All businesses operating in Garden City require a Certificate of Occupancy. Please reach out to Development Services with any questions regarding this and other business and building applications.

This application is for a building permit to establish the occupancy for, or within, an existing building when construction is not planned. Specifically, this form is utilized when:

- The occupancy for which the structure is constructed is known, but the new tenant's business is classified as a different occupancy type.
- There is not sufficient documentation available to establish for which occupancy that the structure was constructed.

The International Existing Building Code (IEBC) will be used for review. The IEBC provides flexibility when reviewing construction standards required for existing structures. If upon review of this application, the IEBC requires upgrades to the structure, those upgrades shall be required prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy. If structural improvements are required, a Design Professional shall be employed to submit the plan modifications for review prior to the construction of those improvements. The city will also require the valuation of the work that will be done. Please refer to the [Resubmittal form](#).

Electrical, plumbing or mechanical work requires separate permits. Those permits are available at edopl.idaho.gov

Modifications to existing fire sprinkler or alarm systems require separate permits which are obtained through the North Ada County Fire & Rescue District office or www.nacfire.org.

Any code deficiencies pertaining to health, safety or Garden City Development Code identified during this process must be corrected before a Certificate of Occupancy can be issued.

Occupancy Classification Per IBC:

Assembly (A): Includes among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, for the gathering of persons for purposes such as civic, social or religious functions; recreation, food or drink consumption or awaiting transportation.

Subgroups:

A-1: Motion Picture Theaters, Symphony and Concert Halls. Television and radio studios admitting an audience.

A-2: Banquet Halls, Casinos (gaming areas), Nightclubs, Restaurants, Cafeterias and similar dining facilities (including associated commercial kitchens), Taverns and bars.

A-3: Amusement arcades, Art Galleries, Bowling Alleys, Community Halls, Courtrooms, Dance Halls, Exhibition halls, Funeral Parlors, Greenhouses, Gymnasiums (without spectator seating), Indoor swimming and tennis courts (without spectator seating), Libraries, Museums, Places of religious worship, Pool and billiard parlors, Waiting areas in transportation terminals

A-4: Arenas, Skating rinks, Swimming pools, Tennis courts

A-5: Amusement park structures, Bleachers, Grandstands, Stadiums

Business (B): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, for office, professional or service type transactions, including storage of records and accounts. Including but not limited to:

Airport traffic control towers, Ambulatory care facilities, Animal Hospitals, kennels and pounds, Banks, Barber and beauty shops, Car wash, Civic Administrations, Clinic (outpatient), Dry cleaning and laundries: *pickup and delivery stations and self-service*, Educational occupancies for students above the 12th grade, Electronic data processing, Food processing establishments and commercial kitchens not associated with restaurants, cafeterias and similar dining facilities not more than 2,500 square feet in area, Laboratories: *testing and research*, Motor vehicle showrooms, Post offices, Print shops, Professional services (architects, attorneys, dentists, physicians, engineers), Radio and television stations, Telephone exchanges, Training and skill development not in a school or academic program (including but not limited to, tutoring centers, martial arts studios, gymnastics and similar uses regardless of the ages served, and where not classified as Group A occupancy.

Educational (E): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, by six or more persons at any one time for educational purposes through the 12th grade. Including accessory to places of religious worship, within places of religious worship, and day care facilities.

Factory and Industrial (F): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, for assembling, disassembling, fabricating, manufacturing, packaging, repair or processing operations that are not classified that are not classified as a Group H or S occupancy.

Subgroups:

F-1: Moderate-hazard factory industrial – Aircraft manufacturing (not to include repair), Appliances, Athletic equipment, Automobiles and other motor vehicles, Bakeries, Beverages over 16% alcohol content, Bicycles, Boats, Brooms or brushes, Business machines, Cameras and photo equipment, Canvas and agricultural machinery, disinfectants, Dry cleaning and dyeing, Electric generation plants, Electronics, Engines (including rebuilding), Food processing establishments and commercial kitchens not associated with restaurants, cafeterias and similar dining facilities not more than 2,500 square feet in area, Furniture, Hemp products, Jute products, Laundries, Leather products, Machinery, Metals, Millwork (sash and door), Motion picture and television filming, Musical instruments, Optical goods, Paper mill and products, Photographic film, Plastic products, Printing or publishing, Recreational vehicles, Refuse incineration, Shoes, Soaps and detergents, Textiles, Tobacco, Trailers, Upholstering, Wood (distillation), Woodworking (cabinet)

F-2: Beverages (up to and including 16% alcohol content), Brick and masonry, Ceramic products, Foundries, Glass products, Gypsum, Ice, Metal products (fabrication and assembly)

High-Hazard (H): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, that involves manufacturing, processing, generation or storage of materials that constitute a physical or health hazard in quantities in excess of those allowed in control areas complying with Section 414, based on the maximum allowable quantity limits. Hazardous materials stored, or used on top of roofs or canopies, shall be classified as outdoor storage or use and shall comply with International Fire Code.

H-1: Building and structures containing materials that pose a detonation hazard

H-2: Building and structures containing materials that pose a deflagration hazard or a hazard from accelerated burning

H-3: Building and structures containing materials that readily support combustion or that pose a physical hazard

H-4: Building and structures containing materials that are health hazards

H-5: Semiconductor fabrication facilities and comparable research and development areas in which hazardous production materials are used and the aggregate quantity of materials is in excess of those listed in Tables 307.1(1) and 307.2 (2)

Institutional (I): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, in which care or supervision is provided to persons who are or are not capable of self-preservation without physical assistance or in which persons are detained for penal or correctional purposes or in which the liberty of the occupants is restricted. Alcohol and drug centers, Assisted living facilities, congregate care facilities, Group homes, Halfway houses, Residential board and care facilities, Social rehabilitation facilities, Foster care facilities, Detoxification facilities, Hospitals, Nursing homes, Psychiatric hospitals, Correctional Centers, Detention centers, Jails, Prerelease centers, Prisons, Reformatories, Adult daycare, Child day care

Mercantile (M): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof for the display and sale of merchandise, including but not limited to: Department stores, Drug stores, Markets, Greenhouses for display and sale of plants that provide public access, Motor fuel-dispensing, facilities, Retail or wholesale stores, Sales rooms

Residential (R): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, for sleeping purposes. Apartment houses, Boarding houses, convents, Dormitories, Fraternities and sororities, Monasteries, Hotels, Live/Work units Motels, Vacation timeshare properties, Alcohol and drug centers, Assisted living facilities, congregate care facilities, Group homes, Halfway houses, Residential board and care facilities, Social rehabilitation facilities

Storage (S): Includes, among others, the use of a building or structure, or a portion thereof, for storage that is not classified as a hazardous occupancy

Utility and Miscellaneous (U): Building and structures of an accessory character and miscellaneous structures not classified in any specific occupancy shall be constructed, equipped and maintained to conform to the requirements of this code commensurate with the fire and life hazard incidental to their occupancy. Group U shall include but not be limited to: Agricultural building, Aircraft hangars (accessory to a one- or two-family residence), Barns, Carports, Communication equipment structures with a gross floor area of less than 1,500 square feet, Fences more than 6' in height, Grain silos, Livestock shelters, Private garages, Retaining walls, Sheds, Stables, Tanks, Towers
