Notwithstanding the provisions of Town Law Section 23 (1) and Public Officers Law Section 3 (1) and (8), the person holding the office of Codes Enforcement Officer of the Town of Santa Clara need not be a resident or elector of the Town of Santa Clara, provided that he or she is a resident and elector of Franklin County and of a town adjoining the Town of Santa Clara.
2. This local law is enacted pursuant to the powers granted to the Town of Santa Clara by Municipal Home Rule Law Section 10.
3. This local law shall take effect upon its being filed with the New York State Secretary of State.
