Lake Country Fire & Rescue is pleased to present the monthly report for March 2026.

March Incident Summary

During the month, the department responded to a total of 238 emergency incidents.

March Notable Incidents and Activities

- March 3: LCFR units responded to a vehicle fire in a farm field in the Town of Genesee. The vehicle was located approximately 300 feet off the roadway, requiring multiple units, including brush apparatus, to bring the incident under control.
- March 7: LCFR units responded to Lapham Peak for a medical incident on the trail system. Access was complicated by icy conditions and limited proximity to roadways. Park staff assisted with patient extrication using UTVs.
- March 8: LCFR units responded to a vehicle fire on I-94.
- March 9–11: Annual maintenance and testing were completed on all LCFR self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA).
- March 11: LCFR staff recognized and bid farewell to longtime Medical Director Dr. Tim Westlake, who is transitioning to a position with the United States Department of Health and Human Services in Washington, D.C.
- March 12: A winter storm brought high winds to Southeast Wisconsin, resulting in multiple responses for downed trees and power lines.
- March 16: LCFR units responded to a structure fire in the Town of Delafield.
- March 18: LCFR units responded to a cardiac arrest in the Town of Genesee.
- March 20: LCFR took delivery of a new roof ventilation training prop, designed and built in partnership with the Metals Fabrication Program at Arrowhead High School.
- March 23: LCFR units responded to a grass fire in the City of Delafield that extended from a bonfire, ultimately burning over one acre.
- March 30: LCFR units responded to a brush fire in the Town of Delafield.

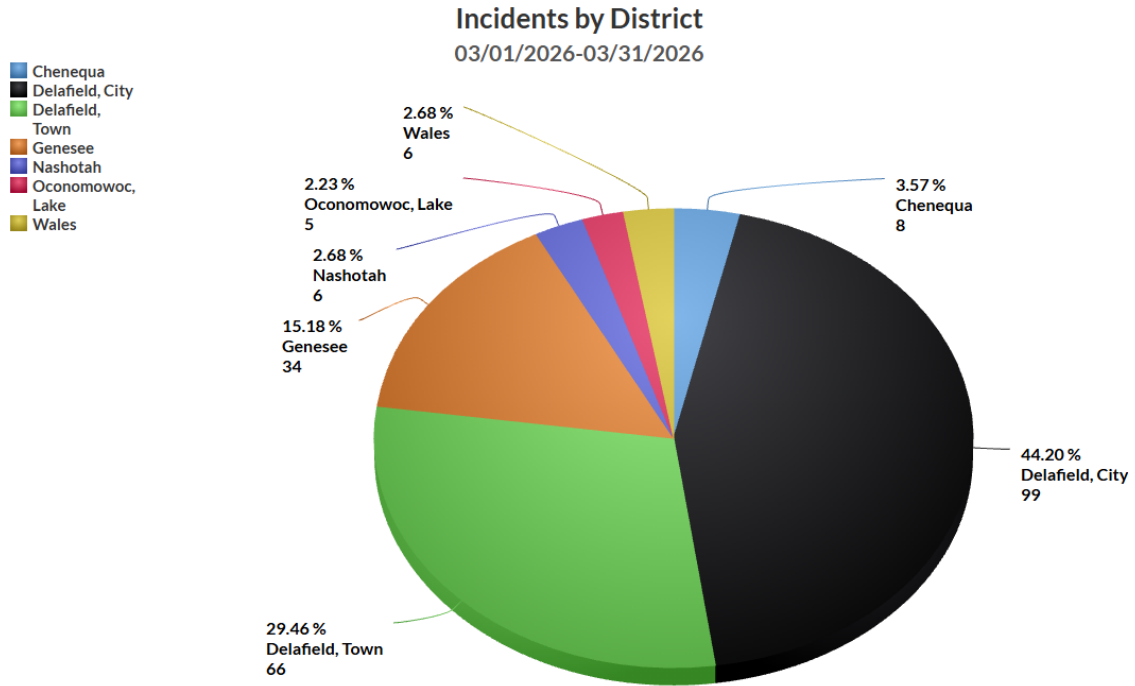

Training and Equipment Readiness

LCFR completed its annual SCBA flow testing and maintenance in March. Each unit is bench tested, calibrated, and inspected to ensure compliance with NFPA standards. This process ensures that all respiratory protection equipment remains reliable and safe for personnel operating in hazardous environments.

