

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF OAKLAND, JEFFERSON COUNTY,
WISCONSIN, TO REGULATE PARKING IN THE TOWN OF OAKLAND

The Town Board of the Town of Oakland, Jefferson County, Wisconsin, DO ORDAIN that Ordinance No. 1 of the Town of Oakland is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. (A) shall be revised to adopt Section 349, Wis. Stats., and the first sentence thereof shall now read as follows:

Section 1. (A) State Traffic Laws Adopted. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this ordinance, the statutory provisions in Chapters 340 through 349 of the Wisconsin Statutes describing and defining regulations with respect to vehicles and traffic exclusive of any provisions therein relating to penalties to be imposed and exclusive of any regulations for which the statutory penalty is a fine or term of imprisonment, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

The remainder of Section 1. (A) shall remain the same.

Section 2m. shall be created to read as follows:

Section 2m. Establishment of Parking Restrictions. The Town Board of the Town of Oakland has determined that it must impose some parking restrictions in the Town of Oakland to assist with the safe and unrestricted traffic flow on certain roads in the Town of Oakland and also to assist the Department of Public Works in removing snow in a safe and timely manner from streets where such work has become difficult during winter months due to parked vehicles. The Town Board may add other areas where either winter parking or parking at any time is restricted by resolution of the Town Board in the future. Such restrictions shall become effective upon passage of this ordinance, or later resolutions as applicable, and upon the erection of standard signs giving notice thereof in the restricted areas.

A. Winter Parking.

- (1) When signs have been erected at or reasonably near the corporate limits of the Township as provided in sec. 349.13, Wis. Stats., no person shall park or leave standing on that portion of any street designated in subsection (3), below, any vehicle at any time on any day from December 1 to April 1 except physicians on emergency calls.
- (2) Township police officers and the Director of Public Works shall have the authority to tow to a designated place, or a place where parking is permitted any vehicle parked or

left standing in violation of subsection (1), above, when such vehicle interferes with the removal of snow. Actual charges of such towing and removal may be assessed against the driver or party responsible for the violation in addition to any other penalty which may be provided for the violation of this section.

(3) Designated streets for winter restricted parking are the cul-de-sac areas of Friedel Avenue, Meadow Drive, Forested Road, Marshview Court, Oakwood Lane, Blue Spruce Lane, Deer Run Trail, Red Feather Drive, Hidden Valley Place, Wilderness Place, Roads End Court, Overlook Court, Tall Pines Place, Prairie Rose Road, Old Forest Road, Marina Lane, and Burr Lane, all areas to be designated by standard signs.

B. Stopping or Parking Prohibited in Certain Specified Places.


(1) Except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading or in receiving or discharging passengers or property and while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator so that it may be moved promptly in case of an emergency or to avoid obstruction of traffic, no person shall at any time park or leave standing any vehicle at any location on Meadow Drive or where so posted with standard signs on Hope Lake Road near Hope Lake and Island Lane.

C. Penalties and Enforcement. Penalties for violation of this ordinance and enforcement thereof shall be as set out in Section 3.B. herein.


All other provisions of Section 1, Ordinance No. 1, of the Town of Oakland, not in conflict herewith, shall remain the same.
