From the Village Hall

Sump Pumps: No discharge or overflow of storm water shall be permitted upon any street or public way from **October 1 to April 1** of each year.

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **A late fee of \$20.00 shall be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1st.**

April Election: There will be a spring election on **Tuesday, April 2nd** for Justice of the Supreme Court, Court of Appeals Judge, Circuit Court Judge - Branch 1, Village President, Village Trustees, and School Board. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm. You must show an acceptable form of photo identification to receive a ballot.

Phone Numbers: If you change your phone number and/or contact information, please remember to contact the Village-Clerk's office at 754-4371 with this updated information. It helps us in case of an emergency.

Chipping will done the 1st & 3rd Tuesday in the months of April thru October. Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches (6") in diameter, and not less than four feet (4') in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in the wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area. **Chipping for April will be April 2nd and 16th.**

Compost: Yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, and sod. A sign will be erected by the compost that is ready to be used by the public.

Vehicle Nuisance: It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.

Without our faithful volunteers, Sunrise Horse Farm would not be here. Angie has been volunteering since 2009. Her kind and caring ways towards the children and teens are awesome. In 2010 because she was an extra helping hand we experienced over 500 visits by children and teens! In 2009 Josh came as a student in the high school transition program and Samantha started coming in 2010. Now both of them come together at least once a week to do chores. They have learned the whole routine here and do a great job! Pam usually comes twice a week to assist two students after school. She is the mother of 8 children and has years of experience with horses, also. Laura is a volunteer since November and comes twice a month. She served for a year at Silver Birch Ranch where she gained experience with students and horses. She is now teaching Mandy who is a new volunteer and comes here through The Production Farm with participants in their program. We are in need of more volunteers as our program continues to expand. We average 300 visits per year by children and teens and often for lack of help have a waiting list.


