Overview:

The Brooklyn Fire and EMS District serves approximately 3,400 people in a 47 square mile area. The Fire & EMS district includes the village of Brooklyn and portions of the adjacent towns of Brooklyn, Oregon, Rutland and Union. These five municipalities are located in Dane, Green and Rock Counties. The district is managed by a commission with one member appointed by each municipality.

Message from the Chief:

I am honored to be a part of this wonderful department, and its dedicated group of members. Brooklyn Fire department was originated in 1906, Brooklyn EMS began service in 1996, and in 2022 the two departments merged to become one restructured department providing Fire & EMS service to the Brooklyn community, and surrounding areas.

The department currently has 44 members, 6 of which joined in 2023. In 2023 the department responded to 290 calls for varying types of emergency service. Brooklyn Fire & EMS is a Dane county department that also provides service to portions of Green and Rock counties.

2023 was a year filled with events and accomplishments. In March of 2023 our department, with the assistance of our medical director Dr. Michael Spigner, advanced the level of pre-hospital care to the Advanced flex level AEMT service. This is a big advancement for a Fire & EMS service and its members.

Brooklyn was selected as the Dane county host site for the National Night Out event in 2023. This is a fun filled event showcasing Police, Fire, EMS, Public works, and more. In September of 2023, Brooklyn was the host site for the 2023 Luke Bryan Farm Tour, a traveling county music concert series that brought a sold-out crowd of 20,000 attendees. We are fortunate to have supportive neighboring Fire & EMS departments that were willing to assist with the safety operations of the largest event to come to Brooklyn.

I want to thank all members of this department for another successful year. The members of the department are what makes everything happen. Their dedication and commitment to this community and beyond is amazing. I also wish to thank the families of the members for their support and understanding of the time commitments their loved ones provide to this community. Lastly, thank you to the community for your continued support of our department and its members.








Calls by time of day:



Response times:



Dispatch to en route time





Dispatch to en route time




Calls By Day


