petitioners in seeking protection orders by helping them fill out protection order petitions and accompanying them to court. Clients may also contact the WCA for divorce and/or custody referrals to legal agencies, as well as for opportunities to access free legal information from volunteer attorneys. Financial Literacy

The evidence-based financial literacy curriculum is designed to empower economic independence. Clients may receive one-on-one coaching sessions after completing a 4 week, 2 hours per week, curriculum focusing on empowerment, budgeting, credit, and savings. Rape Crisis Advocacy

Circle of Support Orientation is an educational group opportunity for those desiring to learn more about the effects of childhood sexual abuse and/or adult sexual assault, as well as ways to support a survivor in their healing process. Orientation is held every Tuesday night from 4:45pm-5:30pm. It is open to the public and free-of-charge. Limited childcare is available. Circle of Support Group

Circle of Support is an open support group for female survivors of childhood sexual abuse and/or adult sexual assault dedicated to providing a safe, open atmosphere for education, discussion, and activities to help women in their healing process. The group meets each Tuesday from 5:30pm-6:30pm. First time participants are asked to attend the Circle of Support Orientation from 5:00-5:30pm. This group is offered free-of-charge. ***Life Skills class**

Life Skills is an educational group that meets weekly to discuss different topics such as wellness, nutrition, job interviewing, finances, budgeting, and more. This class is only available to clients participating in the shelter program.

***Nurturing Parenting Group**

The Nurturing Parenting group is an educational and interactive group designed to build nurturing parenting skills. The group is only available to clients participating in the shelter program.