In closing, March was an operationally active month that highlighted the diverse range of services LCFR provides—from emergency response and technical rescues to training, partnerships, and equipment readiness. As always, we remain committed to delivering high-quality, professional service to the communities we serve.

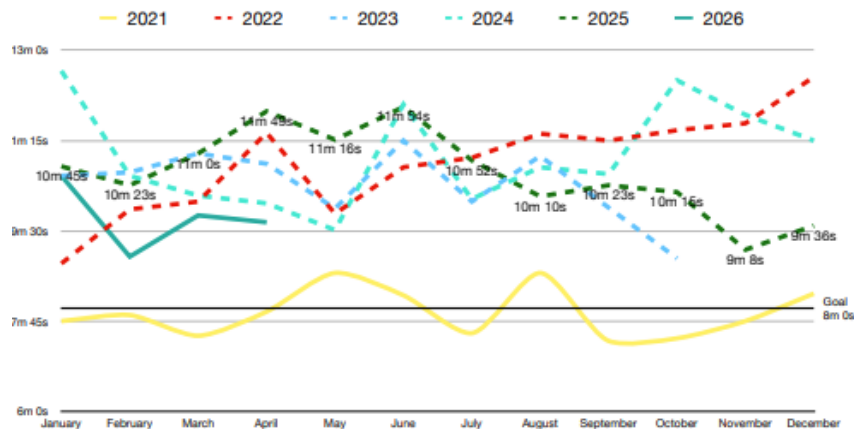

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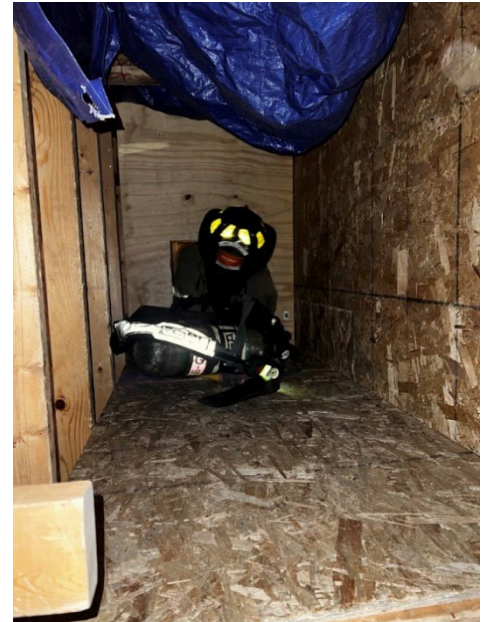
TRAINING REPORT

The joint academy with Western Lakes and Hartland was a high priority for the Training Division during the month of March. LCFR had four new members attend the academy, strengthening our intern and part-time staffing. The academy provides new members with the opportunity to become proficient in handling the emergencies they will face once assigned to shift operations.

Despite the academy taking place, our crews continued to prioritize ongoing training. Personnel took advantage of a unique donated structure, which provided valuable hands-on training opportunities. Crews conducted evolutions focused on large area search, hose movement, ground ladder operations, and aerial deployment with water supply at the structure.

EMS training for the month consisted of a pharmacology review, along with a refresher on EMS PPE and its proper use.

INTERN REPORT

LCFR currently has 5 Interns that are working shifts: Anton Temple, Jackson Pouchert, Tyler Gress, Max Stephens and Ricardo Jaramillo Plata. All 4 are enrolled in the Fire Protection Technician program through WCTC. Intern Plata is currently enrolled in Paramedic class while the remaining Interns will be attending Paramedic in March/April.

In addition to these 5 Interns, LCFR will also be adding an additional Intern 2 position and two Intern 1 positions. Ridley Newman is a FF/EMT and will be assigned to Station #37 Green shift working the 48/96 shift beginning April 15th. Mathieu Pelchat is one of our Intern 1 hires and will be assigned to Station #42 Green shift also starting April 15th. Mathieu has his Firefighter 1 and will be obtaining his EMT in the summer. Until he obtains his EMT, he will work 12 hour shifts with Green shift. Jordan Fager is our second Intern 1 hire and will be assigned to Station #31 Red shift. Jordan currently has his EMT certification while he works toward obtaining his Firefighter 1 certification. Jordan will complete his EMS academy while on shift and will complete the LCFR new hire fire academy in June.

We are looking forward to bringing these new members on board and to them launching their Fire/EMS careers!
