ACCEPTED:

Prescription Pills, Patches, Ointments & Liquids, Over-the-Counter Medications,
Vitamins & Liquids, Cough Medicines, Inhalers, Pet medications

NOT ACCEPTED:

Illegal Drugs | Needles/Sharps | Thermometers | Personal Care Products | Epi-pens

How to Dispose of Medications in the Drug Drop Box:

- ✓ Bring unused/expired prescription or over-the-counter medications to any a location listed below.
- ✓ Unused/unwanted pills should be emptied from their original container into a clear, sealable bag. Blister packages are acceptable without the medications being removed.
- ✓ Pill containers may then be recycled at home. Make sure to black out your personal information.
- ✓ Leave liquids, gels or creams in their original packaging and place them in a clear, sealable bag.
- ✓ Place your clear, sealed bags of medication into the Drug Drop Box.
- ✓ Sharps (needles/syringes/lancets) should **NOT** be placed in the drug drop off collection boxes or in your municipal waste receptacle.
