A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

This year’s road paving projects are drawing to a close, but some additional crack sealing and shoulder repair remain. As you travel around the Village it’s apparent that the majority of our roads do not have the concrete curbs common in more urban areas. In their absence, the Village uses gravel shouldering to protect the pavement from premature cracking caused by vehicles whose wheels go off the edge of the road. If the gravel is replaced by grass, as some residents have done, the softer surface cannot support the weight of the vehicle at the same level as the pavement, leading to the damage. All this leads me to a request to leave the gravel adjacent to the road in your area undisturbed. And if you notice a significant difference between the gravel and road surface in your neighborhood, let the Village Hall know. We’re trying to maintain shouldering on our roads to extend their useful lives and reduce paving costs. Thanks for your help and have a great summer! See you at Summer Splash!

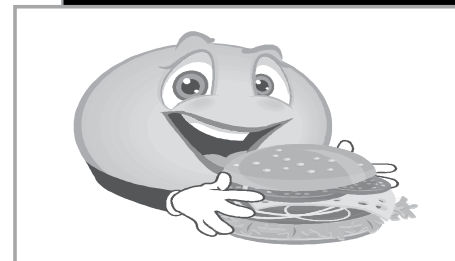

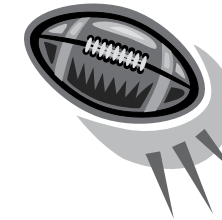

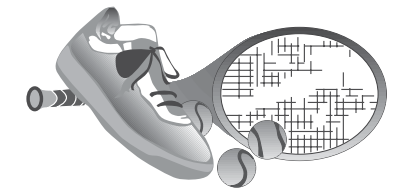

Recycling

What’s in Your Water??

Have you had your well tested lately? Guidelines recommend at least once every two years. Test information and a free kit are available at the Village Hall. Testing is done through Waukesha County Parks and Land Use. A \$25.00 fee is charged when you drop off the sample.



Village Ordinances

The current property maintenance ordinance includes such items as exterior maintenance and appearance, refuse, garbage and rubbish storage requirements and lawn maintenance. To report any violations, or if you have questions, contact the Village Hall.



Rain Barrels Reduce Runoff!

Lawn and garden watering can make up nearly 40 percent of total household water use during the summer. A rain barrel collects water and stores it for when you need it to water plants, wash your car or add to a swimming pool. The rain water stored in the barrel contains no chlorine, lime or calcium—it is naturally “soft” water. A single rain barrel will save most homeowners about 1300 gallons of water during the peak summer months. Saving water not only saves you money and energy, but it helps our environment. Diverting water from becoming runoff into our rivers and streams and means less water needs to be pumped out of shrinking aquifers. We can all do a better job of managing the water that falls on our homes, yards, driveways and parking lots. When rain washes across the land, it picks up pollution along the way and gives it a ride to the nearest waterway in most cases. Polluted runoff is the biggest remaining threat to water quality in the United States. By installing a rain barrel you can help reduce the polluted runoff. You can purchase a rain barrel through the Village for \$45.00. The barrel has a capacity of 55 gallons, is 23 inches in diameter and 36 inches tall. Please contact the Village Hall at 968-3968. Rain barrels must be paid for in advance.

2010 Paving Program



The 2010 roadway repair work has begun and is expected to take about six weeks. The entire 2010 paving program will be substantially completed by the end of June.

The street surfaces will be pulverized, compacted and repaved. New shoulder material will also be installed. Some traffic disruption should be expected during repaving; however, the contractor will maintain access to driveways at all times. Gravel patches, dust and rough roads will also be present at times. No parking will be allowed on the street during the day while work is in progress.

Please keep pets and children away from hot asphalt. All lawns disturbed will be seeded and mulched. Your assistance in watering seeded areas during dry periods will be appreciated.

Severe Weather Safety Tips

Purchase a severe weather radio; they are not expensive (around \$ 30.00 – \$50.00).

Have a plan in case of the approach of severe weather, practice the plan and make sure you have the correct supplies—flashlights, portable radio, water, etc.

If your electricity goes out please DO NOT USE candles to light rooms. Use flashlights—check them now before you need them and have spare batteries on hand.

If you have a generator, make sure to run your generator outside and not in the house, gasoline power generators give off carbon monoxide (CO).



BURNING INFORMATION

Burning is prohibited when winds are 15 mph or more and on National Holidays.

Burning is permitted during these periods:

November 15 – March 15:  
Every day 8 a.m. to sunset.

March 16 – November 14:  
Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, 8 a.m. to sunset.

Fires must be completely extinguished by sunset (No smoldering.)
