



Brooklyn Fire began service in 1906 and has provided uninterrupted protection for nearly 120 years. Brooklyn Fire continues to be staffed by paid per call volunteers, who respond 24-7-365. The Fire Department operates with 2 Engines, 2 Tenders, 1 Squad, 1 Brush Truck, 1 ATV, and command vehicles.

OVERVIEW

The Brooklyn Fire and EMS District serves over 3,500 people in a 47 square mile area. The Fire & EMS district includes the Village of Brooklyn and portions of the adjacent Towns of Brooklyn, Oregon, Rutland and Union. The five municipalities are in Dane, Green and Rock Counties. The district is managed by a commission with one member appointed from each municipality.

As we reflect on another year, I wish to express my deepest gratitude and thanks to the dedicated men and women of Brooklyn Fire & EMS who tirelessly serve this community. Their dedication and commitment coupled with the support of the district commission, and residents, allows us to maintain providing a quality standard of Fire & EMS service.

2024 was a year filled with many challenges, opportunities, and continued growth. We continued to see an increase in the volume of medical calls, and mutual aid requests to neighboring communities and Fire & EMS departments. Medical calls with advanced level service and interventions continues to increase and averaged nearly 66% of calls for the year. In 2024 we continued to train with our medical direction, UW Health, along with area Fire & EMS departments more than ever.

During 2024 we had several members continue advancing their medical and fire certifications. We have welcomed three new members recently and had a large group complete EMR training. At the end of 2024 we traveled to Iowa to receive our new ambulance to add to the already impressive fleet that we are so grateful to have. I look forward to 2025, and the opportunities it presents.



- 25 members provided 19,646.50 hours of scheduled EMS coverage.
